PAPER BAG TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

VARIATION OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, have given notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of an Order by the Minister of Labour, dated 15th July, 1922, and of the contents of such Order, confirming the Variation by the Trade Board of General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, the minimum rates as varied to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure and specifying 1st August, 1922, as the date from which such rates should become effective.
