WHEREAS it is provided by the Petroleum Act, 1871, that His Majesty may, from time to time, make, revoke, and vary Orders in Council directing that the said Act or any part thereof shall apply to any substance, and that the said Act or the part thereof specified in any such Order shall, during the continuance of the Order, apply to such substance, and shall be construed and have

effect as if such substance had been included in the definition of Petroleum to which that Act applies, subject to the following qualifications:—

1. The quantity of any substance to which this Act is directed by Order in Council to apply which may be kept without a licence, shall be such quantity only as is specified in that behalf in such Order, or if no such quantity is specified no quantity may be kept without a licence.

2. The label on the vessel containing such substance shall be such as may be specified in that behalf in the Order:

And whereas the Petroleum Act, 1879, and the Petroleum (Hawkers) Act, 1881, are to be construed as one with the Petroleum Act of 1871, and may, together with such Act, be cited as the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881:

And whereas Carbide of Calcium presents dangers similar to those presented by Petroleum:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the above-mentioned provisions of the Petroleum Act, 1871, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and prescribe that the under-mentioned parts of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, shall apply to the said substance, Carbide of Calcium, in the same manner as if the said substance were Petroleum to which the Acts apply, viz.:—

The whole of the Petroleum Acts, 1871 to 1881, except:—

(a) So much of Section 6 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as specifies the nature of the label to be on the vessel, in lieu of which the label shall be as hereinafter provided.

(b) So much of Section 7 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as relates to the exemptions from such Section of small quantities under certain specified conditions, and the quantity of Carbide of Calcium that may be kept without a licence shall be as hereinafter provided.

(c) So much of Section 11 of the Petroleum Act, 1871, as relates to the testing of samples taken by an officer of the Local Authority under the powers conferred by such section.

(d) So much of the Petroleum Act, 1879, as relates to the testing of Petroleum.

(e) So much of the Petroleum Act, 1881, as relates to the hawking of Petroleum.

The label on the vessel containing the said Carbide of Calcium shall bear in conspicuous characters the words "Carbide of Calcium," "Dangerous if not kept dry," and with the following caution: "The contents of this package are liable if brought into contact with moisture to give off a highly inflammable gas," and with the addition:—

(a) In the case of a vessel kept, of the name and address of the consignee or owner.

(b) In the case of a vessel sent or conveyed, of the name and address of the sender.

(c) In the case of a vessel sold or exposed for sale, of the name and address of the vendor.

The quantity of Carbide of Calcium that may be kept without a licence shall be as follows:—

1. Where the Carbide is kept in separate hermetically-closed metal vessels containing not more than 1 lb. each 5 lbs.

2. Where the following conditions are observed 28 lbs.

(a) The Carbide shall be kept only in a metal vessel or vessels hermetically-closed at all times when the Carbide is not actually being placed in or withdrawn from such vessel or vessels.

(b) The vessels containing Carbide shall be kept in a dry and well-ventilated place.

(c) Due precautions shall be taken to prevent unauthorized persons from having access to the Carbide.

(d) Notice shall be given of such keeping to the Local Authority, and free access shall be afforded to their duly authorized Inspector to inspect the portion of the premises where the Carbide is kept and the generator is situated.

Where a fixed generator is used on the premises:—

(e) Full and detailed instructions to be supplied by the maker as to the care and use of the generator shall be kept constantly posted up in such place as to be conveniently referred to by the generator attendant.

3. Where the Carbide is kept by a General Lighthouse Authority, as defined by the Mer-

chant Shipping Act, 1894, such quantity as may be required for the purposes of such Authority, provided that:—

(a) The Carbide is kept only in a metal vessel or vessels hermetically-closed at all times when the Carbide is not actually being withdrawn from such vessel or vessels.

(b) The vessels containing Carbide are kept in a dry and well-ventilated building exclusively appropriated to the keeping of Carbide, and detached from a dwelling-house or separated therefrom by a substantial partition with no opening in it.

(c) Due precautions are taken to prevent unauthorized persons from having access to the Carbide.

(d) No artificial light capable of igniting inflammable vapour is allowed to be taken into the building in which the Carbide is kept.

