TAXATION OF TREASURY BILLS  
ABROAD.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby draw the attention of all concerned to the fact that as from the 1st September, 1922, the powers conferred upon the Treasury by Section 47 of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1915, as amended by Section 44 (i) of the Finance Act, 1916, have lapsed. These sections empowered the Treasury during the continuance of the War and a period of 12 months thereafter to issue securities with a condition that neither the capital nor the interest thereof shall be liable to British taxation so long as it is shown in manner directed by the Treasury that the securities are in the beneficial ownership of persons who are as regards income tax (including super-tax) not ordinarily resident and as regards other taxation are neither domiciled nor ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.

By a Notice under these powers published on the 15th August, 1916, the Treasury announced that the capital and interest of any Treasury Bills would not be liable to taxation if in the beneficial ownership of persons neither domiciled nor ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom, and that the interest of Treasury Bills would not be liable to British Income Tax so long as in the beneficial ownership of persons not ordinarily resident in the United Kingdom.

The period of one year after the War expired on the 31st August, 1922, and the exemptions set forth in the Notice of 15th August, 1916, accordingly do not apply to Treasury Bills issued on or after the 1st September, 1922.

### TOY TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, respectively, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Toy Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by

Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers at present effective and set out in the Schedule to their Notice Y (4) dated 5th January, 1922, the variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 16 years or over, whose employment is not of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature, and who cannot be suitably employed on piecework, shall, until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable under Section I (A), or I (B) above, according to his or her age.

SECTION II.—The Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Section I of this part of this Notice for Workers under 21 years of age shall be payable subject to the proviso that such workers are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate of 1s. 0½d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 6¾d. per hour in the case of Female Workers. Otherwise the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate payable to workers under 21 years of age shall be 1s. 0¼d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 6¾d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, irrespective of age.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, this provision shall not operate in the case of workers whose employment is of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature.

## PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS  
EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK (all ages).

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice Y (4) dated 5th January, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice Y (4) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (including Home-workers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920, as set out in Part III of the Trade Boards Notice Y (4) dated 5th January, 1922.

NOTE.—The employment of female workers, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Act, 1918.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 3rd October, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and

address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Toy Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- (1) English Composition.
