A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS the House of the Parliament constituted pursuant to the Irish Free State (Agreement) Act, 1922, sitting as a Constituent Assembly for the settlement of the Constitution of the Irish Free State, have passed a Measure (hereinafter referred to as "the Constituent Act") whereby the Constitution appearing as the First Schedule to the

Constituent Act is declared to be the Constitution of the Irish Free State:

AND WHEREAS by the Constituent Act the said Constitution is made subject to the following provisions, namely:—

"The said Constitution shall be construed with reference to the Articles of Agreement for a Treaty between Great Britain and Ireland set forth in the Second Schedule hereto annexed (hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled Treaty) which are hereby given the force of law, and if any provision of the said Constitution or of any amendment thereof or of any law made thereunder is in any respect repugnant to any of the provisions of the Scheduled Treaty, it shall, to the extent only of such repugnancy, be absolutely void and inoperative and the Parliament and the Executive Council of the Irish Free State shall respectively pass such further legislation and do all such other things as may be necessary to implement the Scheduled Treaty."

AND WHEREAS by Article 83 of the said Constitution it is provided that the passing and adoption of the said Constitution by the Constituent Assembly and Parliament shall be announced as soon as may be, and not later than the Sixth day of December, 1922, by Our Royal Proclamation:

AND WHEREAS by the Irish Free State Constitution Act, 1922, it is enacted that the said Constitution shall, subject to the provisions to which the same is by the Constituent Act so

made subject as aforesaid, be the Constitution of the Irish Free State, and shall come into operation on the same being proclaimed by Us in accordance with the said Article 83 of the said Constitution:

Now, THEREFORE, WE, to the intent that the said Constitution shall come into operation forthwith, do hereby announce and proclaim that the Constitution of the Irish Free State as the same was passed and adopted by the said Constituent Assembly has been passed and adopted by Parliament.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this Sixth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-two, and in the Thirteenth Year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 1st day of December, 1922 (N. 12192/22), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas We have had under consideration the promulgation of certain Regulations for the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"And whereas certain of those Regulations relate to pay, wages, bounty money or allowances in the nature thereof payable to members of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve in respect of services in Your Majesty's Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction such of the aforesaid Regulations as relate to pay, wages, bounty money, or allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Navy.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, His Majesty is empowered by Order in Council to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the said Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the said Act, and in particular His Majesty is empowered amongst other things, by any such Order in Council, to make such adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to Ireland as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the said Act; and also to make any adaptations of any enactments so far as they relate to England or Scotland as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Election Laws Adaptation) (Northern Ireland) Order, 1922.

(2) In this Order the expression "appointed day" means the day appointed as respects Northern Ireland for the purposes of the provisions of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, relating to the representation of Ireland in the House of Commons of the United Kingdom; the expression "House of Commons" means that House of Commons, and the expression "laws" includes orders, rules and regulations.

(3) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the inter-

pretation of an Act of Parliament.

2.—(1) From and after the appointed day the election laws (other than those relating to the registration of electors or to the creation of polling districts), in their application to electors and elections of members to serve in the House of Commons for constituencies in Northern Ireland shall have effect, subject to the modifications and adaptations set out in this Order, save where inconsistent with the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, or the provisions of any subsequent Order in Council under that Act, and subject as respect matters within the powers of the Parliament of Northern Ireland to repeal or alteration by Acts of that Parliament.

(2) Subject to the express adaptations and modifications made by this Order, the General Adaptation of Enactments (Northern Ireland) Order, 1921, and any other Order made under the said Act containing adaptations of general application shall, if and so far as they are applicable to the enactments adapted by this Order, apply thereto in like manner as to other enactments.

