PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates (A) for MALE WORKERS other than Workers who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or Polishers, at present effective

and set out in the Schedule to the Notice Q (18), issued by the Trade Board, and dated 18th August, 1922; and also (B) for FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as Polishers or as Drop-Stampers; as Hand-Brush-Japanners who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Hand-Brush-Lacquerers who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Blow-Pipe-Braziers, or Solderers using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with Bar Solder, at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Notice Q (15), issued by the Trade Board, and dated 7th June, 1922; the proposed Minimum Rates being as set out in the Schedule below.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

As respects the classes of Male and Female Workers for whom variations of the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates are proposed in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III. of the Notice Q (15) issued by the Trade Board, dated 7th June, 1922, and in Section III. of Part I. of the Notice Q (18) issued by the Trade Board, dated 18th August, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notices Q (15) and Q (18) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply subject to the Provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, (A) to all MALE WORKERS other than Workers who are employed as Braziers, Burnishers, Drop-Stampers, Dippers, Dippers who are also Bronzers, or as Annealers or Polishers, and (B) to all FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as Polishers or as Drop-Stampers, as Hand-Brush Japanners who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Blow-Pipe-Braziers or Solderers using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with Bar Solder, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, as set out in Part IV. of the above-mentioned Notice Q (18).

Note.—The minimum rates marked † in Section I. of Part I. of this Schedule are the rates at present in force and are unaffected by this proposal.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 26th day of September, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

IRISH ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Reduction to six days of period of detention in respect of Animals moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place under the Irish Animals Order of 1922.

- 1. Article 4 of the Irish Animals Order of 1922 is hereby revoked, and the following article substituted therefor:—
- "4.—(1) Cattle and sheep moved to premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard from an Irish Animals Landing Place or from a special market shall on arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence be detained therein for a period of six days after arrival thereat, unless the animals are slaughtered on the premises before the expiration of that period. During that period the animals shall not be removed from the premises except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and then only to a slaughterhouse for the purpose of slaughter therein. Animals so moved shall be detained at the slaughterhouse specified in the licence until slaughtered.
- "(2) Cattle shall not be moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order unless and until they are marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent by the clipping of a broad arrow, \(\begin{align*} \) about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle, if the cattle are not intended for immediate slaughter, and on the right hind-quarter of each of the cattle if the cattle are intended for immediate slaughter."

Detention of Cattle Moved under Previous Order.

2. Cattle moved from a Landing Place or a special market before the date of commencement of this Order with a licence under the Order hereby modified shall not be required (notwithstanding any provision in such Order) to be detained at the place of destination specified in such licence for a longer period than six days after the date of the commencement of this Order.



- 1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Suffolk (Swine Fever) Order of 1914, shall not apply to the movement of swine from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Suffolk, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:-
 - (i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.
 - (ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.
 - (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in

charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

- 2. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.
- 3. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article I of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.
