The KING has been pleased to award the
Albert Medal to Squadron Leader Charles

Curtis Darley, of the Royal Air Force, in recognition of his gallantry in endeavouring to save life.

On the night of the 27th September, 1919, a Vickers-Vimy Aeroplane, piloted by Captain Cecil Hill Darley, brother of Squadron Leader (then Flight Lieutenant) Darley, who was acting as Navigation Officer, made a forced landing by Lake Bracciano, some twenty miles north of Rome, when on a flight from England to Egypt.

On the following morning, in taking off, the aeroplane failed to clear a telegraph pole, and crashed, immediately bursting into flames. Squadron Leader Darley was thrown clear, but at once rushed to the blazing wreckage and displayed very conspicuous bravery and devotion in persistent, but unavailing, attempts to rescue his brother, who was pinned in the pilot's seat. His efforts to release his brother were only brought to an end by his collapse. He sustained such severe burns that he was a patient in hospital for over eighteen months.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

BUTTON-MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers, other than Home-workers, as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 13th July, 1922, together with the Minimum Rates (as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice V (6), dated 13th October, 1921), which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

(1) The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate marked † and the Overtime Rates based thereon, as from 17th October, 1921;

(2) All the other Minimum Rates (and the provision set out in Section III of Part III of the Schedule) as from 1st August, 1922.*

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 7th August, 1922.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

MALE WORKERS.

I. WORKERS of 21 years of age and over employed in Stampin^g. Burnishing, Spin-

ning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), †1s. 2d., †1s. 3d. or †1s. 3½d. per hour (according to length of experience).

II. ALL OTHER MALE WORKERS of 21 years of age and over, †1s. 1½d. per hour.

III. WORKERS under 21 years of age (according to occupation and ages). See Part I (A) of the Schedule below.

FEMALE WORKERS.

I. WORKERS of 18 years of age and over, 7d. per hour.

II. WORKERS under 18 years of age (according to age). See Part I (B) of the Schedule below.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

I. MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), †1s. 7½d. per hour.

II. FEMALE WORKERS other than Home-workers, 8d. per hour.

OVERTIME RATES. See Part III of the Schedule below.

THE RATES IN FULL AS LEGALLY ENFORCEABLE ARE SET OUT IN DETAIL in the Schedule BELOW.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

A.—Male Workers.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes):—

1. Workers of 21 years of age and over:—

(a) Who have had not less than two years' experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, †1s. 3½d. per hour.

(b) Who have had not less than one but less than two years' experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, †1s. 3d. per hour.

(c) Who have had less than one year's experience in one or more of the aforesaid operations, †1s. 2d. per hour.

2. Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

3. Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 9d. per hour.

4. Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 8d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For all Male Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

1. Workers of 21 years of age and over, †1s. 1½d. per hour.

2. Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 11d. per hour.

3. Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 10d. per hour.

4. Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—For all Male Workers under 18 years of age:—

1. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7d. per hour.

2. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

3. Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

4. Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

B.—Female Workers.

1. Workers of 18 years of age and over, 7d. per hour.

2. Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 6d. per hour.

3. Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5d. per hour.

4. Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4d. per hour.

5. Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

SECTION I.—For MALE WORKERS employed in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), †1s. 7½d. per hour.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-Work in Stamping, Burnishing, Spinning (including Setting), Dipping, Staining, Sawing, Turning or Cutting (other than Cutting on Wet Lathes), each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 7½d. per hour to an ORDINARY MALE WORKER (i.e., a male worker of ordinary skill and experience in these processes).

SECTION II.—FEMALE WORKERS (other than Home Workers), 8d. per hour.

In the case of all Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) employed in Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 8d. per hour to an ORDINARY FEMALE WORKER (i.e., a female worker of ordinary skill and experience in the circumstances in question).

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED for the purpose of the application of the Overtime Rates set out in Section II of this Part of this Schedule THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON SATURDAY	5

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—OVERTIME RATES, calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner specified below, shall apply in substitution for the minimum rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade declared by the Trade Board as set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, that is to say:—

(a) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:—

(1) For all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

Provided that the said Overtime Rate shall not apply—

(i) In respect of time worked on Good Friday in the case of workers who are given Easter Tuesday as a holiday in lieu of Good Friday; OR

(ii) In respect of time worked on Easter Tuesday in the case of workers who are given Good Friday as a holiday in lieu of Easter Tuesday.