All previous Orders in Council relating to the keeping of Carbide of Calcium, viz., Orders dated 26th February, 1897, 7th July, 1897, 24th October, 1904, and 8th August, 1911, are hereby repealed.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Edlington and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Wispington, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Edlington and Wispington duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Edlington and Wispington are now full, the Reverend John Francis Webb being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Edlington is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wispington is vested in Christopher Hatton Turnor, of The Hall, Stoke Rochford, Grantham, in the County of Lincoln, Esquire, a Justice of the Peace:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents

(testified by their signing this Scheme) of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, of the Right Honourable Frederick, Viscount Birkenhead, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and of the said Christopher Hatton Turnor, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Edlington and the said Benefice of Wispington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Edlington with Wispington' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wispington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect all the tithe rent-charges glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Baumber with Great Sturton in the said County of Lincoln and in the said Diocese of Lincoln with the annual sum or yearly rent charge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly rent charge of £50, the same annual sum or yearly rent charge of £50 to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Baumber with Great Sturton and the same annual sum or yearly rent charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Baumber with Great Sturton or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rent charge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Baumber with Great Sturton and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Section 44 of the Conveyancing and Law of Property Act, 1881, in respect of rent charges to which that section applies.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant convey and annex to the said Benefice of Baumber with Great Sturton any part or parts of the endow-

ments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £50 hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the said annual sum or yearly charge of £50 shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now or hereafter payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said United Benefice shall continue to be payable by the Incumbent of the said United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately the Patron of the said Benefice of Edlington having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Wispington having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme, or any part thereof, by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united

shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of University College, Oxford, on the 24th day of June, 1922, and sealed on the 3rd day of July, 1922, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Ex parte The Master & Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University commonly called University College in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend Statute III (The Fellows) of the College Statutes and Appendix II, being the Ordinance in relation to the Bye-Fellowship of the foundation of the Right Honourable Mary Anne Viscountess Sidmouth, called the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship, framed under the Universities of Oxford & Cambridge Act, 1877, and duly enacted at two Extraordinary General Meetings of the Master and Fellows of University College, being the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for the purpose and holden on Saturday, the 29th day of April, 1922, and on Saturday, the 24th day of June, 1922, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting, and now submitted with the consent of the University as signified in the Decree of Convocation of Tuesday, 20th day of June, 1922, for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas an increase of £100 per annum free of Income Tax in the fixed emolument of £200 per annum free of Income Tax attached to each Fellowship in the College has already been authorized under an Emergency Statute duly enacted on 23rd April, 1921, and approved by the Lord Chancellor as Visitor of the College on 9th June, 1921, and by the lapse of the Emergency Period as defined by the Universities and Colleges (Emergency Powers) Act, 1915, the legality of the payment of such increase will determine on 31st December, 1922:

And whereas in the Report of the Royal Commission on Oxford and Cambridge Universities recently presented to Parliament by Command of His Majesty large increases in the fixed stipends attached to College Fellowships are recommended, but such recommendations cannot be made operative in the immediate future or without the intervention of a Parliamentary Commission:

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of University College in the University of Oxford, do hereby, in virtue of the powers conferred upon us by section 54 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and by Statute XI of the College Statutes, alter and amend Statute III (The Fellows), clauses 11, 22, 23, and clause 3 of the Ordinance concerning the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship set forth in Appendix II to the College Statutes in the manner following and subject to a pro-

vision limiting the validity of this Amending Statute to a period of four years after the termination of the emergency period as defined by the Universities and Colleges (Emergency Powers) Act, 1915:—

1. In Statute III, clause 11, we delete the provision contained in the words "Provided always that" down to the words "£900 per annum" inclusive, and, further, we delete the word "also" in the subsequent provision.

2. In Statute III, clause 22, we delete the figures "200" wherever they occur, and substitute therefor the figures "300."

3. In Statute III, clause 23, after the words "the amount of £200 per annum" we add the words "or, in the case of a Fellow elected under clause 3 of the Ordinance next referred to, the amount of £300 per annum free of Income Tax."

4. In clause 3 of the Ordinance concerning the Stowell Civil Law Fellowship set forth in Appendix II to the Statutes of the College, in the phrase "a fixed emolument (including the income arising from Viscountess Sidmouth's endowment) of £200 per annum free of Income Tax," we delete the figures "200" and substitute therefor the figures "300."

