Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said section, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Ccuncil to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Any sheriff by whom a jury summons is issued at any time after the thirty-first day of December, 1922, may require the person to whom the summons is issued to furnish to him in writing information with respect to his sex, profession, calling or business.

2. If any person required by a sheriff to furnish information in pursuance of this Order

fails to furnish in writing to the sheriff the required information within three days after the date on which the jury summons is received by him, or furnishes false information, he shall be liable on summary conviction in respect of each offence to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

3. Where a sheriff requires information to be furnished in pursuance of this Order, he shall for the purpose of facilitating the furnishing of the information enclose with the jury summons an officially-stamped postcard on which the information may be given.

4. This Order may be cited as the Jurors (Information as to Professions) Order, 1922.

VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE LEARNERS EMPLOYED IN WEAVING BY ATTACHING A FURTHER CONDITION FOR SECURING THEIR EFFECTIVE INSTRUCTION IN THE TRADE.

Effective as from 1st November, 1922.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 7th November, 1922.

INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

In conformity with the provisions of Section 1 of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, chapter 66, notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for India in Council proposes, with the advice and assistance of the Civil Service Commissioners, at the expiry of the forty (40) days from the date of this Gazette, to make rules, as shown below, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Section 1 of the Indian Civil Service (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1915 (5 and 6 George V., chapter 67).

RULES.

INDIAN CIVIL SERVICE.

Appointments of Surplus Officers of the Indian Army Otherwise than by Open Competitive Examination.

1.—(a) Every candidate must be a British

subject.

(b) If the candidate (being a British subject) or his father or his mother was not born within His Majesty's dominion and allegiance, the father must at the time of the candidate's birth have been a British subject and still be (or have continued to be until his death) a

British subject.

2. Every candidate must have served as a permanent regular commissioned officer in His Majesty's Indian Army and must be an officer falling within the category from which officers are to be selected for retirement as surplus to requirements under the Royal Warrant dated the 25th April, 1922. Surplus officers who have already left India on retirement under the Warrant or who have already accepted other civil employment in India are eligible under this rule provided they are otherwise qualified.

3. Every candidate must have been born on or after the 2nd August, 1892, and on or

before the 1st August, 1900.

4. Every candidate must be of good charac-

ter in civil and military life.

5. Every candidate must submit an application accompanied by the prescribed fee on

the form appended to these rules.

6. Candidates who appear to the Government of India or to the Secretary of State for India from their forms of application to be prima facie eligible for appointment to the Indian Civil Service, and whose candidature has been approved by the Government of India, will be subject to such tests as the Civil Service Commission may prescribe in the way

of (a) a qualifying examination in (1) English (including Essay-writing, Precis-writing and other tests), (2) Arithmetic, and (3) General Knowledge (including matters Historical, Economic, Social, Political, Geographical and Scientific); (b) the production of written evidence, including school record, university record (if any), military record, and personal references; (c) medical examination.

7. Candidates declared successful in the foregoing tests will be required to appear before a Selection Board in London for per-

sonal interview.

8. Candidates recommended by the Civil Service Commissioners will be accepted by the Secretary of State for India in Council up to a number of vacancies offered under these rules as selected candidates for the Indian Civil Service, subject to any further enquiries that he may find it necessary to institute.

that he may find it necessary to institute.

9. Selected candidates will be required to undergo such period of probation as may be hereafter prescribed. At the end of this period of probation they will be tested by the Civil Service Commissioners or by an authority in India specially empowered in this behalf, in Indian Law and Languages, and in any other subjects which may be prescribed, and in riding.

On account of urgency the Secretary of State for India in Council has, under Section 2 of the Statute 56 and 57 Victoria, chapter 66, made the above rules to come into operation forthwith as provisional rules to continue in force until rules have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.

MONMOUTHSHIRE SWINE-FEVER IN-FECTED AREA ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area to which this Order Applies.

1. This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, referred to in this Order as "the Infected Area."

Restriction on Movement of Swine into, out of, or within Infected Area.

2.—(1) The movement of swine into or out of the Infected Area, or along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Infected Area, is prohibited except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local

Authority in accordance with this Order: Provided that this Order shall not affect or prevent the movement of swine through the Infected Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(2) No swine shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Infected Area.

Markets, etc., of Swine in Infected Area to be restricted to Fat Swine only.

3. No market, sale, or exhibition of swine shall be held in any market, fairground, sale-yard or place of exhibition in the Infected Area, unless it is restricted to fat swine intended for immediate slaughter, and then only in accordance with the following conditions, namely:—

(a) A licence shall be obtained from the Local Authority authorising the holding of

the market, sale or exhibition.

(b) All swine exposed at such market, sale or exhibition shall be removed therefrom direct to a slaughterhouse, and shall be accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority specifying the slaughterhouse to which the swine are to be moved.

Licences for Movement of Swine into Infected Area.