(2) For all hours worked in excess of five on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.

(3) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-quarter times the general minimum time-rate applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraph (1) of sub-section (a) of this section.

(b) FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

Female Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive, in respect of each hour worked in excess of 48 hours in any week, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, at least 8d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker, THE SUM OF 1d. PER HOUR.

SECTION III.—Where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday the minimum rates for Overtime shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of the Trade Board relating to "Overtime" the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

Note.—The hours which Women, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (other than Home-Workers) in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade

Boards (Button-Making) Order, 1919, and as set out below.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

SECTION II.—The manufacture of buttons, button-moulds, upholsterers' buttons or upholsterers' button-headed nails (excluding the shanks), from any material by the process of cutting, sawing, stamping, pressing, turning, drilling, fancying, grinding, barrelling, polishing, japanning, lacquering, dyeing, colouring, painting, varnishing, sewing, crocheting or the covering of button moulds;

Including—

(a) The manufacture of studs, links or parts thereof, from any material other than metal, where such manufacture is carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers;

(b) The manufacture of shanks for buttons where carried on in association with or in conjunction with button-making;

(c) The carding of any of the above articles, wherever carried on;

(d) All despatching, packing, warehousing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above articles;

But excluding—

(e) The manufacture of wooden button moulds;

(f) The covering of button moulds where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of wearing apparel.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour dated 10th October, 1921, and 13th July, 1922, confirming the variations of minimum rates of wages made by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the dates provided in this Notice as the dates from which the respective rates become effective.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.**RETAIL BESPOKE TAILORING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).****MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (OTHER THAN CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE APPRENTICES).**

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour and which are at present effective

under the Trade Boards Acts, and takes the place of all Notices fixing and varying minimum rates of wages previously issued by the Trade Board EXCEPT the Notice R.B. (19), dated 29th May, 1922, fixing and varying minimum rates of wages for certain classes of male and female Apprentices.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

1. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates specified in Sections I, II and III of Part II of this Schedule, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 24th July, 1922.*
2. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates specified in Sections I and II of Part I of this Schedule and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 22nd February, 1922.
3. In all other cases as from 29th May, 1922.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 30th July, 1922.

SECTION II—

For the purpose of Section I of this part of this Schedule, the following provisions apply:—

- (a) In determining the length of a worker's employment as an Apprentice and/or Learner and/or Improver:—
 - (i) Any previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any School or Institution where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Trade Board shall, in the case of a Male worker who has been registered as a *Learner* with the Trade Board, be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of Section III (c) of Part IV of this Schedule, and shall, in the case of a Male worker who has been registered as an *Apprentice* with the Trade Board, be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of the second proviso to Part I of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (19), dated 29th May, 1922, and
 - (ii) Any previous experience as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring shall be reckoned as equivalent to one-and-a-half times the period served under such scheme.

- (b) The expressions "Apprentice" and "Learner" shall include all persons who in fact have been employed as Apprentices and/or Learners in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, whether or not employed as Apprentices or Learners as defined by the Trade Board.
- (c) In the case of Apprentices, Learners or Improvers who have served under a contract in writing entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade for a period exceeding five years but not exceeding seven years, the period specified in the contract shall be substituted for the period of five years' employment referred to in such Section.

are set out in the Schedule to the said Notice R.B. (19) dated 29th May, 1922.

SECTION VI—

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers set out in the Schedule to this Notice do NOT APPLY to APPRENTICES who have entered the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade under 21 years of age, and who are employed under a contract in writing, entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction for a period of not less than three years by a fully qualified tailor or tailoress in making a bespoke garment throughout.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY WEEKDAY (other than Saturday)	9
ON SATURDAY	5

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday, as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be five, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be nine.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male or Female Worker, in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows:—

(A) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

(1) For the FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Sub-Section.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate specified in Sub-paragraph (4) shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

(5) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(B) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

(a) All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed and made effective, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

(b) All Male and Female Workers (other than Male and Female Indentured Apprentices as defined in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice R.B. (19) issued by the Trade Board, dated 29th May, 1922), in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has not been fixed, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances, of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

