

covites, who by their being possessed of *Asaph*, have an opportunity to give the Turks much disturbance on that side.

Vienna, March 23. The Emperor gave the last week the Investiture of the Dutchy of *Gustraw* to the Deputies of the Duke of *Mecklenburg Swerin*, who had an Audience of his Imperial Majesty for this purpose; Though it seems the said Duke is not yet in possession of this Country, by reason of some Dispute between him and the Directors of the Circle of the *Lower-Saxony*. A great many Vessels are sent from hence laden with Provisions and Ammunition for the Use of the Imperial Army in *Hungary*; and the *Sieur d'Asserberg*, who commands the Emperor's Fleet on the *Danube*, uses great diligence in fitting out the Gallies that are to be employed in this Service. They write from *Hungary*, that the Germans are making several new Works at *Peter-Waradin*, as also at *Esecke*, which will add very much to the Security of those Frontier Places; and from *Croatia* we are told, that the Ban or Governor was forming the Militia of that Province into a Body, which may be very serviceable against the Enemy.

Dublin, March 28. Letters from *Kinsale* of the 23d Instant advise, that the *Greenfish* Store-ship was arrived there laden with Timber and Plank from *Wexford*, under Convoy of His Majesty's Ship the *Linne*, Capt. *Townsend* Commander; And the *John* Transport Ship was come into that Port from *Plimouth*.

Newcastle, April 2. The Laden Fleet of Colliers, with the Men of War their Convoys, are detained here by the contrary Winds.

Falmouth, April 3. On the 30th of the last month sailed hence the *Spanish-Alliance* Pacquet-Boat for the *Groyne*. The 31th past sailed by this place a Fleet of about 70 Sail bound to *Bristol* and other Places, under Convoy of His Majesty's Ship the *Chester*, who were joined by the *Pennance* Man of War and 12 Merchant Ships, from this Port. The same day came in the *St. John Baptist* in 4 days from *Bilboa*, where she left several English Merchant Ships waiting for the English Convoy.

Plimouth, April 4. On the 31th past came in the *Half-Moon* of *Calmar* from *Amsterdam*; and the *Hope* of *Zericksea* bound to *Corke*. This day sailed hence His Majesty's Ship *Faversham*, with several Merchant Vessels for *Dublin*.

Deale, April 5. His Majesty's Ships *Burlington*, *Canterbury*, *Coventry*, *Romney*, *Rocheater*, and *Litchfield*, sailed out of the *Downes* on the 3d Instant to the Westward.
