The road from the Welshpool-Newtown main road near Cil-Gwrgan *via* Aber-Bechan and Bettws-Cedewain to the road junction at Titebarn Cottages near Tregynon.

The road from the road junction at Titebarn Cottages near Tregynon *via* Highgate to Commercial Street, Newtown.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST DECEMBER 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

An Inspector of the Ministry may by notice, signed by him and served on the master of the steamship "Georgette," prohibit the landing from that vessel at any port or place in Great Britain, of any feeding stuffs for animals, dung, litter, fittings, pens, hurdles, utensils or other things which may in the opinion of the Inspector be the means of introducing disease into Great Britain. The Inspector may also require by notice so served the disinfection and cleansing of the vessel or any part thereof

specified in the notice, in such manner as he may prescribe.