5. Provided that this Amending Statute shall remain in force until 31st December, 1926, and no longer, or until such earlier date as may be determined by any Parliamentary Commission appointed to revise the Statutes of the College or other statutory authority, provided also that no vested interests shall be recognised as created by the enactment of the present Statute.

MERCHANT SHIPPING (SHIPS' NAMES) AMENDMENT REGULATION, 1922.

REGULATION DATED 23RD JUNE, 1922, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE COMMISSIONERS OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE, UNDER SECTION 50 OF THE MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1906 (6 EDW. 7, CH. 48).

Under the provisions of Section 50 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906 (6 Edw. 7, ch. 48), the Board of Trade, in conjunction with the Commissioners of Customs and Excise, hereby make the following Regulation:—

(1) There shall be substituted for paragraph (a) of Regulation 6 of the Board of Trade Regulations dated 28th August, 1907 (Statutory Rules and Orders, 1907, No. 740), the following paragraph:—

“(a) If they are satisfied that the ship is intended to replace another of the same name which within 10 years of the date of the application belonged to the same owner when her British registry was closed, or which, within 10 years of the date of the application, was sold by the same owner on condition that her name should be changed, and her name has been changed.”

(2) This Regulation shall come into force on the 1st day of July, 1922, and may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Ships' Names) Amendment Regulation, 1922, and shall be construed as one with those contained in Statutory Rules and Orders, 1907, No. 740, and those Regulations and this Regulation may be cited together as the Merchant Shipping (Ships' Names) Regulations, 1907 to 1922.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920 TO 1922.

DECISIONS OF THE HIGH COURT ON REFERENCES MADE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE 1920 ACT.

Contributions not Payable.

On the 7th July the Minister referred to the High Court for decision the question whether a person employed as—

Cleaner, mainly outside business hours, to sweep, dust and scrub departments, offices or workrooms, also to take turn in cleaning floors of the restaurant department forming part of the business premises of a West End store

was or was not an employed person within the meaning of the Act of 1920.

The Judge held that the employment of the person in question was employment in domestic service, and was not employment in a business carried on for the purposes of gain, and that the employment was accordingly excepted under paragraph (b) of Part II of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920. The person in question was therefore not required to be insured.

Contributions Payable.

On the same date the Minister also referred for decision the question whether persons employed as—

Cleaner, inside and outside business hours, to clean generally, and also to clean windows in departments, offices or workrooms forming part of the business premises of a West End store;

Cleaner, outside and during business hours, to dust, clean mirrors, remove waste paper, etc., in departments, offices or workrooms, forming part of the business premises of a West End store

were or were not employed persons within the meaning of the Act of 1920.

The Judge held that the employment of the persons in question was employment in domestic service, but being in a trade or business carried on for the purposes of gain was not excepted under paragraph (b) referred to above. Contributions were therefore payable in respect of them.

SECTION II.—In cases where a Female Weaver is employed on piece-work each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 7½d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF FEMALE WEAVERS SPECIFIED IN PART III. OF THIS SCHEDULE.

The Trade Board Propose to Vary the Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed on Piece-Work at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice J. (19) dated 8th March, 1922, in their

application to all Female Weavers of the classes specified in Part III of this Schedule so that such workers shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 7½d. per hour to an ordinary worker, an amount equal to one-half of or the full amount of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would have been applicable to the Worker if she had been employed on Time Work, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time Work were Time-and-a-half or Double Time.

PART III.

SECTION I.

The above Proposed Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Weavers in respect of all time during which they are employed on Piece Work in Great Britain OUTSIDE the areas of Aberdeen, Barrow-in-Furness, Carnoustie, Dundee and Tayport (as defined in Section II. of this Part) in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (18) dated 7th February, 1922.

(2) This Article shall come into operation on the tenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and shall cease to operate on the tenth day of September, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Application of Part II of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, subject to certain modifications.

2. Part II (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Principal Order is hereby applied, subject to the modification hereinafter appearing, to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, which shall comprise a Double Dipping Area for the purposes of that Order.

4.—(1) The provisions of Articles 2 and 3 of this Order shall apply also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which they may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice, and shall cease to apply to any such lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(2) A copy of every notice served under this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Ministry by the Inspector signing the same.
