

ing, and the Benefice of Saint Catherine Coleman, both in the City of London and in the Diocese of London, were united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided, amongst other things, that one, or if we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the Bishop of London so decide, two ecclesiastical districts within the limits of the Metropolis or its vicinity should be selected by the Bishop of London as the District or Districts for which a Church or Churches should be built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales (which have been or are about to be effected) of the materials and site of the Church of Saint Catherine Coleman:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by the Bishop of London as the first District for which a Church shall be built as provided by the said Order in Council:

"And whereas an income of £330 per annum or thereabouts will be available under the provisions of the said Order in Council for the endowment of the said proposed Church and District, and such income will be payable to the Minister or Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the Parish of Hammersmith, in the said County of Middlesex and in the said Diocese of London, have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £70 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £70 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas it is provided by the said Order in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District shall be vested in the Bishop of London for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Catherine, North Hammersmith,' and that the said District shall be endowed in the manner which is contemplated

by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 11th day of October, 1921.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said lastly mentioned Order of Your Majesty in Council, be vested in and exercised by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or to any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Catherine, North Hammersmith, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the east and upon the north by the District Parish of Saint Stephen, Hammersmith, in the said County and Diocese, upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Dunstan, East Acton, and partly by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Thomas, Acton Vale, from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, crosses the middle of the western end of Steventon Road where such road meets Old Oak Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Steventon Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wormholt Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wormholt Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Yew Tree Road and Bryony Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Bryony Road and along a line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 23 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Hammersmith, from the said District Parish of Saint Stephen, Hammersmith."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron has signified his assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the Incumbent of the said New Parish has offered certain objections to the said Scheme:

And whereas a period of more than one calendar month has elapsed since the transmission of such drafts as aforesaid:

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order
