TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 8th September, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and
 - (b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills wil! be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 16th September, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 11th September, 1922, to Saturday, the 16th September, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend payable, on the 15th October, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.
- 7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England, not: later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

Withdrawal of Authorization: Dr. Sidney Robert Walker.

The Home Secretary gives notice that he has withdrawn from Doctor Sidney Robert Walker, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., late of Beech Grove, Ripon, the authorisation granted by the Regulations made under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium and the drugs to which Part III of the said Act applies.

Any person supplying Dr. Walker with raw opium or any of the drugs to which Part III of the Act applies will be committing an offence against the Act.

The Home Secretary gives notice that, in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women and young persons of 16 years of age and over in making Toffee at the Lion Toffee Mills of Mr. Harry Vincent, Wiggin Street, Birmingham, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in Shift II in consecutive weeks; that no worker shall be employed on such shifts who does not live within one mile of the mills; and that suitable cloakroom accommodation and washing facilities shall be provided.

 - (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-

- station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.
