2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £10,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will

be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 8th August, 1922, to Saturday, the 12th August, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, have given notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of an Order by the Minister of Labour, dated 15th July, 1922, and of the contents of such Order, confirming the Variation by the Trade Board of General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, the minimum rates as varied to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure and specifying 1st August, 1922, as the date from which such rates should become effective.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board (EXCEPT the Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of male apprentices and improvers in tenting and dressing which are set out in the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (10), dated 23rd February, 1922), and takes the place of the Notices F.H. (6), F.H. (9), and F.H. (13), issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st October, 1921, 23rd February, 1922, and 8th June, 1922, respectively.

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective under orders of the Minister of Labour dated 20th February, 1922, 29th May, 1922, and 19th July, 1922, as follows:—

- (1) The General Minimum Time-Rates for Female Reelers of 18 years of age and over and for Female Reeling Learners and the Overtime Rates based thereon - as from 27th July, 1922.*
- (2) The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Male Hose-Pipe Weavers and the Overtime Rates based thereon - " 27th July, 1922.*
- (3) The General Minimum Time-Rate for certain classes of Hemp Rollers and Hemp Breakers, and the Overtime Rates based thereon - " 27th February, 1922.
- (4) In all other cases - " 12th June, 1922.

* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 2nd August, 1922.

PART V.

DEFINITION OF "WEEK."

SECTION I.

- (a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;
- (b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the rates set out in Parts I and III of this Schedule must be divided:—

- (a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;
- (b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.

Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II of this Part must be made for *all* hours of employment whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part VII below.

PART VII.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be:—

In any week	48
On any week day other than Saturday	8½
On Saturday	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays, Statutory Holidays and any days which are Customary Holidays in the district in the Flax and Hemp Trade (but so that the total number of such days, including Statutory Holidays, but excluding Sundays, shall not exceed 11 working days in any one year) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—Male and Female Workers employed on Time-Work:—

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male or Female Worker EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK in excess of the declared normal number of hours, shall be as follows:—

- (1) For all time worked on any of the days mentioned in the proviso to Section I of this Part of this Schedule, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(2) For all time worked in excess of 4½ hours on Saturday, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) (a) For the first two hours worked in excess of 8½ hours on any other day, One-and-a-quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For all time worked in excess of 10½ hours, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Provided that in the case of workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for nine hours per day on five days of the week, and for three hours on Saturday, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (3) (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of 8½ hours, but shall be payable thereafter till 11 hours have been worked, and the Overtime Rate payable fixed by Sub-Section (3) (b) of this Section shall apply in respect of all hours worked after 11 hours.

Provided also that to workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend only on five days a week, the said rates fixed by Sub-Section 3 (a) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first three-quarters of an hour in excess of 8½ hours, but shall be payable thereafter until 11½ hours have been worked; and the

said rate fixed by Sub-Section 3 (b) of this Section shall be payable for all time worked in excess of $11\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Provided also that in the case of workers who, in accordance with the practice of the establishment, attend for $8\frac{1}{2}$ hours or less on the five days Monday to Friday inclusive, the Overtime Rate fixed by Sub-Section (2) of this Section shall not be payable in respect of the first quarter of an hour in excess of $4\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Saturday, but shall be payable thereafter.

(4) For all time worked in any week in excess of 48 hours One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME - AND - A - QUARTER, except where a higher amount is payable in respect of Overtime under Sub-Sections (1), (2) and (3) (b) of this Section with regard to Overtime Rates.

SECTION III.—Male and Female Workers EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

(a) All Female Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(b) Male Hosepipe Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate specified in Part IV. of this Schedule, the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the Worker had been employed on Time-work were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(c) Male Canvas Weavers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable, as set out in Part VI. of this Schedule, or where no General Minimum Piece-Rate has been fixed and made effective, to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(d) All other Male Workers of the classes specified in this Notice employed on Piece-

work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY Worker not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Double-Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

SECTION IV.—The provisions set out in this Part of the Schedule are without prejudice to any agreement between an employer and his workers, providing for the payment at Overtime Rates of all hours in excess of the normal number of hours in the establishment, notwithstanding that such normal number of hours is less than 48 per week.

NOTE.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VIII.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain, in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scutched flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

Including:—

- (1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage; and
- (2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

but excluding:—

- (1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and
- (2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and
- (3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also
- (4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

PART IX.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who

are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Workers as varied and fixed by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 19th July, 1922, together with the Minimum Rates (as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice O. (11), dated 24th March, 1922) which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

This Notice takes the place of all previous Notices fixing, varying or cancelling Minimum Rates of Wages issued by the Trade Board.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

1. The General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I, Section I (1), (2) and (3) of the Schedule below (and marked †) and the Overtime Rates based thereon, as from 12th September, 1921.

2. The General Minimum Time-Rate for Home-Workers specified in Part IV, Section II of the Schedule below (and marked *), as from 27th March, 1922.

3. In all other cases (with the exception of the Rates set out in Column B, the date of operation of which is specified therein), as from 31st July, 1922.†

† NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period from which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the Rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 6th August, 1922.

