WHEREAS it is enacted by proviso (d) of Section 1 of the Corn Production Acts (Repeal) Act, 1921, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to direct that the powers and duties hitherto exercised under the Agriculture Act, 1920, and under any other enactment by the body of persons constituted with respect to any area by the Board of Agriculture for Scotland under Sub-Section (2) of Section eleven of the Corn Production Act, 1917 (hereinafter called an Agricultural Committee), shall be exercised by the Board, and that before any Order in Council is made under the said Section 1 the draft thereof shall be laid before each House of Parliament for not less than thirty days on which such House is sitting and that unless both Houses by resolution approve of such draft no further proceedings shall be taken thereon without prejudice to the making of a new draft Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, that as from the date of this Order all the aforesaid powers and duties exercisable by any Agricultural Committee in Scotland shall be exercised by the Board of Agriculture for Scotland.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) and various Orders amending the said Order, and it is expedient that the said Order should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Paragraph (vi.) of Article one of the principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if at the end of the said paragraph there were inserted the words " unless a sealed copy of an award of the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal constituted under Section VI of Part IX of the Treaty to the effect that such claim, debt or compensation is due, has been lodged with the Administrator."

2. After sub-paragraph (ee) of paragraph (ii) of Article one of the principal Order as amended, there shall be inserted the following sub-paragraph:—

" (eee) Where the Administrator has seized any property, right or interest which

appeared to him to be subject to the charge, no proceedings for the recovery of such property, right or interest or the proceeds thereof or for any loss or damage arising from the seizure or disposal thereof commenced after the expiration of four months from the date of the seizure of the property, right or interest, shall be entertained by any Court other than proceedings against the Administrator for negligence in respect of such seizure or disposal.

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) (Amendment) Order, 1922, and the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1921 and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1922.

WHEREAS by Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907; (7 Edw. 7, c. 29), as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914, (4 and 5 Geo. 5, c. 18), and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, (9 and 10 Geo. 5, c. 80), it is enacted as follows:—

"91. (1) If His Majesty is pleased to make any arrangement with the Government of any Foreign State for mutual protection of inventions, or designs, or trade marks, then any person who has applied for protection for any invention, design or trade mark in that State, or his legal representative or assignee, shall be entitled to a patent for his invention or to registration of his design or trade mark under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905, in priority to other applicants; and the patent or registration shall have the same date as the date of the application in the Foreign State.

"Provided that—

"(a) The application is made in the case of a patent within 12 months and in the case of a design or trade mark within 4 months, from the application for protection in the Foreign State; and

"(b) Nothing in this Section shall entitle the patentee or proprietor of the design or trade mark to recover damages for infringements happening prior to the actual date on which his complete specification is accepted, or his design or trade mark is registered, in this country.

"(2) The patent granted for the invention or the registration of a design or trade mark shall not be invalidated:—

"(a) In the case of a patent, by reason only of the publication of a description of, or use of, the invention; or

"(b) In the case of a design, by reason only of the exhibition or use of, or the publication of a description or representation of, the design; or

"(c) In the case of a trade mark, by reason only of the use of the trade mark, in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man during the period specified in this Section as that within which the application may be made.

"(3) The application for the grant of a patent, or the registration of a design, or the registration of a trade mark under this Section, must be made in the same manner

as an ordinary application under this Act or the Trade Marks Act, 1905:—

"Provided that—

"(a) In the case of patents, the application shall be accompanied by a complete specification, which, if it is not accepted within the 12 months from the application for protection in the Foreign State, shall with the drawings (if any) be open to public inspection at the expiration of that period; and

"(b) In the case of trade marks, any trade mark the registration of which has been duly applied for in the country of origin may be registered under the Trade Marks Act, 1905.

"(4) The provisions of this Section shall apply only in the case of those Foreign States with respect to which His Majesty by Order in Council declares them to be applicable, and so long only in the case of each State as the Order in Council continues in force with respect to that State.

