PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 31st day of July, 1922 (V. 131/1922), in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we have had under consideration the Scales of Allowances to Officers' Stewards in Your Majesty's Navy for the care of the Mess Traps supplied to Flag Officers', Commanding Officers', Ward Room, Gun Room and Warrant Officers' Messes, as laid down in Appendix XV, Part III, of the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service:

“And whereas we are of opinion that in view of the fluctuating values of Mess Traps in the charge of the Officers' Stewards, it is desirable that these allowances should be based on the quantity of Mess Traps supplied according to the number and rank of Officers in a Mess instead of on the value of the Mess Traps:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve the adoption from the 1st day of October, 1922, of a revised Scale of Allowances payable to Officers' Stewards for the care of Mess Traps supplied to Flag Officers', Commanding Officers', Ward

Room, Gun Room and Warrant Officers' Messes in Your Majesty's Navy as follows:—

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by paragraph (c) of sub-section (2) of Section 3 of the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council transfer to the Minister of Health all or any of the powers and duties in England and Wales of any Government Department which appear to His Majesty to relate to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people:

And whereas by sub-section (4) of the said Section it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such incidental, consequential, and supplemental provisions as may be necessary or expedient for the purpose of giving full effect to any transfer of powers or duties by or under that Section and may make such adaptations in the enactments relating to such powers or duties as may be necessary to make exercisable by the Minister and his officers the powers and duties so transferred:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the powers and duties conferred or imposed upon the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries under the Rats and Mice (Destruction) Act, 1919, relate, as respects port sanitary districts and vessels, to matters affecting or incidental to the health of the people, and that it is expedient that the said powers and duties should be transferred to the Minister of Health:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Rats and Mice Destruction, Transfer of Powers) Order, 1922.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. On and after the date of this Order, the powers and duties of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries under the Rats and Mice (Destruction) Act, 1919, so far as they relate to the supervision of the administration and enforcement of that Act in any port sanitary

district or in regard to vessels, shall be transferred to the Minister of Health.

3. References to the Minister of Health shall be substituted for references to the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries in Sections 3 and 7 of the said Act so far as those sections relate to the enforcement of that Act in a port sanitary district or in regard to vessels.

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Kent and Surrey (Swine-Fever) Order of 1917, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Kent, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
