At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 10th day of *August*, 1922.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 5th day of August, 1922 (N. 9376/22), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by an Order in Council of Her late Majesty bearing date 22nd November, 1890, it was enacted that the Royal Marine rank carrying out the duties of Barber in such of the Flag Ships as are also Depot Ships, Naval Barracks, and Steam Reserve Depot Ships at the Home Ports should receive an allowance of 2*d.* a day :

“And whereas we consider that provision is necessary for a Barber in Your Majesty's

Hospital Ship ‘*Maine*’ wherein Royal Marine ranks are not usually borne :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment of an allowance of 2*d.* a day as from 27th July, 1922, to the Naval Rating or Marine carrying out the duties of Barber in Your Majesty's Hospital Ship ‘*Maine*.’

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