- 4. Licences for the movement of swine into the Infected Area may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the swine are to be moved, as follows:—
 - (a) if the place from which the swine are to be moved is situate within the Scheduled Area described in the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922, the licence required under that Order for movement of swine out of the Scheduled Area shall be sufficient to authorise the movement of the swine into the Infected Area;

(b) if the place from which the swine are to be moved is situate outside such Scheduled Area the licence required shall be a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the place from which the pigs are to be moved. No declaration is required to be produced to obtain the licence.

Licences for Movement of Swine within or out of the Infected Area.

5.—(1) Licences may be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, for the following movements of swine from premises within the Infected Area to premises in or outside the Infected Area, viz.:—

From premises in the Infected Area (other than a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition)—

- (a) to a licensed market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area (licence Form C);
- (b) to a slaughterhouse in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C); or
- (c) to private premises in or outside the Infected Area (licence Form A, or, if for breeding purposes, Form C); or

(d) to a vessel direct for shipment or to any premises for detention until shipment (licence Form C).

From a licensed market, sale or exhibition in the Infected Area,—

to a slaughterhouse either within or outside the Infected Area (licence Form C).

(2) Before a licence (Form A) or (Form C) is granted under paragraphs (c) and (d) of this Article the owner of the swine, or his authorised agent shall sign and produce or send to the Inspector a declaration in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order. The Inspector shall retain the declaration, and before granting the licence shall satisfy himself as far as practicable as to the correctness of the statements contained therein. No declaration is required before granting a licence for movement of swine to a licensed market, sale or exhibition, or to a slaughter-house.

Conditions of Movement.

Detention and Isolation at Destination for 28 days of Swine moved with Licence (Form A).

Marking of Swine moved to a slaughterhouse.

6.—(1) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) shall not, for a period of 28 days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved therefrom except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and then only if the swine are marked before the move-

ment commences in the manner described in the next following paragraph of this Article, and are accompanied by a licence (Form C). Swine while detained during the said period of 28 days shall be kept separate from all other swine. This Article does not prohibit the movement of the carcase of a pig slaughtered on the premises during the said period of 28 days.

(2) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to a slaughterhouse, they shall before the movement to the slaughterhouse commences be marked by and at the expense of the owner, by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long, and on arrival at the slaughterhouse the swine shall be detained there until slaughtered.

(3) Swine while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other swine.

Provisions as to Licences.

- 7.—(a) Licences may be granted under this Order only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences
- (b) A movement licence shall not be granted by an Inspector if, in his opinion, it is undesirable to grant it, or for any movement of swine which is prohibited by the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922;

(c) Copies of licences authorising movement into the district of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

- (d) Licences must be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement by the owner or person in charge
- (e) Licences (other than licences—Form C—specifically marked "for Breeding purposes") shall only be available for eight days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement. Licences (Form C) specifically marked "for Breeding purposes" shall be available for 28 days, inclusive of the date thereof. If required for the purpose of service, the swine referred to therein may be moved under the authority of the licence to the same premises either on one or two occasions within the said period of 28 days, and back to the original premises from which it was moved, providing that during the said period the pig so moved is kept separate from all other swine.
- (f) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the swine moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or Constable. and such person shall if required by such officer give his name and address.

Forms.

8. The Licences (Forms A and C) required for use under this Order shall be in the forms set forth in the Second Schedule to the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922. The declaration (Form B) shall be in the form

set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order.

Terms.

9. "Slaughterhouse" includes bacon factory; other terms used in this Order have the same meaning as in the Regulation of Movement of Swine Order of 1922.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

10. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

11. Any contraventions of this Order or of the conditions of any licence issued thereunder, or the making of any false statement in any declaration required thereunder, shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

13. This Order may be cited as the Mon-MOUTHSHIRE SWINE FEVER INFECTED AREA ORDER OF 1922.

MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order

"The Prohibited Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

"The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed

to be within the Controlled Area;
"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and

pigs;
''Slaughterhouse'' means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Area;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;
(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals

shall be held in the Prohibited Area;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse

shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 3.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;
- (b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Article 4:-

i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area except a market or sale for fat animals intende. for immediate slaughter. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such

Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

4. Licences may be granted by an Inspector

of a Local Authority for the following move-

ments of animals only:

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such

Area:

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area to a

slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

5.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences (other than Occupation Licences) shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement:

pany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;

(g) Copies of Licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall if required by such Officer give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

6. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

7.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order

shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

. Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

8.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places or his agents or servants may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such Notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such Notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are

to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

10. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

Provision for movement of animals into extended Prohibited Area for immediate slaughter.

- provisions 2. Notwithstanding \mathbf{the} Article 2 of the Middlesex and District (Footand-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 3) animals may be moved from premises outside the extended Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to which that Order applies to a railway station in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, and thence to a slaughterhouse in the same borough or urban district, subject to the following conditions:-
