- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

REGULATIONS, DATED 2ND OCTOBER, 1922, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. V, c. 46), FOR CONTROLLING AND RESTRICTING THE POSSESSION, SALE AND DISTRIBUTION OF RAW OPIUM.

In pursuance of Section 3 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Regulations made under that Section on the 20th May, 1921 (a), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations:—

- 1. Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if the words "or attempt to obtain possession of" were inserted after the phrase "No person shall be in possession of."
- 2. The registers required to be kept in pursuance of the Principal Regulations shall be preserved for not less than two years from the date of the last entry in the register.
- 3. These Regulations may be referred to as the Raw Opium Regulations, 1922, and the Principal Regulations may be referred to as the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

REGULATIONS, DATED 2ND OCTOBER, 1922, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. V, c. 46), FOR CONTROLLING THE MANUFACTURE, SALE, POSSESSION AND DISTRIBUTION OF DANGEROUS DRUGS.

In pursuance of Section 7 of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, I hereby make the following Regulations amending the Regulations made under that Section on the 20th May, 1921 (a), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations:—

1. Regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if at

the end of the first paragraph were inserted the sentence "The prescription shall not be given for the use of the prescriber himself."

- 2. Regulation 7 of the Principal Regulations shall be amended and shall take effect as if the words "or attempt to obtain possession of" were inserted after the words" No person shall be in possession of."
- Prescriptions, records, registers, or other documents required to be retained or kept in pursuance of the Principal Regulations or of any Order made under those Regulations shall be preserved for not less than two years from the date of the prescription or document or the last entry in the record or register, as the case

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 3RD OCTOBER 1922.)

LIVERPOOL (BIRKENHEAD) LANDING OF ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Revocation.

(1) The Liverpool (Birkenhead) Landing of Animals Order of 1922 (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

Definition of Irish Animals Landing Place.

(2) All that space at the Port of Liverpool situate partly in the county borough of Birkenhead and partly in the county borough of Wallasey, which is coloured pink on the plan (No. 36,308), sealed by the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, for the purpose of this Order, and deposited at the Ministry, is hereby defined as a Landing Place for Irish Animals.

Definition of Foreign Animals Wharf.

(3) All that space at the Port of Liverpool situate partly in the county borough of Birkenhead and partly in the county borough of Wallasey, which is coloured blue on the plan referred to in Article 2 of this Order, is hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Wharf for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and any Order of the Minister thereunder.

Commencement.

(4) This Order shall come into operation on the fourth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

(5) This Order may be cited as the LIVER-POOL (BIRKENHEAD) LANDING OF ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, sheep on any premises in the Double Dipping Area described in the Schedule hereto shall, on or after the fifth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in that Area, or to be moved out of that Area, provided that they have, since the fourteenth day of August, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, been dipped twice under and in accordance with the above mentioned Order, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable from sheep not so dipped.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH OCTOBER 1922.)

IRISH ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

Control of Movement of Cattle and Sheep from Irish Animals Landing Places.

1.—(1) Cattle and sheep landed at any Irish Animals Landing Place in Great Britain shall not be moved therefrom except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry under and in accordance with the conditions pre-scribed by this Order. Such a licence may be granted for the movement of such animals only

- (a) a part of a market, fairground or saleyard specially authorised in writing by the Local Authority of the District to be used for the sale of animals moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place (hereinafter referred to as " an authorised market"), or
- (b) premises (including a slaughterhouse) other than a market, fairground or saleyard.
- (2) A copy of every special authority for the use of a market, fairground or saleyard under this Article shall be sent by the Local Authority granting the same forthwith to the Ministry.
- (3) Cattle and sheep shall not be moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order unless and until they are marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent, in the case of cattle, by the clipping of a broad arrow, A about six inches long, on the hind-quarter of each of the cattle, and in the case of sheep by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

Movement of Swine from Irish Animals Landing Places, subject to Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Orders of 1904 and 1906.

2. Swine may be moved from an Irish Ani. mals Landing Place, with permission of an Inspector of the Ministry, if accompanied by the requisite licence under the Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Orders of 1904 and 1906, granted, in the case of swine brought from premises situate in the area within the jurisdiction of the Government of Northern Ireland, by an Inspector or other Officer appointed by the Chief Secretary to the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, and in the case of swine brought from premises situate in the area within the jurisdiction of the Provisional Government by an Inspector or other Officer appointed by the Ministry of Agriculture of the Provisional Government.

Conditions attaching to Movement of Cattle, Sheep and Swine to Authorised Markets.

- 3.—(1) At every authorised market, cattle, sheep and swine moved thereto from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order, or, in the case of swine, with a licence under the Swine Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, shall at all times be kept separate from all other animals, and shall not enter any part of the market, fair-ground or saleyard not authorised under this Order whilst any other animals are therein. No animal, other than cattle, sheep and swine moved from an Irish Animals Landing Place under this Order, shall enter the part of the market, fairground or saleyard authorised under this Order.
- (2) Cattle and sheep exposed at an authorised market shall not be removed therefrom except with a further licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the market is held, and then only

to premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard for detention in accordance with the provisions of the next following Articles.

Cattle to be detained for six days on movement from an Irish Animals Landing Place or from an authorised market.

