

PART II.

The Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates shall apply, subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain employed in Leathering and Finishing as defined above, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice Z. (9), dated 12th November, 1920

PART III.

SECTION I.

The Proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.

The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Fix which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th day of August, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Fur Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
