PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section one of the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, it is provided that the Articles of Agreement set forth in the Schedule to that Act shall have the force of law, and that for the purpose of giving effect to Article 17 of the said Agreement Orders in Council may be made transferring to the Provisional Government established under that Article the powers and machinery therein referred to, and that any Order in Council made under that section may contain such incidental, consequential and supplemental provisions as may appear to be necessary or proper for the purpose of giving effect to the foregoing provisions of that section:

And whereas by Article 12 of the Provisional Government (Transfer of Functions) Order, 1922, being an Order in Council made under the said section and hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order, provision is made for the transfer and apportionment of property, assets, rights and liabilities connected with the functions transferred under the Principal Order:

And whereas it is necessary to make provision for carrying out the transfers and appor-

tionments made in pursuance of the said Article:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Where a transfer, assurance or other instrument required to be executed for the purpose of transferring any securities, property or rights vested in the Local Government Board for Ireland or in any public officer by his official description whose office has ceased to exist, in order to give effect to any transfer or apportionment of property, assets, rights or liabilities pursuant to Article 12 of the Principal Order, the instrument shall be deemed to be duly executed by and on behalf of such department or officer if executed by any person appointed for the purpose by the Treasury. A certificate of the Treasury that the instrument requires to be executed for the purpose aforesaid or of the appointment of a person as aforesaid shall be sufficient evidence of the facts certified.

In this Article the expression " securities " includes stocks, funds, shares and annuities, whether transferable by deed or in books kept by a company or society, and any dividend or interest on securities which is due at the time of the transfer but is then unpaid may be paid in accordance with directions given by the Treasury.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the

Provisional Government (Execution of Documents) Order, 1922.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

DANGEROUS DRUGS.

Order, Dated 24th November, 1922, Made by the Secretary of State, under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5, c. 46), Revoking the Authority Granted to Certain

Persons Not Registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, to Purchase Preparations Containing Not More Than One Per Cent. of Cocaine for Use as Local Anæsthetics in Dentistry.

In pursuance of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, I hereby revoke as from the 30th November, 1922, the authority, granted on the 13th August, 1921, to persons who are bonâ fidê engaged in dentistry, and were so engaged on the 28th July, 1916, but are not registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, to purchase preparations containing not more than one per cent. of cocaine for use as local anæsthetics in dentistry.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations have been approved by the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR SITUATIONS IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE AS MALE ASSISTANT SUPERINTENDENT OF TRAFFIC (CLASS III) IN THE LONDON TELEPHONE SERVICE, AND MALE ASSISTANT TRAFFIC SUPERINTENDENT IN THE PROVINCES.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this Examination are 18 and 22. In reckoning age, candidates who have served in the Navy, Army or Air Force between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918, may deduct from their actual age any period of service between 4th August, 1914, and 31st December, 1919. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. A candidate must be a natural-born British subject and the son of a father also a natural-born British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception as to the father may be made in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the Examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the Examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service and apprentices in H.M. Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

5. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. English.
2. General Knowledge.
3. Mathematics.

4. Electricity.
5. Telegraphy and Telephony.
6. Personal Qualities.

The Examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the Examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part, a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the Examination.
