EFFECTIVE AS FROM 10TH JULY, 1922.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 16th July, 1922.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

A.—MALE WORKERS and Certain Special Classes of **FEMALE WORKERS**, of 24 years of age and over, 1s. 1d. per hour.

B.—FEMALE WORKERS (other than the Special Classes) of 18 years of age and over, 7d. per hour.

C.—ALL OTHER WORKERS, see Sections I and II of Part I below.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

A.—ALL MALE WORKERS and Certain Special Classes of FEMALE WORKERS, 1s. 3d. per hour.

Workers of 22 and under 23 years of age, 11d. per hour, *i.e.*, 44s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 23 and under 24 years of age, 1s. per hour, *i.e.*, 48s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 24 years of age and over, 1s. 1d. per hour, *i.e.*, 52s. per week of 48 hours.

The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Section are payable in the case of a worker under 24 years of age (other than a worker employed for seasonal work), subject to the proviso that such a worker is employed under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 52s. per week of 48 hours. Otherwise

the General Minimum Time-Rate payable shall be 52s. per week of 48 hours, irrespective of age.

In the case of a worker employed for seasonal work, the General Minimum Time-Rate payable shall be that applicable according to the worker's age.

SECTION II.—FEMALE WORKERS, other than Female Workers as specified in Section I (b) of this Part of this Schedule:—

Workers under 15 years of age, 2½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 3½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 14s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 4½d. per hour, *i.e.*, 19s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour, *i.e.*, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years of age and upwards, 7d. per hour, *i.e.*, 28s. per week of 48 hours.

(1) The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in this Section are payable in the case of a worker under 18 years of age (other than a worker employed for seasonal work), subject to the proviso that such a worker is employed under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 28s. per week of 48 hours. Otherwise the General Minimum Time-Rate payable shall be 28s. per week of 48 hours, irrespective of age.

In the case of a worker employed for seasonal work, the General Minimum Time-Rate payable shall be that applicable according to the worker's age.

(2) In the case of a worker (other than a worker employed for seasonal work) who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 15 years or over and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, the General Minimum Time-Rate payable during her first three months of employment in the trade shall be 3s. per week of 48 hours less than the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable, and during her second three months of employment in the trade shall be 1s. 6d. per week less than the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable, in accordance with the provisions of this Section.

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and the holidays specified above the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and the holidays specified above, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and the days allowed as holidays under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-Section (A) of this Section.

Provided that—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

(B) For Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work:—

I. (1) Male Workers of 24 years of age and over;

(2) Female Workers of 24 years of age and over of the classes specified in Section

I (b) of Part I of the Schedule to this Notice; and

(3) All other Female Workers of 18 years of age and over:

Who are employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

II. (1) Male Workers under 24 years of age;

(2) Female Workers under 24 years of age of the classes specified in Section I (b) of Part I of the Schedule to this Notice; and

(3) All other Female Workers under 18 years of age:

Who are employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

Note.—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and to the proviso to Section II of this Part of this Notice, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913, as varied by the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order, 1920, excluding the covering and filling of biscuits, wafers and cakes with chocolate or sugar confectionery.

SECTION II.—The Trade referred to in Section I above to which the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply is as follows:—

The making of Sugar Confectionery, Cocoa, Chocolate, Jam, Marmalade, Preserved Fruits, Fruit and Table Jellies, Meat

PROVIDED THAT, notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule the above Minimum Rates shall *not* apply to Clerks, Salesmen, Saleswomen, Travellers, Engineers, Carpenters, Vanmen, Watchmen, Outside Messengers, Cleaners of Premises, Time-keepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

ductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-Section (A) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwith-

standing that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(B) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double Time, respectively.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

For the purpose of the application of the minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule:—

A LEARNER IS A WORKER WHO:—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning one of the following processes:—

- (a) Machining,
- (b) Cutting,
- (c) Awl and Needle Stitching,
- (d) Operations performed by Palm and Needle Hands (including the Roping of Tents and Coal Sacks),
- (e) Flag-Making (that is to say, ALL the branches of Flag-Making included within the scope of the Trade Board, as specified in Part V, carried on in the establishment in which the Learner is employed, provided that these branches include the making of Heraldic and Lettered Flags and the Union Jack), and is provided by the employer with every facility for such learning.

AND

(b) Has received a certificate or has made an application for such certificate in accordance with the rules laid down by the Trade Board. Provided that in granting or withholding such certificate the Trade Board may take into consideration whether in view of the ratio of learners to journey workers employed in any establishment on the processes in which the Learner proposed to be certificated is to be employed, such Learner has a reasonable prospect of receiving due instruction. Provided also that any certificate may be withdrawn if the Trade Board consider that the conditions of employment are not being complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment on one of the processes specified above without a certi-

ficate for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment, the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Learnership.

PART V.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II below.

SECTION II.—The Made-Up Textiles Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, is as follows:—

(1) The making from woven fabrics of any of the following articles, or the repairing thereof:—tarpaulins; tents; marquees; rick, cart or wagon covers; nose-bags; oil-skin clothing or headgear or linings therefor; flags made of more than one piece; baths, basins, buckets, beds, cots, hammocks, ground sheets or similar articles; girths and articles known in the trade as horse-clothing.

(2) The making of any of the following articles from fabrics of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above, or the repairing thereof, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of any of the articles mentioned in the said paragraph:—rope-bound coal and coke sacks; haversacks or knapsacks; outside and inside blinds or awnings; flags made of one piece; bunting decorations;

including:—

(A) The following operations when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, viz., operations known in the trade as—

(i) the dyeing, oiling, tarring, chemically treating, or otherwise proofing of the fabrics mentioned in paragraph 1 and the preparation of dressings therefor;

(ii) cutting, sewing, finishing, stencilling or branding by hand or machine;

(B) The following or similar operations performed by hand or machine when incidental to and carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in paragraphs 1 and 2 above:—

(i) the splicing or braiding of rope, cord or twine;

(ii) the making of fittings of leather or webbing, including the assembling of metal or other parts;

(iii) the sewing or attaching to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 or 2 above of:—

(a) rope, cord or twine;

(b) leather, webbing or metal or fittings made thereof;

(C) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the operations specified in the said paragraphs;

(D) the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly

engaged in any of the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above;

but excluding:—

(i) the making of haversacks and knapsacks when made in association with or in conjunction with the making of and as part of military web equipment;

(ii) the making of folding or deck chairs;

(iii) the making or repairing of horse-clothing, girths and nose-bags when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing of leather saddlery or harness;

(iv) the making or repairing of rubberised articles;

(v) the making or repairing of tarpaulins or of rope-bound coal and coke sacks in an establishment, business, branch or department in which the making of sails is the main or principal business of the establishment, business, branch or department;

(vi) the printing by hand or machine of flags or parts thereof;

(vii) the operations mentioned in sub-paragraph (C) above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags and similar sacks or bags;

(viii) operations performed by workers directly employed by railway companies;

(ix) operations included in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919;

(x) operations included in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920;

(xi) operations included in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, but not specifically mentioned in this Order.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District.
