NOTICE GIVEN BY HIS MAJESTY'S PRINCIPAL SECRETARY OF STATE FOR FOREIGN AFFAIRS UNDER ARTICLE 3 (1) OF THE TURKEY ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, 1922.

Whereas by Article 3 (1) of the Turkey Order-in-Council, 1922, it is provided that the operation of so much of the Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, as relates to the power and jurisdiction of courts is suspended until His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, shall otherwise order, in such portions of the Ottoman Dominions as may be subject to the military occupation of Great Britain or of an Allied Power or Powers, provided that courts have been established therein by the occupying Power or Powers which are recognised by His Majesty as competent to exercise jurisdiction over British subjects and their property and over British ships;

And whereas by Article 3 (2) of the said Turkey Order-in-Council, 1922, it is provided that the Secretary of State shall from time to

time give notice of any such suspension of the said Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, and shall specify the areas within which such suspension shall operate;

Now, therefore, I, George Nathaniel, Marquess Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., &c., &c., His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, hereby give notice that the operation of so much of the Ottoman Order-in-Council, 1910, as relates to the power and jurisdiction of Courts is suspended in the following areas, namely:—

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1894.

LAVENHAM (SUFFOLK) FAIR.

Whereas a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Rural District Council of Cosford to the effect that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the Fair which has been held on Shrove Tuesday and the Monday preceding and the Wednesday following Shrove Tuesday at Lavenham, in the county of Suffolk, should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation, and of the time when I would take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1871:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1871, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held on Shrove Tuesday and the Monday preceding and the Wednesday following Shrove Tuesday at Lavenham, in the county of Suffolk, shall be abolished.

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Suffolk (Swine-Fever) Order of 1914 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Suffolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence, in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule, to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
