## PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollow-ware Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 6th July, 1914, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers of 18 years of age or over set out in their Notice dated 16th June, 1922, and effective under an Order of the Minister of Labour dated 9th June, 1922, the proposed variations being as set out in the Schedule below.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

## SECTION V.—

DEFINITION OF LEARNERS, and conditions to be complied with :

For the purpose of this Notice :

- (a) A Female Learner is a worker under 18 years of age, or a worker who being of 18 years of age or over has had less than 12 months' experience in the trade, who (in both cases) is engaged in learning under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Female Workers other than Learners.
- (b) A Male Learner is any male person under 21 years of age who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Male Workers other than Learners.

In the case of all Female Workers of 18 years of age or over employed on Piece-work each Piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

## PART III.

## PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR ALL FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice, H. (12), dated 16th June, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 16th June, 1922, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

THE ABOVE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES OR TO AGREEMENTS MADE OR THAT MAY BE MADE FOR THE PAYMENT OF WAGES IN EXCESS OF THE MINIMUM RATES.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th day of September, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary, Hollow-ware Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

NOTE.—Each Female Worker, irrespective of age, when employed on piece-work must be paid piece-rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate of 7½d. per hour for the period until 31st December, 1922, and of 7¼d. per hour on and after 1st January, 1923.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Workers in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked on Sunday, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9, or in the case of Saturday exceeds 4½, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are without prejudice to the payment of Overtime Rates after a lesser number of hours than those declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number in the trade, in cases where such lesser number of hours constitutes the number customarily worked in the establishment.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade

Boards Acts, to all Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

1. The making of such articles as are specified in (a) and (b) below, from linen or cotton or mixed linen and cotton fabrics (excepting knitted fabrics), or from other textile fabrics when the work is carried on in establishments mainly engaged in the making of such articles from the before-mentioned fabrics, *viz.*:—

(a) Handkerchiefs (including Mufflers or Flags when made in association or in conjunction with handkerchiefs);

(b) Bed-linen, Towels, Dusters, Table-napery, Bedspreads, Tea-cloths, Table-centres, Sideboard-covers, Cushion-covers or similar household articles;

including all or any of the following operations:—

(i) Hooking, cutting or tearing the material;

(ii) Vice-folding;

(iii) Machine hemming, hem-stitching, spoking, overlocking, tambouring, button-holing, and other plain or fancy machine stitching;

(iv) All processes of embroidery or decorative needle-work done by machine, whether before or after the making of the articles of the description specified above;

(v) The following processes, if done by machine:—Thread-drawing, thread-clipping, top-sewing, scalloping, nickelling and paring;

(vi) All processes of laundering, smoothing, folding, ornamenting, boxing, finishing, warehousing, packing, and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles of the description specified above.

2. The making-up in linen warehouses or in establishments mainly engaged in linen lapping, of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile fabrics in the piece, or of linen or mixed linen and cotton or other textile articles cut from the piece, including:—

Measuring, cutting, lapping, ornamenting, boxing, warehousing, packing and similar operations.

PART V.

GENERAL PROVISIONS.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—THE ABOVE MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES.

## PART VI.

## CANCELLATION OF GUARANTEED TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE PIECE-WORKERS.

The Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers and the General Minimum Time-Rate of  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour less, during the first six months' period of employment, than the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable in the case of Female Workers entering the Trade for the first time between the ages of 16 and 18 years, as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice H.L. (8), dated 7th March, 1922, which became effective as from 8th March, 1922, are cancelled as from 11th September, 1922.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the variation and cancellation of Minimum Rates of Wages made by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the 11th day of September, 1922, as the date from which such variation and cancellation should become effective.