SECTION III.—Where a worker (*e.g.*, a worker of the Jewish Religion) is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this part of this Schedule shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice, and subject to the provisions of Section III of this Part of this Schedule:—

A MALE or FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:—

(A) Is not an Apprentice as defined by the Trade Board in Part I, or in the Proviso to Section II of Part II, of their Notice R.B. (19), dated 29th May, 1922;

(B)—(i) In the case of a MALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FIVE YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, and has not served as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(ii) In the case of a FEMALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FOUR YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade;

AND

(C) In the case of both a MALE and FEMALE LEARNER:—

(i) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(ii) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided also that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade without a certificate or registration for a probationary period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Learnership.

SECTION II.—Notwithstanding compliance with the conditions specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if he or she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—In the application of the General Minimum Time-Rates for Male and Female Learners respectively set out in Section IV of Part I and Section IV of Part II of this Schedule the following provisions apply :—

- (a) In determining the year of Learnership of a Male or Female Learner all employment of the Learner prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded. The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner under 14 is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for the first year of Learnership.
- (b) Any Male or Female Learner who has been previously employed in (i) any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, (ii) any Branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), or (iii) any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade coming within the scope of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), shall be entitled, subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, to count the whole period of such previous employment.
- (c) In the case of a *Male* Learner who, prior to being registered as a Learner under the provisions of this Notice, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any School or Institution where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), every two School or Institutional years during which the Learner has been so instructed at any such School or Institution shall, for the purposes of this Notice and subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, be reckoned as one year of Learnership.
- (d)—(i) A *Male* Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to him under the provisions of Part I of this Schedule upon the completion of *five* years' Learnership.
- (ii) A *Female* Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to her under the provisions of Part II of this Schedule upon the completion of *four* years' Learnership.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice the respective Minimum Rates of Wages specified in this Notice apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain of the CLASSES SPECIFIED IN THIS NOTICE in respect of all time during which they are employed in any Branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out below.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall *not* apply to PACKERS, except where they are employed on Packing operations which are performed in a workroom.

SECTION II.—The "Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade" wherever mentioned in this Notice means the Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations, that is to say :—

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached.

Including :—

- (1)—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.
- (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunction with, the repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments.
- (2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making of such garments.
- (3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.
- (4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

But excluding :—

- (1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments.
- (2) The making of headgear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board, and in pursuance of Orders of the Minister of Labour, dated 15th February, 1922, the 19th May, 1922, and the 12th July, 1922, confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as fixed or as varied by the Trade Board, and set out above.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain, under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920, which is covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 27th August, 1920, with respect to the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Male and Female Workers as set out in the Schedule of the Notice C.W. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th July, 1922, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

As regards the classes of workers for whom Variation in the General Minimum Time-Rate is proposed, according to Part I of this Schedule, Overtime Rates, calculated on the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule, in the manner set out in the Schedule of the Notice C.W. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th July, 1922, shall apply in

substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours which, as set out in the Schedule of the Notice dated 13th July, 1922, the Trade Board have declared to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

Note—No Variation is proposed in the General Minimum Time Rates (and the Overtime Rates based thereon) for Male Workers under 21 years of age and for Female Workers under 18 years of age, set out in the Notice C.W. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th July, 1922.

PART III.

The above proposed variations shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain, of the classes specified above, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any section of the Cotton Waste Branch of the Waste Materials Reclamation Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 27th August, 1920, and set out in Part III of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice C.W. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th July, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of July, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Cotton Waste Reclamation Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

(4) dated 11th August, 1920, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 9th August, 1920, by AN ALTERATION IN THEIR APPLICATION ACCORDING TO THE METHOD OF COLLECTION AND DELIVERY OF THE WORK, AS FOLLOWS:—

FOREIGN ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Amendment of Article 3 of Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

1. Article 3 of the Foreign Animals Order of 1910 is hereby revoked, and the following Article is substituted therefor:—

Conditions applicable to Vessels while in port with foreign animals on board.

