The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 12th day of July, 1922 (N.P. (4) 807/22), in the words following,

viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that a special allowance should be payable to Royal Marines employed as clerks at the Royal Marine Office, in recognition of their greater responsibilities as compared with their colleagues at the Royal Marine Divisions:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment, as from the 1st April, 1922, of a Staff Allowance of 1s. a day (in addition to London Allowance) to Warrant Officers, Class II, and Non-Commissioned Officers, Royal Marines, employed as Clerks at the Royal Marine Office.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

W HEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council, amongst other things, to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the discontinuance of the holding of any Court and the consolidation of any two or more Districts and the division of any District and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—
1. The District of the County Court of-Yorkshire (West Riding) held at Saddleworth shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Lancashire held at Oldham, and from the 31st day of July, 1922, the holding of the said Court at Saddleworth shall be discontinued and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Oldham, and the said Court held at Oldham shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

- 2. The District of the County Court of Surrey held at Chertsey except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 3 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Surrey held at Kingston, and from the 31st day of July, 1922, the holding of the said Court at Chertsey shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Kingston and the said Court held at Kingston shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.
- 3. The Parishes set out in the first column of the Schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 31st day of July, 1922, be detached from and cease to form part of the District of the said Court held at Chertsey, and shall be transferred to, and form part of the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column thereof.
- 4. In this Order "Parish" shall have the same meaning as in the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, (S.R. & O. 1899, No. 178), provided that the boundaries of every Parish mentioned in this Order shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.
- 5. This Order may be cited as The County Court Districts (Chertsey and Saddleworth) Order in Council, 1922, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of August, 1922, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. HEREAS by Section 670 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that when any Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon has either before or after passing of that Act been erected or placed on or near the coast of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislature of that Possession, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, fix such Dues (in that Act referred to as Colonial Light Dues) to be paid in respect of that Lighthouse, Buoy, or Beacon by the Owner or Master of every Ship which passes the same and derives benefit therefrom as His Majesty may deem reasonable, and may by like Order increase, diminish or repeal such Dues, and those Dues shall from the time mentioned in the Order be leviable throughout His Majesty's Dominions, and further that Colonial Light Dues shall not bo levied in any British Possession unless the Legislature of that Possession has, by address to the Crown or by Act or Ordinance duly

And whereas the Great Basses Lighthouse, the Little Basses Lighthouse, and the Minicoy Lighthouse are Lighthouses which have been duly erected under and pursuant to the said Section:

And whereas by Orders in Council, dated respectively the 22nd day of May, 1883, the 9th day of May, 1892, the 29th day of June, 1896, the 10th day of August, 1903, and the 21st day of October, 1912, the Dues leviable in respect of the said Lighthouses for the Classes of Ships therein respectively mentioned were duly fixed:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 6th day of February, 1917, His Majesty directed that, as from the 1st day of April, 1917, or from the time of the receipt of notice of that Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied should be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-eighth of one penny per ton, of the burden of every ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Dues should be altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers so vested in Him by the above recited provisions, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth by this Order in Council order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the 1st day of October, 1922, or from the time of the receipt of this Order, if that be later, by the Officers authorized to collect Light Dues, the Dues thenceforth to be levied shall be as follows, that is to say, in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, three-eighths of one penny per ton, and in respect of the Minicoy Lighthouse one-eighth of one penny per ton of the burden of every Ship on every voyage in which she passes or derives benefit from the said Lights respectively, subject in each case to a reduction of 25 per cent.

Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the territories under His Majesty's protection hereunder mentioned:—

W HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical pur-

poses; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modifica-

tion thereof, as the case may be, into effect."
And whereas the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Lord Bishop of London, hath made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"We, Arthur Foley, Lord Bishop of London, in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Middlesex and Diocese of London the Perpetual Curacy or Benefice of Christ Church Trent Park the Parish whereof contains a population of two thousand or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred and fifty persons.

fifty persons.

'The net annual value of the said Benefice of Christ Church Trent Park is Two hundred and twenty-four pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Monken Hadley the Parish whereof contains a population of one thousand four hundred or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for three hundred persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of Monken Hadley is Two hundred and eighty-

five pounds or thereabouts.

"Two certain detached portions of the said Parish of Christ Church Trent Park known together as Hadley Highstone with a total population of two hundred and seventy-five or thereabouts are distant about three and a half miles from the Parish Church of Christ Church Trent Park and about four hundred yards from the Parish Church of Monken Hadley.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said two detached portions of the said Parish of Christ Church Trent Park which portions are both more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to the Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon verged pink may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Monken Hadley to which they are both contiguous.

to which they are both contiguous.

"The Right Honoursble FitzGerald Lord Kinnaird and Reginald Charles Hart Dyke are the Patrons of the said Benefice of Christ Church Trent Park and the Reverend Bertram

Cecil Hopson is the present Incumbent thereot.