"(5) Where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the Legislature of any British Possession has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of this Section to that Possession, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order: "

And whereas by Section 103 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, as amended by Section 6 of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act (Amendment) Act, 1885, and by Section 1 of the Patents Act, 1901, and since repealed by Section 98 of the said Patents and Designs Act, 1907, provisions were made to the same or like effect as those above set forth as contained in Section 91 of the last-mentioned Act and by the said Section 98 it was provided that "this repeal shall not effect any Convention, Order in Council, Rule, or Table of Fees having effect under any enactment so repealed, but any such Convention, Order in Council, Rules, or Table of Fees in force at the commencement of this Act shall continue in force and may be repealed, altered or amended, as if it had been made under this Act":

And whereas it pleased Her Late Majesty Queen Victoria to make an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 103, and in virtue of a Declaration signed and sealed by Her Majesty's Ambassador at Paris, on the 17th March, 1884, duly conveying the accession of Great Britain and Ireland to the International Convention and Protocol for the protection of Industrial Property, signed by Representatives of certain Powers on the 20th March, 1883, and duly ratified on the 6th June, 1884, power being reserved to Her Majesty to accede thereafter to the provisions of the said Convention and Protocol on behalf of the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, and any of Her Majesty's Possessions, which Declaration of Accession was duly accepted by the French Government on behalf of the Signatory Powers by and in virtue of a Declaration dated the 2nd April, 1884:

And whereas on the 14th December, 1900, at Brussels, an Additional Act was agreed upon between Her Late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Heads of the Foreign Countries parties thereto for the purpose of modifying

certain of the provisions of the said International Convention and the Protocol annexed thereto, the ratification of which Additional Act was duly effected:

And whereas by a Convention signed at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, His Majesty and the Heads of the Foreign States named therein agreed to make certain modifications in and additions to the said Convention dated 20th March, 1883, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other States:

And whereas by various Orders in Council Her Late Majesty Queen Victoria and His Late Majesty King Edward VII and His Present Majesty have been pleased to declare that the hereinbefore mentioned provisions of the said Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883, (as amended), should apply to the several Foreign Countries named in the said Orders parties to the said Convention and Protocols:

And whereas the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg has acceded to the said International Convention, Protocol and Additional Act as revised at Washington on 2nd June, 1911:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers in Him vested by the above-recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, as amended by the Patents and Designs Act, 1914, and the Patents and Designs Act, 1919, shall apply to the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg.

2. This Order shall take effect from the 30th June, 1922.

3. This Order may be cited as the Industrial Property Convention (Accession of Luxembourg) Order, 1922.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of February, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stoke by Clare and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wixoe, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Henry Bernard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Stoke by Clare and Wixoe duly made their Report to the said Henry Bernard Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said

two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the Right Reverend Albert, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Stoke by Clare and Wixoe is now full, the Reverend Frederick Barnes being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke by Clare, and the Reverend John Hooley Ella Bailey being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wixoe:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Stoke by Clare and the said Benefice of Wixoe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stoke by Clare with Wixoe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stoke by Clare shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately and that if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron of the

said Benefice of Stoke by Clare but otherwise the first turn of presentation or nomination shall belong to the Patron of that one of the said two Benefices, the Incumbent of which does not become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice under any of the provisions of Clause 2 of this Scheme.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 31st day of March, 1855, in so far as it affects burials in the Church and Churchyard of Saint Paul's, Bedford, in the County of Bedford, should be varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:—

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Order in Council of the 31st day of March, 1855, the burial of the body of the Reverend Canon Jocelyn Henry Speck may, at his decease, be allowed in the Churchyard of Saint Paul's, Bedford, subject to the conditions that the coffin shall be separately enclosed by stone work or brick work properly cemented, and that the grave shall be bricked to the surface of the ground.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in that portion of the coast and islands in the Persian Gulf and Gulf of Oman which is within the dominions of His Majesty the Shah of Persia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted for Articles 43 to 47 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of every Consulate within the limits of this Order.