A Female Worker employed on piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, as set out in Part II of this Schedule (or, where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate is applicable, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section II of Part I of this Schedule), a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate, which would be payable under the provisions of Part A of this Section, if the worker were employed on Time-Work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

C.—MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK :—

A Male Worker employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as set out in Section I of Part I of this Schedule, a sum equivalent to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate payable under the provisions of Part A of this Section, if the worker were employed on Time-Work, were Double-Time, or Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

- (a) As regards workers employed under 21 years of age, the above Minimum Rates shall apply only in cases where the worker is, during the whole or a substantial part of his time, **LEARNING ANY BRANCH OR PROCESS OF THE TRADE** under conditions which afford him **A REASONABLE PROSPECT OF ADVANCEMENT** to the Minimum Rates applicable to workers of 21 years of age and over. Otherwise the General Minimum Time rate applicable shall be 52s. per week (*i.e.* 1s. 1d. per hour), and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable shall be 62s. per week, irrespective of age.
- (b) A **WORKER WHO ENTERS THE TRADE FOR THE FIRST TIME AT THE AGE OF 15 YEARS OR OVER**, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work, may, until the expiry of six months' employment in the trade, be employed at a rate which is not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-rate which would otherwise be applicable according to his age.

SECTION III.

The weekly rates set out above are based on a week of 48 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION IV.

In cases where workers are employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be sufficient to yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an **ORDINARY WORKER**, an amount not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS. (All Ages.)

SECTION I.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In ANY WEEK	48
On ANY DAY (other than Saturday)	9
On SATURDAY	5

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on the days allowed as holidays under Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of all hours worked by Male and Female Workers, in excess of the declared normal number of hours, are as follows :—

(A) For MALE and FEMALE WORKERS employed on TIME-WORK :—

- (1) For the first two hours of OVERTIME on any day except SUNDAY and the holidays specified above the OVERTIME RATE shall be ONE-AND-A-QUARTER TIMES the GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (2) For OVERTIME after the first two hours of OVERTIME on any day, except SUNDAY and the holidays specified above, the OVERTIME RATE shall be ONE-AND-A-HALF TIMES the GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (3) For all time worked on SUNDAY and the days allowed as holidays under SECTION 35 of the FACTORY and WORKSHOP ACT, 1901, the OVERTIME RATE shall be TWICE the GENERAL MINIMUM TIME RATE otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.
- (4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the OVERTIME RATE shall be ONE-AND-A-QUARTER TIMES the GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher OVERTIME RATES are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of SUB-SECTION (A) of this SECTION.

Provided that :—

- (a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the OVERTIME RATE shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.
- (b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate SATURDAYS, the OVERTIME RATE shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on SATURDAY is required *after* 50 hours have been worked.

(B) For Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work :—

All Male and Female Workers who are employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

Note.—The hours which women, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

SECTION I.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Regulations dated 12th June, 1914, made by the Board of Trade under Section II. of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, with respect to the constitution and proceedings of the Tin Box Trade Board (Great Britain).

SECTION II.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows :—

The making of boxes and canisters from tinplate, excluding the sealing of filled boxes and canisters with solder, and excluding the following branches of work, namely, the lining of packing cases with tinplate, the making of trunks, uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, cash and deed boxes, despatch boxes, letter boxes, kegs and drums and any other branch of work which does not form part of the tin box and canister trade.

Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this Part of this Schedule, the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall not apply to persons occupied merely as clerks, salesmen, saleswomen, travellers, carpenters, vanmen, watchmen, outside messengers, cleaners of premises, timekeepers, or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

PART IV.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 8th July, 1922, confirming the variations of minimum rates made by the Trade Boards and set out above, and specifying the dates provided in this Schedule as the dates from which the variations respectively become effective.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF GEOLOGISTS ON THE GEOLOGICAL SURVEY.
 (Under the Committee of the Privy Council for Scientific and Industrial Research.)

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. *Age*.—Candidate must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st April of the year in which the competition is held.

2. *Nationality*.—No person will be eligible for appointment to the Civil Service who is not a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who have served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War.

3. *Military Service*.—Until further order preference will be given to candidates who have served in His Majesty's Forces in the Great War.

4. *Publicity*.—The Committee of the Privy Council will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. *Application*.—Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Survey and Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and a personal interview or such other means as the Director considers suitable, will submit the names of

such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for any of the existing or prospective vacancies to the Lord President of the Council for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. *Education.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in their opinion fits them for the post. Candidates thus recommended and approved may, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners, be submitted to a qualifying examination in English, Arithmetic and General Knowledge.

7. *Health and Character.*—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Until further order, and other things being equal, preference will be given by the Selection Board to candidates whose choice of occupation is limited by a physical impairment due to the War, but not of such a nature as to interfere with the discharge of any of the duties of the post.

8. *Competitions.*—Candidates who have been approved by the Civil Service Commissioners and who, if required to take the qualifying examination, have passed that examination, will be summoned to an interview before a

Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department, who shall be represented on the Selection Board, and one of the Commissioners shall be the Chairman. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at his interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. *Warning.*—Any attempt on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify him for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. *Fee.*—If a qualifying examination is held, each candidate admitted thereto will be required to pay a fee of £3. A Selected Candidate will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the qualifying examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
