“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Upholland, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pemberton, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Billinge, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Upholland, the said New Parish of Pemberton and the said New Parish of Billinge are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Upholland, of the said New Parish of Pemberton and of the said New Parish of Billinge which

are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas a piece of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and transferred into our name a sum of £2,100 £5 per cent. per annum War Stock (1929-1947) towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

"And whereas the said sum of £2,100 £5 per cent. per annum War Stock (1929-1947) has been contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said sum of £2,100 £5 per cent. per annum War Stock (1929-1947) towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Liverpool as the person to whom they desire the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, now Bishop of Liverpool, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Upholland, of the said New Parish of Pemberton, and of the said New Parish of Billinge which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Luke, Orrell.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said

District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Francis James, Bishop of the said Diocese of Liverpool, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Luke, Orrell, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Upholland, the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Pemberton, and the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Billinge, all in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the junction of Orrell Road and Edge Hall Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Edge Hall Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 295 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Orrell published in the year 1908 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile, and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first eastward to and then first eastward and then south-eastward along such fence and along the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the close numbered 297 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 15½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence meets the fence forming the eastern boundary of the said close numbered 297, and extending thence southward along the last mentioned fence and along the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 311 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 10½ chains or thereabouts to a point on the northern bank of Smithy Brook, and extending thence in a straight line due south to a point in the middle of the said brook upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Pemberton from the said New Parish of Upholland, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following for the most part the middle of Smithy Brook) for a distance of 53 chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of the Liverpool, Bolton and Bury Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Highfield, in the said County and Diocese, from the said New Parish of Upholland, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby continuing to follow for the most part the middle of Smithy Brook) for a distance of 50 chains or

thereabouts to the centre of Rylance Mill Bridge where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Billinge from the said New Parish of Upholland, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of the road leading to Winstanley Hall, crossing Winstanley Park and following in part the middle of Green's Lane and in part the middle of the footpath leading from Green's Lane to Green Slate Farm) for a distance of 1 mile and 36 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the middle of the stream which flows into the reservoir of the Wigan Corporation Waterworks near Green Slate Farm, and extending from the last mentioned point first southward and then in various directions along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the footpath leading from Hesketh House to Upholland Road, and extending thence south-westward along the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upholland Road and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Upholland Road for a distance of $14\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Crank Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Crank Road (thereby following in parts the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Billinge from the said New Parish of Upholland) for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the western side of Wittle House and of the house known as Mountains to Smethurst Road, and extending thence first north-westward, then northward, then again north-westward and then again northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 48 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Smethurst Road and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Smethurst Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 340 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Billinge Higher End published in the year 1908 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first northward to the last mentioned fence and then first northward and then north-westward along such fence and along the fences forming the south-western boundaries of the closes numbered 345, 342 and 339 upon the same maps for a distance in all of $16\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Upholland from the Civil Parish of Billinge Higher End, and extending thence north-eastward along the said Civil Parish boundary for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the point on the western side of Sandbrook Road where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Upholland from the Civil Parish of Orrell, and extending thence first northward and then in various directions along the last mentioned Civil Parish boundary (thereby following in one part the western side of Sandbrook Road and in another part the course of Sand Brook and crossing the said Liverpool, Bolton and Bury Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway and also Sefton Road) for a distance of 1 mile and 7 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the middle of Orrell Road, and extend-

ing thence eastward along the middle of Orrell Road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Upholland from the said New Parish of Pemberton) for a distance of 54 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Edge Hall Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable that the whole estate and interest as aforesaid of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in the said share of the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Butley with Capel and Wantisden should be transferred to and vested in the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and his successors for ever:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is willing to accept the transfer of the said share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Butley with Capel and Wantisden, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that such transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary, he the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

That a portion of the said Benefice of Pershore, that is to say, such part thereof as is included within the boundaries hereinafter described and is more particularly set forth upon the Map or plan hereto attached and thereon coloured pink, shall be severed from the remaining portion of the said Benefice and for the purpose of the union of such severed portion with the Benefice of Stoulton shall be deemed a separate Benefice and Parish, and such severed portion of the said Benefice of Pershore and the said Benefice of Stoulton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish

under the style of the 'United Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton.'

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Stoulton shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Stoulton shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the said United Benefice.

"3. That with the consents of the said Ludovick Stewart Robinson and the said Alfred Augustus Cackle, testified by their signing this Scheme, the severance of the aforesaid portion of the Benefice of Pershore and the union of such severed portion with the Benefice of Stoulton shall take effect upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette.

