"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter

"And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of London as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should

be assigned:
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Alban, Golder's Green.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Alban, Golder's Green, being:-

" All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the south-east by the New Parish of Christ Church, Hampstead, upon the east by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Finchley, upon the north by the District Chapelry of Saint Jude, Hampstead Garden Suburb, upon the north-west and upon the west by the District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Golder's Green, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the southwest and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said District Chapelry of Saint Michael, Golder's Green, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon, crosses the middle of the road called The Ridgway, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of The Ridgway for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hodford Road, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Hodford Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Dunstan Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Dunstan Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Finchley Road and West Heath Avenue, and extending thence eastward along the middle of West Heath Avenue for a distance of 112 chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the entrance to Golder's Hill Park, where such road turns northward, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of the roadway leading into Golder's Hill Park for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the paths leading across the said park diverge from such roadway, and extending thence in a straight line due east-south-east across the said park for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Child's Hill, Hendon, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Hamp-

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the New Parish out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
