The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give

 Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury they
 have made the following regulation for inclu-
 sion in all regulations for competitions for
 situations in the Civil Service among male
 candidates of appropriate age:—

No person will be eligible who obtained
 from any tribunal established under the
 Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemp-
 tion from service in H.M. Forces under those
 Acts on the ground of a conscientious objec-
 tion to the undertaking of military service,
 or, although not so exempted, declined to
 comply with obligations imposed upon him
 by those Acts.
