#### UNIVERSITY OF LONDON.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, and the King's College, London (Transfer), Act, 1908, that the following amendments (a) of No. 108 of the Statutes of the University, (b) of No. 111 of the Statutes of the said University, (c) of No. 12 of the Statutes for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College, and (d) a New Statute (No. 23A) for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College, have been made by the Senate of the University of London, and that copies of the amended Statutes and new Statute can be obtained on application to "The Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7.

(a) No. 108 of the Statutes of the University as amended.

[Note.—The amendment consists in the addition of the words "and Master" between the word "Bachelor" and the words "and Doctor of Laws.'']

108. The following degrees may be granted by the University (that is to say):

(1) Bachelor and Doctor of Divinity;

(2) Bachelor and Master of Arts and Doctor of Literature;

(3) Bachelor and Master and Doctor of Laws;

(4) Bachelor and Doctor of Music; (5) Bachelor and Doctor of Medicine, Bachelor and Master of Surgery, and Bachelor of Dental Surgery;

(6) Bachelor and Master and Doctor of Science;

(7) Bachelor and Master of Commerce;(8) Doctor of Philosophy.

(b) No. 111 of the Statutes of the University as amended.

Note.—The amendment consists in the substitution in the second sentence for the words "Degree of Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the Degree of Master of Science" of the words" Degrees of Doctor of Laws and Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the Degrees of Master of Laws and Master of Science respectively."]

111. Except as hereafter provided, no degree other than an honorary or ad eundem degree shall be conferred on any student who has not satisfied the examiners in the prescribed examination or examinations and fulfilled all other prescribed conditions, and no student shall be allowed to become a candidate for any higher degree who shall not have previously taken the lower degree or degrees of the same class. Provided that students whose qualifications are considered suitable may be admitted by the Senate as candidates for the Degrees of Doctor of Laws and Doctor of Science without their having previously obtained the Degrees of Master of Laws and Master of Science respectively, and students who have obtained the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy in subjects within the purview of the Faculty of Arts may be admitted by the Senate as candidates for the Degree of Doctor of Literature without their having previously obtained the Degree of Master of Arts. vided also that during the war begun in 1914 and after its termination for such period as the Senate shall see fit the Senate shall have power to waive the conditions of this Statute in such a way as will prevent as far as possible any student of the University (whether an honorary (war) degree has been conferred on him by the University or not) from being placed at a disadvantage through going on active service or undertaking other approved duties in connection with national defence, and in particular the Senate may accept such test as the Senate may consider adequate in lieu of the prescribed examinations.

(c) No. 12 of the Statutes for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College, as amended.

[Note.—The amendment consists in the substitution for the words "Principal of the University" of the words "Principal Officer of the University" and the addition where they appear of the words "the Tutor to Women Students."]

12. The Principal Officer of the University, the Principal of the College, the Tutor to Women Students, and the Dean of King's College appointed by the Council under the Statutes made by the Commissioners relating to the Theological Department of King's College, London, if not members of the Delegacy of King's College, shall respectively have the right to attend its meetings and to speak thereat, but not to vote.

(d) New Statute (No. 23A) for the Constitution and Management of University of London, King's College.

23A. The Tutor to Women Students shall be ex-officio a member of the Professorial Board of King's College.

PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS, ENGLAND.

RETURNING OFFICERS' EXPENSES.

TREASURY ORDER, DATED 23RD OCTOBER, 1922; UNDER SECTION 29 OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918 (7 & 8 GEO. 5, C. 64), PRESCRIBING SCALE OF MAXIMUM CHARGES OF RETURNING OFFICERS AT PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby prescribe that the Returning Officer shall be entitled in respect of the conduct of Parliamentary Elections other than University Elections in England and Wales to his reasonable charges not exceeding the sums hereinafter set forth, provided that the charges for disbursements are in no case to exceed the sums actually and necessarily paid or payable.

This scale will be applicable to elections conducted after the date of this Order, subject to any alterations which may from time to time be made.

The following Address was presented to The King by the Committee for the Scottish Memorial to King Edward on the occasion of the unveiling of the Memorial by His Majesty at Edinburgh, on the 10th instant:—

To THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,-

We, Your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the members of the Committee for the Scottish Memorial to King Edward, in our own names and as representing the subscribers, respectfully approach Your Majesty with the request that you will be graciously pleased to unveil this Memorial of your illustrious Father, King Edward.

The movement to erect a Memorial to the late King Edward originated in a meeting representative of the whole of Scotland, which was held in Edinburgh on 24th October, 1910. That meeting unanimously adopted a motion submitted by the Earl of Rosebery to the following effect:—" That this meeting is of opinion that there should be a Scottish Memorial to His late

Majesty, King Edward."