"The Reverend Frederick Charles Guise
Cass-Tewart is the Patron of the said Benefice
of Monken Hadley and the Reverend Edward
Herbert North is the present Incumbent

nereon.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithe Rent charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of both of the said Benefices of Christ Church, Trent Park and Monken Hadley and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the Ecclesiastical Parish of Christ Church Trent Park the two detached portions of the said Parish known together as Hadley Highstone which lie to the West of the said Parish of Christ Church Trent Park the boundaries of which portions are delineated on the plan annexed hereto and thereon verged pink.

"That the Incumbent of Monken Hadley

"That the Incumbent of Monken Hadley shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portions so to be separated from Christ Church Trent Park and annexed to

Monken Hadley.

"That the inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Monken Hadley but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Christ Church Trent Park except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Christ Church Trent Park and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portions shall have such and the same right to have Marriages Baptisms Churchings and Burials solemnized and performed in the said Parish Church of Monken Hadley as they might have had in the Parish Church of Christ Church

Trent Park.

"That all fees Ecclesiastical Offerings and emoluments arising from the said portions so to be separated from the Parish of Christ Church Trent Park shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Monken Hadley.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowments of the said Benefices or either of

them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said benefices or either of them.

"We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend Arthur Foley Lord Bishop of London has represented unto

us amongst other things:—
"That there is in the County of Middlesex and his Diocese of London the Perpetual Curacy or Benefice of Christ Church Trent Park containing a population of Two thousand

or thereabouts.
"That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Rectory or Benefice of Monken Hadley containing a population of one thousand four hundred or thereabouts.

"Two certain detached portions of the said Parish of Christ Church Trent Park known together as Hadley Highstone with a total population of two hundred and seventy-five or thereabouts are distant about three and a half miles from the Parish Church of Christ Church Trent Park and about four hundred yards

from the Parish Church of Monken Hadley. "That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said two portions of the Parish of Christ Church Trent Park the boundaries of which are both more particularly described in the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and delineated on the plan annexed to such Scheme and thereon verged pink may under the provisions of the Act 1 and 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, be advantageously separated from the said Parish of Christ Church Trent Park and annexed to the Parish of Monken Hadley to which they are both contiguous.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe lands Tithe Rent charges

and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme together with the Consents in writing of The Right Honourable Fitzgerald Lord Kinnaird, and Reginald Charles Hart Dyke, the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of Christ Church Trent Park (in case the same were now vacant) the Reverend Bertram Cecil Hopson, Incumbent of the same Benefice, The Reverend Frederick Charles Guise Cass-Tewart the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Monken Hadley (in case the same were now vacant) and the Reverend Edward Herbert North the Incumbent of the same Benefice has been transmitted to us for our consideration.

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the Consents above re-

ferred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 13th day of September, 1854, directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, the burial ground of the Cathe-

dral of Winchester:

And whereas Orders in Council were made on the 13th May, 1887, the 30th April, 1894, the 14th July, 1899, the 16th May, 1904, the 10th May, 1905, and the 8th May, 1919, varying the said Order in Council of the 13th September, 1854:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 13th day of September, 1854, as varied by the above-mentioned Orders, in so far as it affects burials in the burial ground of the Cathedral of Win-

chester should be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:-

That, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 13th day of September, 1854, the 13th day of May, 1887, the 30th day of April, 1894, the 14th day of July, 1899, the 16th day of May, 1904, the 10th day of May, 1905, and the 8th day of May, 1919, in a new earthen grave in the part of the said burial ground called the "Great Water Close" situated on the South side of the Lady Chapel, the burial may be allowed, at or below the depth of five feet from the surface of the ground, of the body of the late Reverend John Vaughan, Canon of the said Cathedral.

Indian Civil Service Examinations.

In conformity with the provisions of the Statute 56 & 57 Victoria, chapter 66, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiration of 40 days from the date of this Gazette, to make, under S. 97 (1) and (2) of the Government of India Act, changes as indicated below in the Regulations for the examination in London of candidates for admission to the Indian Civil Service.

It is proposed, (1) to alter the arrangement of Clauses 10-14 of the Regulations; (2) to add. "Ancient Greek" to the "extra numerum" subjects that may be taken under Clause 12; and (3) to amend Clause 11 so that it shall be no longer necessary for candidates offering "Statistics" as a subject of examination to produce evidence of training in that subject.

It is intended that the amended Regulations shall apply to candidates at the Open Competitive Examination to be held in London in the year 1923.

If the Minister considers that the exemption is for any reason undesirable, and directs the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate, but not so as to affect the previous operation of the exemption."

or other power enabling them, the said Charles Lister James and the Patron or either of them in this behalf, he the said Charles Lister James for himself and his successors Vicars as aforesaid, and
