APPOINTMENTS OF STANDINGS FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

*By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, chapter 7, intituled "An Act for consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of the Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis and making other provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."*

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint Standings for Hackney Carriages at the several places hereinafter mentioned; for such number of carriages at each Standing as is specified, and within the boundaries set forth for each Standing, provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or carriage-way, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage-way.

ST. JAMES'S STREET, S.W.

Thirty-three vehicles :

In three portions, viz. :—

*First Portion*—Two carriages to stand in centre of roadway immediately South of the street refuge at junction with Piccadilly, extending as far as necessary.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

*Second Portion*.—Four carriages to stand in centre of roadway, commencing at refuge immediately North of Jermyn Street, extending as far as necessary.

*Third Portion*, at Pall Mall, seven carriages in centre of roadway, commencing West of refuge opposite Athenæum Club, extending Eastward as far as necessary.

Front of vehicles toward the West.

*Fourth Portion*, at Waterloo Place, ten carriages on the West side of roadway, by kerb, commencing at enclosure adjoining Athenæum Club, extending Southward as far as necessary.

Front of vehicles toward the North.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS  
VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF  
MALE WORKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 2ND SEPTEMBER, 1922.\*

\* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 8th September, 1922.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES:—  
FOR MALE WORKERS *OTHER THAN*  
WORKERS WHO ARE EMPLOYED AS

## SCHEDULE.

## PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES,  
PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES  
AND OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED)  
FOR ALL MALE WORKERS *OTHER  
THAN* WORKERS WHO ARE EM-  
PLOYED AS BRAZIERS, BURNISHERS,  
DIPPERS, DROP-STAMPERS, DIPPERS,  
DIPPERS WHO ARE ALSO  
BRONZERS, OR AS ANNEALERS OR  
POLISHERS.

SECTION I.—GENERAL MINIMUM  
TIME-RATES.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. per  
hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age,  
10d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age,  
8½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age,  
7d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age,  
6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age,  
5d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age,  
4d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 3d. per hour.

SECTION II.—PIECE-WORK BASIS  
TIME-RATES (ALL AGES).

The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for each  
class of Male Workers specified above is 15 per  
cent. above the appropriate General Minimum  
Time-Rate for such class, as set out in Section  
I of this Part of this Schedule.

NOTE.—In the case of all Male Workers em-  
ployed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid  
must be such as would yield, in the circum-  
stances of the case, not less than the appro-  
priate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an  
ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary  
skill and experience in the class of work in  
question.

SECTION III.—OVERTIME RATES (ALL  
AGES).

(i) In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of  
the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board  
have declared the normal number of hours of  
work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	...	...	...	47
On Saturday	...	...	...	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays  
and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded  
as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall  
apply.

(ii) The Minimum Rates for Overtime in re-  
spect of hours worked by a worker, whether  
employed on time-work or on piece-work in  
excess of the declared normal number of hours  
shall be as follows:—

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays and  
Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall  
be twice the Minimum Rate otherwise ap-  
plicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(b) For all hours worked in excess of four-  
and-a-half on Saturday, the Overtime Rate  
shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum  
Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-  
A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total  
number of hours worked in the week does not  
exceed 47.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in  
any week, the Overtime Rate shall be equiva-  
lent to TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the  
first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF  
thereafter, except in so far as higher Over-  
time Rates are payable under the provisions  
of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

NOTE.—The hours which young persons and  
children are allowed to work are subject to the  
provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts,  
and of the Employment of Women, Young  
Persons and Children Act, 1920.

## PART II.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of  
wages apply to all MALE WORKERS other  
than workers who are employed as Braziers,  
Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers  
who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or  
Polishers, in respect of all time during which  
they are employed in Great Britain in any  
branch of the trade specified in the Trade  
Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares)  
Order, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the  
above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture from metals (other than  
precious metals) by the processes of cold stamp-  
ing or cold pressing (including cutting or  
piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings,

curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

*Including:—*

(a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) The operations of carding, boxing, packing, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

*But excluding:—*

(a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

### PART III.

**SECTION I.**—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

**SECTION II.**—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

"1.—(1) Cattle, sheep, goats or swine brought from Ireland shall not be landed in Great Britain unless—

(a) the animals have been put on board at a port specified in the First Schedule to this Order; and

(b) the animals are accompanied by a certificate of a Veterinary Inspector appointed, in the case of animals shipped from a port within the jurisdiction of the

Government of Northern Ireland, by the Chief Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and in the case of animals shipped from a port within the jurisdiction of the Provisional Government by the Ministry of Agriculture of the Provisional Government certifying that the animals have been inspected by the Inspector immediately prior to shipment and found to be free from disease; and

(c) the landing is at a Landing Place defined by Order of the Minister as a Landing Place for Irish animals.

(2) The animals shall be landed in such manner and at such times as the Superintendent of the Landing Place shall direct.

(3) An Inspector of the Ministry, and until his arrival the Superintendent of the Landing Place, may exercise such control of the animals when landed as may be necessary for the purposes of this Order."

*Amendment of Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Orders of 1904 and 1906.*

2. Article 2 of the Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904 and Article 2 of the Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1906 (hereinafter referred to as the Orders of 1904 and 1906), shall be read and have effect as if, for the words "Inspector or other officer duly authorised in that behalf by the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland" there were substituted the words "Inspector or other officer appointed, in the case of swine moved from premises in the area within the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, by the Chief Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of

Ireland, and, in the case of swine moved from premises in the area within the jurisdiction of the Provisional Government, by the Ministry of Agriculture of the Provisional Government."

*Revocation.*

3. The Order of the Minister dated 24th June 1921 referring to Paragraph (3) of Article 1 of the Order of 1914 is hereby revoked.

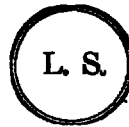

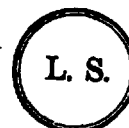