(2) Every British subject resident within the said limits shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the consular district within which he resides, provided that if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the Consular Officer, be registered there. A British subject arriving within the said limits must apply for registration within one month after his arrival provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consular Officer.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Consular Officer shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder on the first registration of any such person endorse on the passport a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-Article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consular Officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consular Officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order, may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consular Officer is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of one rupee, or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time

to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed three rupees.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee to the assistance of the Consular Officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Consular Officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject within the limits of this Order, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of the Court.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order Articles 43 to 47 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Consul-General, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2) For that purpose the Consul-General shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Bahrein (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Bahrein Order in Council, 1913, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted

for Articles 51 to 59 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of the Political Agency.

(2) Every British subject resident within the limits of this Order shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Political Agency. A British subject arriving within the limits of this Order must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Political Agent.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Political Agent shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder on the passport a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall, without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Political Agent, attend personally for that purpose at the Political Agency, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Political Agent so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order unless the Political Agent is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration pay a fee of one rupee or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed three rupees.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled without a fee, to the assistance of the Political Agent in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Political Agent may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject within the limits of this Order, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 25 rupees for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts established by the Principal Order.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order, Articles 51 to 59 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby repealed but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the office of the Political Agent, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

WHEREAS by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the territories of His Highness the Sultan of Maskat and Oman:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Maskat (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Maskat Order in Council, 1915, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted for Articles 51 to 59 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the Political Agency.

(2) Every British subject resident within the limits of this Order shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Political Agency. A British subject arriving within the limits of this Order must apply for registration within one month after his arrival provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Political Agent.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Political Agent

shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder on the passport a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall, without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder, be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Political Agent, attend personally for that purpose at the Political Agency, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Political Agent so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have been repealed shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Political Agent is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of one rupee or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed 3 rupees.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled, without a fee, to the assistance of the Political Agent in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Political Agent may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject within the limits of this Order, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 25 rupees for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts established by the Principal Order.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order, Articles 61 to 59 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the office of the Political Agent, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

COTTON WASTE RECLAMATION TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 10th July, 1922, together with the Minimum Rates (as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice C.W. (8), dated 31st March, 1922) which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

(2) All the other Minimum Rates as from 17th July, 1922.*

(b) For overtime after the first two hours of overtime in any week (excluding all hours worked on Sundays), the Overtime Rate shall be ONE-AND-A-HALF times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all hours worked on Sundays the Overtime Rate shall be TWICE the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

Note.—The hours which females, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male and female workers in Great Britain, as specified above, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any section of the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, that is to say:—

1. The collecting, sorting or grading of cotton waste when carried on in an establishment in which such operations are the main or principal business.

2. The following operations when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any establishment of the kind specified in paragraph 1 above:—

(a) The willowing, machining, breaking-up, scouring or putting down mixings of cotton waste;

(b) The collecting, sorting or grading of any of the materials or articles, other than cotton waste, specified in paragraph 1 or paragraph 2 of the Appendix to the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920;*

(c) The operations specified in paragraph 3 of the Appendix to the above-mentioned Order, other than those specified in sub-paragraph (a) above.†

3. The operations of receiving, packing, compressing, teagling, craning, despatching or warehousing when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any of the operations included in paragraphs 1 and 2 above.

But excluding—

(i) Any of the operations mentioned in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above when carried on in the establishment in which the waste materials are produced or in which they are used as raw materials for further manufacture;

(ii) The making or repairing of sacks or bags when carried on in a factory or workshop engaged solely or mainly in the making or repairing of sacks or bags.

**List of Materials and Articles:—*

Rags, waste paper, paper stock; woollen, worsted, jute, flax, hemp or other textile waste; textile clippings or cuttings; used bags, sacks or sacking; scrap rubber; scrap iron or other scrap metal; fur cuttings; rabbit skins; bones or fat; used tins; broken glass or earthenware; discarded clothing (including head-gear or foot-gear); discarded textile articles; old ropes; used bottles or used jars.

†List of Operations:—

The ripping of worn clothes for rags; the picking of old ropes; the trimming of paper salvage; the washing of used bottles or used jars; the washing of used tins; the breaking of scrap metal; the drying of rabbit skins;

the making or repairing of sacks or bags; the willowing, pulling, scouring, carbonising or putting down mixings of textile waste (other than cotton waste).

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. Swine so moved shall also be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.