Expressions of opinion were invited as to the form which the Memorial should take, and various proposals were submitted. These were most carefully considered. It was recognised that all of them were put forward with the single-minded desire that the Memorial should take the form best suited to commemorate in a worthy and permanent manner the profound feelings of affection, esteem and admiration which the Scottish people entertained for their late Sovereign.

It was ultimately decided that the Memorial should be in Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland, and should be associated with the Palace of Holyrood—a proposal which we are glad to know received Your Majesty's most cordial approval.

After various schemes had been considered, the Committee resolved that the Memorial should have a two-fold form, viz.: First, the erection of handsome wrought-iron Gates and the completion of the forecourt of the Palace; and, second, the erection within the forecourt of a bronze statue of King Edward.

This scheme was carried out in accordance with plans prepared by an Edinburgh architect, Mr. George Washington Browne, R.S.A. Three sets of gates have been erected at the north and south entrances to the forecourt and also at the Canongate entrance. The forecourt has been completed by panels of wrought iron railing in harmony with the gates.

The statue has been placed so as to face the Palace upon a raised podium enclosed by a semi-circular stone wall. The commission for the statue was entrusted to an Edinburgh sculptor, Mr. Henry Snell Gamley, R.S.A.

The plans of the Memorial were at various stages submitted to Your Majesty, and we gladly recognise and appreciate the great interest and helpful advice and encouragement which Your Majesty has accorded to us in all our labours. We feel sure that the Memorial, while fulfilling its main function of commemorating in an enduring form the memory of King Edward, will be an adornment to this ancient City, and enhance the attractions of the Royal Palace of Holyrood.

It has been a matter of much regret to the Committee that, owing to circumstances arising out of the war, difficulties arose involving delay in the completion of the Memorial, but we rejoice that these difficulties have been overcome, and we trust that the Memorial as now completed will give satisfaction to Your Majesty.

It may be interesting to Your Majesty to know that subscriptions to the Memorial Fund came from all parts of Scotland and from various Scottish Societies and Associations in Your Majesty's Overseas Dominions, the total number of individual subscribers being upwards of 14,000.

We now respectfully ask Your Majesty to do the subscribers the honour of formally unveiling this Memorial to your august Father. We recall with sincere feelings of admiration and pride his illustrious reign; the deep interest which he took in his people's welfare; his sagacity and kindliness of heart; and all his great qualities which endeared him to his Scottish subjects, who will ever cherish his memory.

The KING'S Gracious Reply was as follows:—

The desire expressed that I should unveil this statue of my beloved Father, King Edward, has deeply touched me. On behalf of the Queen and myself I thank you most cordially for the sincere and kindly words of your Address.

The beautiful memorials here erected in honour of my Father will for all time testify to the affection in which he was held by Scotsmen, both in their native land and beyond the seas. It has been a great pleasure to me to be identified with the Committee responsible for the work, and thus to have opportunity of realising the generosity, skill and unsparing toil which have contributed to its completion. Speaking for my dear Mother, Queen

Alexandra, and for myself, I desire to express our deep gratitude to all who have been associated in the initiation and carrying out of this

most successful undertaking.

The years which have passed since King Edward came for the last time to his Scottish home at Holyrood have been pregnant with grave issues, and some of them overshadowed by trials and sorrows enough to daunt the bravest heart. But throughout Scotland has remained unwavering in her devotion to the ideals of sincerity, wisdom, kindliness and courage which he inspired and exemplified.

My Father's life also remains to me as a constant inspiration; and I rejoice that I can count, as he did, upon the sympathetic and willing co-operation of my Scottish People in all that conduces to the advancement and

general well-being of the nation.

The Queen and I are proud that this Memorial should have been erected in your beautiful City, which holds so high a place in the affections of our family, while such a special adornment will intensify those feelings of attachment and veneration with which we ever regard the Palace of Holyrood.

The following Address from the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland was presented to The King on the occasion of the visit of Their Majesties the King and Queen to Edinburgh on the 10th instant.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

REGULATIONS UNDER SECTION 9 (1).

COUNTY OF SOUTHAMPTON.

To the County Council of Southampton;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the power to make such Regulations has been transferred to the Minister of Transport;

And whereas the County Council of Southampton have applied for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of the main Lyndhurst-Southampton Road at Totton:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in pursuance of the powers given to him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of Section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the main Lyndhurst-Southampton Road at Totton as extends from the northern extremity of the Police Station on Redbridge Causeway to the junction of Brokenford Lane and Rumbridge Street.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH OCTOBER 1922.)

MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

### Area Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order it is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.

- 2.—(a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.
- (b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.
- (c) No such animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.
- (d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

### Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

3.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places or his agents or servants may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further Notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such Notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such Notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

#### Control of Dogs and Poultry.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the Notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are to be sent to the Ministry.

# Local Authority to Enforce Order.

5. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

6. Any contravention of this Order or of any Notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLE-SEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.
