SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

PART II.—No. 2 ORDER.

GAS MANTLES.

The Board of Trade hereby give notice that they have made an Order, which comes into force forthwith, applying Part II. of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to Mantles for incandescent lighting, and component parts thereof, whether finished or not, manufactured in Germany. The effect of the Order (Safeguarding of Industries (No. 2) Order, 1922; Statutory Rules and Orders, 1922, No. 1088) is to impose an import duty of 333 per cent. ad valorem on the class of goods referred to, if manufactured in Germany.

In exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 5 of the Act, the Board of Trade have directed that Certificates of Origin shall be required so far as concerns the class or description of goods covered by the Safeguarding of Industries (No. 2) Order, 1922, in the case of goods consigned from all foreign countries in Europe.

The necessary instructions have been issued to His Majesty's Consular Officers in the countries concerned, and the form of Certificate of Origin already prescribed by the Board of Trade in connection with the previous Order (No. 1) will be applicable.

STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

Variation of Minimum Rates of Wages for CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS FOR PERIODS DEPENDENT UPON THE COST OF LIVING INDEX FIGURE.

The Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for the branches of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919, have given notice, as required by Section 4 (3) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, of the making of an Order by the Minister of Labour, dated 4th October, 1922, and of the contents of such Order confirming the variation by the Trade Board of the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece Work Basis Time Rates and Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers, the minimum rates as varied to be operative for periods dependent upon the Cost of Living Index Figure, and specifying the 14th October, 1922, as the date from which such rates should become effective.
