

SECTION V.—

DEFINITION OF LEARNERS, and conditions to be complied with :

For the purpose of this Notice :

- (a) A Female Learner is a worker under 18 years of age, or a worker who being of 18 years of age or over has had less than 12 months' experience in the trade, who (in both cases) is engaged in learning under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Female Workers other than Learners.
- (b) A Male Learner is any male person under 21 years of age who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Male Workers other than Learners.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR FEMALE WORKERS OF 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

In the case of all Female Workers of 18 years of age or over employed on Piece-work each Piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR ALL FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice, H. (12), dated 16th June, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 16th June, 1922, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

THE ABOVE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES OR TO AGREEMENTS MADE OR THAT MAY BE MADE FOR THE PAYMENT OF WAGES IN EXCESS OF THE MINIMUM RATES.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 12th day of September, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary, Hollow-ware Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

AND CANCELLATION OF GUARANTEED TIME-RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES
OF FEMALE WORKERS.

Effective as from 11th September, 1922.*

*NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall
