MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board (EXCEPT the Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of male apprentices and improvers in tenting and dressing which are set out in the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (10), dated 23rd February, 1922), and takes the place of the Notices F.H. (6), F.H. (9), and F.H. (13), issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st October, 1921, 23rd February, 1922, and 8th June, 1922, respectively.

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective under orders of the Minister of

Labour dated 20th February, 1922, 29th May, 1922, and 19th July, 1922, as follows:-