“ 3. In the case of any cattle, sheep, goats, or swine brought into a port in Great Britain

(a) from a port in a scheduled country, or

(b) from a port in a country which is not a scheduled country if the animal since it was taken on board at that port has entered a port in a scheduled country, the following conditions shall apply while the vessel is in a port in Great Britain, namely:—

(1) The animals shall not, except under the authority of a licence granted by the Minister and subject to any conditions thereby imposed, be removed from the vessel in which they are brought to Great Britain, and then only in accordance with the provisions of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and this Order.

(2) Except where the licence otherwise provides, the animals shall not be removed from the vessel until they have been examined by a Veterinary Inspector or Veterinary Surgeon employed by the Ministry, and such Veterinary Inspector or Veterinary Surgeon shall be permitted to examine the animals at such time or times as he may require.

(3) No person, except Inspectors of the Ministry, Officers of Customs and Excise,

and persons while actually engaged in tending the animals or disinfecting or cleansing the pens, shall enter a pen in which the animals are, or have recently been kept, until the pen has been disinfected and cleansed.

(4) Every person upon leaving a pen in which the animals are or have recently been kept shall thoroughly wash his hands with soap and water and disinfect his boots with a four per cent. solution of carbolic acid, or some other disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency, and every such person landing from the vessel in Great Britain shall take such other steps as may be necessary to disinfect his clothes.

(5) The vessel shall, while in any port in Great Britain, and while any such animal remains on board such vessel, be disinfected and cleansed at intervals not exceeding twenty-four hours, in the manner hereinafter described:—

(i.) All parts of the vessel with which any such animal or its dung has come in contact, and all fittings, pens, hurdles and utensils used for or about any such animal, shall be thoroughly saturated or washed with:—

(a) a one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine, or

(b) a four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(ii.) The fittings, pens, hurdles and utensils shall then be scraped, the said parts of the vessel shall immediately afterwards be scraped and swept, and then the whole shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water.

(iii.) All dung of the animals, and all litter, scrapings and sweepings removed from the pens, shall be thoroughly mixed with quicklime and thereafter without delay be destroyed by fire on board the vessel, or disposed of as an Inspector of the Local Authority may direct, but in such a manner as effectually to prevent their contact with animals.

(iv.) While any part of the vessel is being cleansed or disinfected, all animals

shall be temporarily removed to another part of the vessel.

(v.) If and when no animal remains on board, the said parts of the vessel, and all fittings, pens, hurdles and utensils, shall forthwith be finally disinfected and cleansed in the manner above described."

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title and Construction.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOREIGN ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922, and shall be read with the Foreign Animals Order of 1910.

EPIZOOTIC ABORTION ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

1. Epizootic abortion of bovine animals shall be a disease for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):—

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Prohibition of Exposure in Markets, &c.

2. It shall not be lawful for any person to expose or cause to be exposed in any market, fairground, or saleyard, a cow or a heifer

which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding such exposure.

Prohibition of Sale without Notification.

3. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell, or cause to be sold, a cow or heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding such sale unless before the sale he shall have given to the purchaser notice in writing of such premature calving.

Prohibition of Service without Notification.

4. It shall not be lawful for any person to send or cause to be sent to any bull for service a cow or heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding, unless before the service he shall have given notice in writing of such premature calving to the owner of the bull.

Prohibition of Turning out on Common or Unfenced Land or of Grazing on Highway.

5. It shall not be lawful for any person to cause or permit a cow or heifer which to his knowledge, or according to information furnished to him, has calved prematurely within the two months immediately preceding, to graze

(a) on any common or uninclosed land, or

(b) in a field or other inclosed place not so fenced as to prevent cattle entering or escaping from the field or place, or

(c) on the side of a highway, or

(d) on any land on which there are cattle which are not the property of the owner of the cow or heifer.

Offences.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and person in charge of the animal in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done, or omitted to be done, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

7. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Extent.

8. This Order shall extend to England and Wales and Scotland.

Revocation.

9. The Epizootic Abortion Order of 1921 is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

10. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

11. This Order may be cited as the EPIZOOTIC ABORTION ORDER OF 1922.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 2) shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the County of Cumberland, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

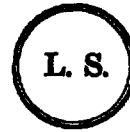
(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District

in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Orders be treated as a licence under those Orders.