- 3.—(1) In the application of the election laws to elections of members to serve in the House of Commons for constituencies in Northern Ireland—
 - (a) references to constituencies shall be construed as references to constituencies named in Part II. of the Fifth Schedule to the Government of Ireland Act, 1920;

(b) references to parliamentary counties shall be construed as references to county constituencies named in Part II. of the said Schedule, whether consisting of one or more counties or of a county and a borough; and references to divisions of a parliamentary county shall not apply;

(c) references to parliamentary boroughs shall be construed as referring to the borough of Belfast; and references to divisions of a borough shall be construed as referring to the constituencies in the borough of Belfast which are named in

Part II. of the said Schedule;

(d) references to the Dublin Gazette shall be construed as references to the Belfast Gazette.

- (2) For the purposes of an election of members to serve in the House of Commons for any county constituency named in Part II. of the Fifth Schedule to the Government of Ireland Act, 1920—
 - (a) if the constituency consists of a single county, the under sheriff of the county shall be the returning officer;
 - (b) if the constituency consists of two counties or of a county and a borough, such one of the under sheriffs of the said counties or of the said county and borough as may be nominated by the Lord Lieutenant shall be the returning officer, but either of the other under sheriffs shall, if he so desires, be appointed by the returning officer to act in his behalf as assistant returning officer for the purpose of the execution of any powers and duties in the part of the constituency within the jurisdiction of such under sheriff, other than powers and duties which require to be executed by the returning officer in person, and any question as to the respective rights and obligations of any such returning officer or under sheriff under this provision shall be determined by the Lord Lieutenant whose determination shall be final; and
 - (c) in the case of any constituency to which either of the foregoing paragraphs applies, the place of election shall be such place as may be fixed by the returning officer with the approval of the Lord Lieutenant.
- (3) Where an election is held for any constituency before the coming into force of the register the preparation of which is com-menced next after the appointed day, the registers for the several areas comprised in the constituency which were at the time of the passing of the Government of Ireland Act, ,1920, separate constituencies (hereinafter referred to as old constituencies) shall together form the register for the constituency, and a separate letter or symbol shall be assigned by the returning officer to each of the old constituencies and shall, in the case of each elector or voter on the register for the old constituency, be deemed to form part of the number of the elector or voter which is required by section two of and rule 24 in Part I. of the First Schedule to the Ballot Act, 1872, to be

marked on the counterfoil of the ballot paper, and that section and that rule, as amended by or in pursuance of any subsequent enactments, shall have effect accordingly.

4. Sub-section (3) of the last preceding article shall apply as respects elections of members to serve in the House of Commons of Northern Ireland in like manner as it applies as respects elections of members to serve in the House of Commons.

The Schedule to the County Courts Order in Council, 1904 (S.R. & O., 1904, No. 1784), as amended by the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1919 (S.R. & O., 1919, No. 2039), the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1920 (S.R. & O., 1920, No. 823), and the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1921 (S.R. & O., 1921, No. 1800), shall be further amended as follows:—
 - (i) In Circuit 29, (a) Circuit No. 29 is removed from the first column of the said Schedule, (b) Bangor, Rhyl and Conway are removed from the second column thereof, and (c) Llangefni, Holyhead, Menai Bridge, Denbigh, Ruthin and Llanrwst are removed from the third column thereof.
 - (ii) In Circuit 52 Midsomer Norton and Temple Cloud are removed from the third column of the said Schedule.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the County Courts (Extended Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1922, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1923, and the County Courts Order in Council, 1904, as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

Easton, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Woodcott, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Southampton and in the

Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edward, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Ashmansworth, Crux Easton, and Woodcott duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Winchester embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ashmansworth and Crux Easton are now full, the Reverend Arthur Rowand being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Bene-

fice of Woodcott is at present vacant:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ashmansworth, and such house will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice:

- "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edward, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
- "1. That the said Benefice of Ashmansworth, the said Benefice of Crux Easton, and the said Benefice of Woodcott shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashmansworth with Crux Easton and Woodcott,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Arthur Rowand, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Ashmansworth and Crux Easton, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "3. That with the consent of Captain Geoffrey de Havilland now Patron of the said Benefice of Crux Easton (testified by his signing this Scheme), after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in each series of four successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Ashmansworth shall have the first, the second and the third turns, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Woodcott shall have the fourth turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Winchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the

said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Washford Pyne and Puddington is now full, the Reverend Charles James Eckett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Washford Pyne, and the Reverend Edward Hugh Hammond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Puddington:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William, Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your

Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Washford Pyne and the said Benefice of Puddington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Washford Pyne with Puddington,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Owermoigne to part of the neighbouring Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Warmwell with Poxwell and the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell to the neighbouring Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Osmington all which Benefices are situate in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Frederic Edward, late Bishop of Salisbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Owermoigne with a portion of the said Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell and further to inquire into and report upon an union of the said Benefice of Osmington with the remaining portion of the said Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell duly made their Report to the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, now Bishop of Salisbury, and therein recommended the severance of the Benefice of Poxwell from the said United Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell and the union of the said Benefice of Poxwell so severed with the neighbouring Benefice of Osmington and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell with the neighbouring Benefice of Owermoigne and the terms for effecting the said two unions and the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the two unions of Benefices so recommended as aforesaid which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said

And whereas all of the said Benefices of Owermoigne, Warmwell with Poxwell and Osmington are now full, the Reverend William Rhydderch being the present Incumbent of the Benefice of Owermorgne, the Reverend Robert Jocelyn Pickard Cambridge being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell, and the Reverend Jasper Mead being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Osmington:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop or Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

say:—
"1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell, that is to say, the Benefice of Poxwell shall be severed from the said United Benefice of Warmwell and Poxwell and the Benefice of Poxwell so severed and the said Benefice of Osmington shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Osmington with Poxwell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Warmwell with Poxwell after the severance of such portion as aforesaid and the said Benefice of Owermoigne shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Owermoigne with Warmwell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue

distinct in all respects.

"3.—(a) That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme all of the said three Benefices shall be vacant, then both the aforesaid unions shall forthwith take effect: but if upon that day all of the said three Benefices shall not be vacant, then the said two unions shall take effect upon the day of the vacation by an Incumbent holding at the date of such publication in the London Gazette that one of the three Benefices which shall last be vacated by any such Incumbent after such date of publication.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Application of Order and Meaning of Terms.

1. This Order applies to the Controlled Area described in the Schedule. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area; "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and

pigs,
"Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

- 2.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;
- (b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Article 3-
 - (i) into the Controlled Area; or
 - (ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled
- (c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled
- (d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area, except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. Movement of Animals by Licence into or within the Controlled Area.

3. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:-

(a) From premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area to

a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

4.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose district the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement out of the Controlled Area in order to reach a

destination in the Controlled Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other thanOccupation Licences, must be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

Occupation (e) Licences, other $_{
m than}$ Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

5. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Controlled Area if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

6.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such

animals shall be marked as follows:-

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter, and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep .- A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

7. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

8. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

9. The Middlesex, Surrey and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922, and the Middlesex, Surrey and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 3) are hereby revoked, but any notice served under those Orders shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been with-

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order-

"The Prohibited Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

"The Controlled Area" means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby con-

The Prohibited Area and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Con-trolled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;
"Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats and

pigs;
"Slaughterhouse" means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Area.

2. (a) No animals shall be moved into or

out of the Prohibited Area;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Area, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals

shall be held in the Prohibited Area;

No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to which this Order applies to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Area, subject to the following conditions:-

(i) A licence authorizing the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;
- (e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such

Movement of Animals by Licence Into or Within the Controlled Area.

- 5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:-
 - (a) From premises outside the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;
 - (b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area:

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

6. (a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local

Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

- (b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Area, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;
- (c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;
- (d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;
- (e) Licences, other Occupation than Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;
- (f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;
- (g) Copies of Licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;
- (h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Area or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Area, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

- (b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

- (2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed:
- (3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

10.-(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;
(2) Copies of such notices, when served, are

to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.