"4. That after the union of the aforesaid severed portion of the said Benefice of Pershore with the said Benefice of Stoulton has taken effect the whole right of patronage of and presentation to the United Benefice of Stoulton with Drake's Broughton shall belong to the present Patron of the said Benefice of Stoulton.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices, which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Salisbury embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bradford Peverell and Charminster with Stratton are now full, the Reverend Henry Airay Watson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell and the Reverend Daniel Frederic Slemeck being the

present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Charminster with Stratton:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of Charminster with Stratton, namely the Benefice of Stratton, shall be severed from the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Charminster with Stratton, and that the Benefice of Stratton so severed and the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bradford Peverell with Stratton,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That with the consent of the said Daniel Frederic Slemeck (testified by his signing this Scheme) if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell shall be vacant, the union of the said two Benefices of Bradford Peverell and Stratton shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell shall be then full, the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the house of residence of the Minister serving the Church of Stratton shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect there shall be transferred from the said United Benefice of Charminster with Stratton and annexed to the United Benefice of Bradford Peverell with Stratton (1) all those Tithe Rent Charges commuted at £5 12s. 0d. arising within the Parish of Stratton, and now payable to the Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Charminster with Stratton, and (2) all that annual sum of £20 18s. 6d. at present payable by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Charminster with Stratton.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Bradford Peverell with Stratton from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Bradford Peverell shall have the first and third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Charminster with Stratton shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together

with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, against the said Scheme, or any part thereof, by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices proposed to be united by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 12TH OCTOBER 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Landing of Goats for Exceptional Purposes.

1. The landing of the goats described in the First Schedule hereto which are intended for exceptional purposes is hereby allowed subject to the provisions of Part II. (*Quarantine*) of the Third Schedule to the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and of the Foreign Animals (*Quarantine*) Order of 1896, and of this Order.

Definition of Foreign Animals Quarantine Station.

2. The premises described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby defined as a Foreign Animals Quarantine Station for the purpose of the landing and detention of the goats under this Order.

Regulations Applicable to the Landing and Detention of the Goats.

3.—(1) The goats shall be transhipped either at Customs House Quay or opposite Tilbury Docks into a lighter and conveyed thence in the lighter to the place of landing at Tilbury Docks. Before being landed from the lighter, the goats shall be examined by a

Veterinary Inspector of the Ministry, and if found by him to be free from symptoms of contagious disease, shall forthwith be landed and moved by float or other suitable vehicle, under the supervision of the Inspector, from the place of landing to the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) The goats shall be detained in the said Quarantine Station until the expiration of a period of at least twenty-eight days after their arrival therein.

(3) Whilst detained in the said Quarantine Station the goats shall be under the control of a Veterinary Inspector appointed by the Ministry.

(4) During such period of detention no other animals shall be moved into the said Quarantine Station, and the animals landed under this Order shall be kept separate from all other animals.

(5) During such period of detention the animals and the Foreign Animals Quarantine Station hereby defined shall be subject to such rules as may be prescribed by the Ministry for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease.

(6) In the event of foot-and-mouth disease or cattle plague being found to exist during the prescribed period of detention in any animal referred to in this Order, the Ministry shall cause to be slaughtered all the animals in the consignment, and in the event of any such disease being suspected to exist in any such animal the Ministry may cause the slaughter of such of the animals as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of diagnosis. No compensation shall be payable by the Ministry in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Order.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks, etc.

4.—(1) Any lighter, float or other vehicle used for the conveyance of goats under this Order shall on every occasion after an animal is taken out of it, and before any other animal or any fodder or litter, or anything intended to be used for or about animals is placed in it, be cleansed and disinfected as follows:—

(i) The deck or floor of the lighter, float or other vehicle, and all other parts thereof with which any such animal or its droppings have come in contact, shall be disinfected in the manner hereinafter prescribed; and thereafter scraped and swept. The scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

(ii) The said parts of the lighter, float or other vehicle shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water.

(iii) The scrapings and sweepings of the lighter, float or other vehicle, and all dung, sawdust, litter and other matter removed therefrom shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime and be effectually removed from contact with animals or be effectually destroyed by fire.

(2) Any lighter, float or other vehicle required to be disinfected under this article shall be thoroughly coated or washed with

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) A four per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than

ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) A disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.