4. Cattle moved to premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard, either direct from an Irish Animals Landing Place or from an authorised market, shall on arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence be detained therein for a period of six days after arrival thereat, unless the animals are slaughtered on the premises before the expiration of that period. During that period the animals shall not be removed from the premises except with a further licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and then only to a slaughterhouse for the purpose of slaughter therein. Animals so moved shall be detained at the slaughterhouse specified in the licence until slaughtered.

Movement of Sheep from Landing Place to be subject to special conditions as to dipping or slaughter.

5.—(1) A licence authorising movement of sheep from an Irish Animals Landing Place shall be subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(a) In the case of sheep which have been dipped once in the Landing Place in an approved dip, to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry, the sheep may be moved with the licence either to

(i) premises in Great Britain, other than a market, fairground or saleyard, whereon the sheep shall be detained and isolated from other sheep until they have been certified by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination to have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an approved dip between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place; or to

(ii) an authorised market from which the sheep may be moved with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market is held to a slaughterhouse, or to premises for detention and isolation, until they have been certified by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination to have been dipped by a thorough immersion in an approved dip between the seventh and fourteenth days after the date of their previous dipping in the Landing Place.

(b) In the case of sheep which have been declared in writing by the owner to be intended for immediate slaughter and which have not been dipped in the Landing Place in an approved dip, to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Ministry, the sheep may be moved with the licence either to—

(i) a slaughterhouse, or

(ii) premises in Great Britain, other than a market, fairground or saleyard, whereon the sheep shall be detained and isolated from other sheep until they have been certified by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination to have been twice dipped on the premises by a thorough immersion in an approved dip, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings; or to

(iii) an authorised market, from which the sheep may be moved with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market is held, to a slaughterhouse, or to premises for detention and isolation until they have been certified by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place of destination to have been twice dipped on the premises by a thorough immersion in an approved dip, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings.

Provided that-

- (c) sheep required to be detained and dipped in accordance with this Article may, before they have been so dipped, be moved without having been dipped to a slaughterhouse, if such movement is authorised by a further licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority; and
- (d) sheep moved to a slaughterhouse with a licence under this Order shall be detained thereat until slaughtered.
- (2) Where under any Order of the Minister relating to Sheep-Scab or any Regulation made thereunder sheep moved under this Order are required to be dipped as a condition of movement into or out of any district, the dipping of any sheep under this Order shall be deemed to be the dipping or double-dipping of the sheep necessary in order to comply with such condition. Sheep dipped under this Order shall also be exempt from dipping under any other Order (except the Sheep Scab Order of 1920) or Regulation for a period of 56 days after the date of the second dipping under this Order, provided that the sheep have been kept separate during that period from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Special arrangements for temporary detention of animals awaiting exposure for sale at authorised markets.

- 6.—(1) Cattle and sheep moved with a licence under this Order from an Irish Animals Landing Place to an authorised market may be moved with such licence to special lairs or other enclosures adjoining or near the market for temporary detention whilst awaiting exposure for sale in the market, provided—
 - (a) that such lairs or enclosures have been authorised by the Local Authority to be used for such purpose and are, whilst being so used, under the entire control of the Local Authority;
 - (b) that such lairs or enclosures are not used for any animals other than cattle and sheep being moved to an authorised market from an Irish Animals Landing Place with a licence under this Order;
 - (c) that the animals shall not remain in such lairs or enclosures for longer than 48 hours.
- (2) If on inquiry the Ministry is satisfied that the use of any lairs or other enclosures authorised under this Article is for any reason objectionable the lairs or enclosures shall, if the Ministry so directs, cease to be authorised for the purposes of this Article.

Provisions as to Licences and Movement.

- 7.—(1) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be available for four days, inclusive of the date thereof, and no longer.
- (2) A copy of every licence granted under this Order, either by an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the authorised market or other place of destination is situate, and also to the occupier of the place of destination, except where the place of destination is an authorised market.
- (3) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Order the licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable.
- (4) A licence authorising movement to an authorised market shall be delivered up to a person appointed by the Local Authority to receive such licences at the entrance to the market, fairground or saleyard. Every other licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.
- (5) Animals moved with a licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. When being moved by road the animals shall be moved without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence.
- (6) In the case of animals moved by rail the animals shall not be untrucked for any purpose until they reach the destination station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence, except that animals may be untrucked for the purpose of feeding or watering within railway station premises, provided that any dock, pen or other part of the railway premises used for this purpose is disinfected in the manner prescribed in Article 9 of this Order, both immediately before and after each occasion of such use.

Movement of Animals subject to other Orders or Regulations.

8. Nothing in this Order shall, except as provided in Article 5 (2), be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or any Regulation of a Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.

- 9.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals from an Irish Animals Landing Place shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.
- . (2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of Irish Animals at an Irish Animals Landing Place for conveyance

therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

- thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or
 (b) A four per cent. (minimum) solution
 of carbolic acid (containing not less than
 ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid);
 or
- (c) A disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.
- (4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

Offences.

· 10. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or, in respect of Article 9, the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Interpretation.

11. "Slaughterhouse" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered.
"An approved dip" means a sheep dip

"An approved dip" means a sheep dip approved by the Minister for Sheep-Scab or purporting to be so approved.

Other terms, unless the context otherwise requires, have the same meaning as in the

Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

12. The Irish Animals Order of 1922 and the Irish Animals Order of 1922 (No. 2) are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

14. This Order may be cited as the IRISH ANIMALS ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).
