FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACT, 1901.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, in pursuance of Section 86 (1) of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, that on the 2nd November, 1922, he made Regulations under Section 79 of the said Act to apply to all factories or parts thereof and to any place to which the provisions of the said section are applied by the Act in which any woodworking machinery is used.

The Regulations, which may be cited as the Woodworking Machinery Regulations, 1922, come into force on 1st January, 1923.
