"And whereas we consider that provision is necessary for a Barber in Your Majesty's

Hospital Ship 'Maine' wherein Royal Marine ranks are not usually borne:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of an allowance of 2d. a day as from 27th July, 1922, to the Naval Rating or Marine carrying out the duties of Barber in Your Majesty's Hospital Ship 'Maine.'
"The Lords Commissioners of Your

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The District of the County Court of Somersetshire held at Temple Cloud and Midsomer Norton, except the Parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 2 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Gloucestershire held at Bristol, and from the 30th day of September, 1922, the holding of the said Court at Temple Cloud and Midsomer Norton shall be discontinued, and all powers and jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Bristol and the said Court held at Bristol shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

2. The Parish of Midsomer Norton and the Parish of Radstock shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 30th day of September, 1922, be detached from and cease to form part of the District of the said Court held at Temple Cloud and Midsomer Norton, and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the District of the County Court of Somersetshire held at Frome.

3. In this Order "Parish" shall have the same meaning as in the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899 (S.R. & O., 1899, No. 178), provided that the boundaries of every Parish mentioned in this Order shall be those constituted and limited at the date of this Order.

4. This Order may be cited as the County Court Districts (Temple Cloud and Midsomer Norton) Order in Council, 1922, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1922, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pokesdown, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, all in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Win-

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, the said New Parish of Pokesdown, and the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, the said New Parish of Pokesdown and the said

New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated church or chapel in use

for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Instrument dated the 20th day of October, 1921, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consideration of a benefaction of a capital sum of £1,200 sterling paid to us for the spiritual benefit of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, did in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, section 5, grant to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, one yearly sum or stipend of £60, such yearly sum or stipend to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate has been employed at the unconsecrated Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, situate within the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, at a salary of not less than £120 per annum, and such yearly sum or stipend to continue payable so long only as may appear to us to be expedient:

And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sum or stipend of £60 payable by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £60 to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the District which is hereinafter recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, then to the Vicar or Incum-

bent thereof for the time being:

"And whereas the said benefaction of £1,200 now held by us is available for the further endowment of the said proposed separate District and we have agreed to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year to the Minister or Incumbent of such District or New Parish when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act the sum of £60 per annum so long as the said capital sum of £1,200 shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,300 towards the endowment of the said proposed District or New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being and we have agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal quarterly payments on the aforesaid quarter days in each and every year to such Minister or Incumbent when duly licensed as before mentioned the sum of £65 per annum so long as such capital sum shall remain in our hands:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £1,300 has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £700, in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the

Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish, when duly licensed as before mentioned, a yearly sum of £35:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund hereinbefore mentioned a grant of £100 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when

duly licensed as before mentioned:

"And whereas the said grant of the yearly sum of £60, the said grant of the capital sum of £700 and the said grant of the yearly sum of £100 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument or Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas there has been contributed and transferred into our name a sum of £4,020 16s. 2d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed

District :

"And whereas the said sum of Stock has been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £4,020 16s. 2d. Local Locans £3 per centum Stock towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned, the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, for the first turn of presentation, and the Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester for the time being for the second and every suc-

ceeding turn of presentation:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, of the said New Parish of Pokesdown, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereuntc annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary, Bournemouth.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish

and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, for the first turn of presentation, and the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, and his successors, for the second and every succeeding turn of presentation.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters afcresaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.'

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mary, Bournemouth,

comprising:—
"All those contiguous portions of the New

Parish (sometime District) of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pokesdown and the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of St. John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, all in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, at the junction of Holdenhurst Road with Washington Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Washington Avenue for a distance of 91 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Spring Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Spring Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the passage leading into Windham Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of the said passage for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Windham Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Windham Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Boscombe Grove Road, and extending thence first eastward and then north eastward along the middle of Boscombe Grove Road for a distance of 111 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the southern portion of Curzon Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Curzon Road for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with South Road, and continuing thence south eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 14 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Ringwood, Christchurch and Bournemouth Line of the London and South Western Railway, and extending thence first north eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist,

Boscombe, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth) for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Ashley Road across such line of railway where the last mentioned boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of Pokesdown, and extending thence north westward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Ashley Road) for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of King's Park, and extending thence first eastward to the said wall or fence and then first eastward, then south eastward, then again eastward, and then north eastward along such wall or fence for a distance in all of 25 chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Gloucester Road near the southern entrance to the said park, and extending thence first north eastward to the middle of the roadway at the said southern entrance to the park and then north westward along the middle of such roadway for a distance in all of 31 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading from the Ashley Road entrance to the Christchurch Road entrance, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the County Borough of Bournemouth, and extending thence northward in a straight line (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pokesdown from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and also crossing Little Down Common) for a distance of 582 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Holdenhurst Road with the road called Queen's Park North Drive, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Holdenhurst Road (thereby following in part the last mentioned boundary, in part the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, and in part the boundary which divides the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth) for a distance of 1 mile and 12 chains or thereabouts, to the junction of Holdenhurst Road with Washington Avenue upon the last mentioned boundary, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and

after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pur-

suant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed

separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as afcresaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chelmsford as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish

should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Edwin, now Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and of the said Parish of Dagenham which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Beacontree.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said John Edwin, Bishop of the said Diocese of Chelmsford, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Thomas, Becontree,

comprising: "I. All that portion of the New Parish ometime Consolidated Chapelry) of All (sometime Saints, Goodmayes, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon the south partly by the Parish of Barking and partly by the Parish of Dagenham, upon the east by the said Parish of Dagenham, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Goodmayes, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, at the centre of the bridge which carries the main line of the Great Eastern Railway across Mayes Brook, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the middle of Mayes Brook (thereby passing through the Goodmayes Recreation Ground) for a distance of 1 mile and 3 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Goodmayes Lane across the said brook, and extending thence southward along the middle of Goodmayes Lane for a distance of 141 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Longbridge Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, from the said Parish of Barking.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Dagenham which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath, upon the west and upon the south by the above described portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, and, upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Goodmayes, from the said Parish of Dagenham at a point in the middle of Green Liane distant 5 chains measured along the middle of such lane from its junction with Baron Road, and extending from the said point northward in a straight line (thereby following the proposed course of the new arterial road which will lead to Chadwell Heath Station) for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Chitty's Lane across the main line of the Great Eastern Railway upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Dagenham from the said New Parish of Saint Chad, Chadwell Heath.'
