UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

INCREASED RATES OF BENEFIT REGULATIONS, 1922.

The Unemployment Insurance (Increased Rates of Benefit) Regulations, 1922, dated 20th July, 1922, made by the Minister of Labour under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920 (10 and 11 Geo. 5, c. 30) (a).

Whereas by the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is empowered to make Regulations for prescribing the manner in which claims for Unemployment Benefit may be made:

And whereas the Minister has made the Unemployment Insurance (Benefit) Regula-

tions, 1920 (b) (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations"), for regulating the manner in which such claims are to be made, and those Regulations have been subsequently amended:

And whereas it is desirable further to amend the said Principal Regulations:

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations for further amending the said Principal Regulations.

1. In Part II. of the Principal Regulations, after paragraph (1) of Regulation 3 of the said Principal Regulations, there shall be inserted as an additional paragraph, the words following:—

(1a) Where particulars have been furnished by any person in accordance with directions given by the Minister of Labour under Subsection 4 of Section 1 of the Unemployed Workers' Dependents (Temporary Provision) Act, 1921, for the purpose of applying for a grant under that Act such particulars may be treated as if they had been furnished for the purpose of enabling the Minister to decide whether any addition

under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1922, ought to be made to the weekly rate of benefit in the case of a person claiming benefit under that Act."

2. Where by these Regulations any words are directed to be inserted in the Principal Regulations, copies of the Principal Regulations printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office, after these Regulations come into force, may be printed with the words inserted as these Regulations require, and the Principal Regulations shall be construed as if they had at the time these Regulations come into force been made with such additions.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Increased Rates of Benefit) Regulations, 1922.

SECTION V.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Part of this Notice the GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE for Male Workers commencing employment in the Corset Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 years shall be for the first period of six months 6½d. per hour, and for the second period of six months 8d. per hour. On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, the General Minimum Time-Rate payable to Workers to whom this Section applies shall be those applicable as set out in the Table in this Part of this Notice.

In the case of all Male Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER, at least the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate specified in this Part of this Schedule. In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies this condition regard shall be had only to the earnings of Ordinary Workers, that is to say, Workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question, and not to the earnings of Workers of less than ordinary skill and experience e.g., Learners and Infirm Workers.

- (a) For the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days of a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs (1) (a) and (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½ and 11½ respectively.

(2) ON SATURDAY in respect of:—

- (a) That class of Worker who customarily attends on five days a week:—
 - (i) For the first two hours of Overtime, that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday, one-and-a-quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (b) That class of Worker who customarily attends on six days a week, for all Overtime worked after the first five hours, one and a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rates applicable for this class of Worker are the appropriate Minimum Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule.

(3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

For ALL time worked, twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked IN ANY WEEK in excess of 48—one-and-a-quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a) (ii) and (b), and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

NOTE.—The Overtime Rates set out in sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of this Section are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule, in the application of the above Overtime Rates to Workers who customarily attend on six days a week,

PART III—*continued.*

any other day, not being Sunday, may be by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of Sections I and II above shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions "Saturday" were substituted for such short day, and such short day were substituted for "Saturday."

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children, are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

For the purpose of this Notice a FEMALE LEARNER is a Worker who:—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and
- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

SECTION II.

Notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.

In the application of the General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners the following provisions apply:—

- (a) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July as the case may be provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (b) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I (A) of Part I of this Schedule, upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

| Age of Entering upon Employment. | Conditions. |
|-------------------------------------|----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| Under 15 years of age | The completion of not less than three years' employment AND the attainment of the age of 18 years. |
| 15 and under 16 years of age | The completion of not less than two years' employment AND the attainment of the age of 18 years. |
| 16 and under 21 years of age | The completion of two years' employment. |
| 21 years of age and over | The completion of one years' employment. |

- (c) No Female Learner shall be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate under Section I (A) of Part I of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that, in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

SECTION IV.

For the purpose of this Notice a "Home-Worker" is a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

SECTION I.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Workers in the United Kingdom in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Corset) Order, 1919.

SECTION II.

The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

- (a) The manufacture of Corsets, Stays, Children's Corset Bodices, Infants' Stay Bands, Bust Confiners, such as Brassières, and Bandeaux when boned or with elastic webbing in their construction.
- (b) The manufacture of Support or Abdominal Belts and similar articles, except where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of Surgical Instruments.
- (c) The assembling of Stocking Suspenders in conjunction with or in association with the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.
- (d) All Warehousing, Packing or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART VI.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions, other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board, and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 26th July, 1922, confirming the variations of minimum rates of wages made by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the dates provided in this Schedule as the dates from which the variations respectively become effective.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1), shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned

in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Southampton, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
