A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.I

W HEREAS under the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to direct the establishment of any branch of the Mint in any British Possession, and to impose a charge for the coinage of gold thereat, and determine the application of such charge, the extent to which the branch Mint is to be deemed part of the Mint, and the extent to which coins issued therefrom are to be current and to be a legal tender and to be deemed to be issued from the Mint:

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891, and of a proclamation made under those Acts on the twenty-third day of January, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, it is lawful for Us, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to regulate in the Union of South Africa any matters relative to the coinage and the Mint within the then present Prerogative of the Crown which are not provided for by the Coinage Act, 1870:

AND WHEREAS the Government of the Union of South Africa (in this Proclamation referred to as "the Union") has applied for the establishment of a branch of the Mint at Pretoria in the Province of the Transvaal, and provision

has been made by the Parliament of the Union for an annual grant of forty thousand pounds to defray the expenses of the branch Mint:

WE, THEREFORE, in pursuance of the said Acts and the said proclamation made thereunder, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. A branch of the Mint (in this Proclamation referred to as "the Pretoria Branch Mint") shall be established at or near Pretoria on such site as the Governor-General in Council may approve.

2. Gold coins of the same denominations, designs, weights and fineness as gold coins coined at the Mint may be coined at the Pretoria Branch Mint, and any gold coins so coined (in this Proclamation referred to as "sterling gold coins") shall be subject to the allowance of the same remedy as gold coins coined at the Mint.

3. The Master of the Mint shall prepare and transmit such dies as may be required for the sterling gold coins to be coined at the Pretoria Branch Mint.

4. The sterling gold coins coined in pursuance of this Proclamation at the Pretoria Branch Mint shall be deemed to have been issued from the Mint, and shall be current and a legal tender in like manner and to like extent as if they had been coined and issued in England.

5.—(1) If any person brings to the Pretoria

Branch Mint any gold bullion and requires the Deputy Master of the Branch Mint to assay, coin into sterling gold coins, and deliver out to him the same, the Deputy Master shall comply with the requisition on payment for every ounce troy of gold of standard fineness of a charge of three halfpence where the amount brought at any one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and of a penny in any other case:

Provided that-

(a) Where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout without refining the whole or some portion of it, the Deputy Master shall demand for assaying and refining the same such additional charge as the Governor-General in Council may from time to time fix, and until such charge is paid to him may refuse to receive, assay or coin that bullion; and

(b) Where the bullion brought to the Branch Mint for coinage is finer than the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout, there shall be delivered to the person bringing the same such additional amount of coin as is proportionate to that

superior fineness; and

(c) No undue preference shall be shown to any person as respects the bullion brought to the Branch Mint, and every person shall have priority according to the time at which he brought the bullion to the Branch Mint; and

- (d) The Governor-General in Council may make regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of this Article with respect to gold bullion, and the bringing, coining and delivery out thereof, and in particular for regulating the times and conditions at and under which it is to be so brought, assayed, coined and delivered out, and the minimum amount which may be so brought.
- (2) The charges under this Article for coining, assaying and refining shall be collected by the Deputy Master of the Branch Mint in accordance with the regulations made under this Article, either as a payment in advance or as a deduction from the coin delivered out, or otherwise, and shall be accounted for and paid over in such manner as the Governor-General in Council directs to the Minister of Finance of the Union, to be paid by him into the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Union.
- 6. Subject to the provisions of this Proclamation, the Pretoria Branch Mint shall be deemed to be part of the Mint, and accordingly-
  - (a) The Deputy Master of the Branch Mint shall comply with all directions which he may receive from the Master of the Mint, whether as regards the returns to be made or the delivery of coin for public use, or the transmission of specimen sterling gold coins to England, and otherwise; and

(b) The said specimen sterling gold coins shall be subject to trial of the pyx under section twelve of the Coinage Act, 1870, so, however, that they shall be examined separately from the coins coined in England or at any Branch Mint other than the

Pretoria Branch Mint; and

(c) The Deputy Master of the Branch Mint and other officers and persons for the purpose of carrying on the business of the

Branch Mint may be appointed, promoted, suspended and removed, and their duties assigned and salaries awarded under section fifteen of the Coinage Act, 1870.

7. Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prevent the coining at the Pretoria Branch Mint of any coins of whatever metal which the Minister of Finance of the Union has power under or by virtue of any Act of the Union for the time being in force to be caused to be made and issued for circulation in the Union, or of any other coins of whatever metal which the Governor-General in Council may from time to time authorise to be coined at the Pretoria Branch Mint:

Provided that-

(a) Coins, other than sterling gold coins, coined at the Pretoria Branch Mint shall not, for the purposes of the Coinage Act, 1870, or for the purposes of any Order in Council or Proclamation relating to the coinage of any part of Our Dominions, be deemed to be coins made at, or issued from, the Mint, or to be coins coined under the direction of the Master of the Mint; and

(b) The coining of such other coins shall be carried out subject to and in accordance with such regulations and conditions as may be made and imposed by the Master of the

Mint.

8. The Governor-General in Council shall cause the store of bullion and coin at the Pretoria Branch Mint to be inspected halfyearly, and shall cause the persons inspecting the same to report thereon to the Deputy Master of the Branch Mint, stating the exact amount of bullion and coin inspected by them, and copies of the report shall be transmitted by the Deputy Master to the Governor-General and to the Master of the Mint in London.

9. The Master of the Mint shall in the execution of this Proclamation act in accordance with any Regulations made or directions given by the Lords Commissioners of Our

Treasury.

10. In this Proclamation-

The expression "the Mint" means Our

Royal Mint in England;
The expression "Deputy Master of the Branch Mint" includes any person who lawfully exercises at the Pretoria Branch

Mint the authority of Deputy Master; The expression "Governor-General" means the Governor-General of the Union and includes the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Union. 11.—(1) This Proclamation may be cited as the Pretoria Mint Proclamation, 1922.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1899, applies to the construction of this Proclamation as it applies to the construction of an Act of

Parliament.

(3) This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, unless it is sooner promulgated in the Union, and in that case shall come into force on being so promulgated.

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be  $\pounds 50,000,000$ . The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

# TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 They will be dated at the option or £10,000. of the Tenderer on any business day from Wednesday, the 27th December, 1922, to Saturday, the 30th December, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

# MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, dated 8th December, 1922, together with the Minimum Rates for Male Workers (as set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice O.F. (2) dated 30th June, 1921) which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation, and takes the place of the Board's Notice O.F. (2) dated 30th June, 1921.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:-

(1) For Male Workers ... ... As from 4th July, 1921. (2) For Female Workers ... ... As from 1st January, 1923.\*

<sup>\*</sup> Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 7th January, 1923.

Male workers commencing employment in the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of six months at 7d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 83d. per hour. On the expiration of one year's employment at the trade, these workers shall receive the rates applicable to their ages as set out above.

#### PART II.

### PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

SECTION I.—FEMALE WORKERS—

(a) All Female Workers other than Homeworkers, 8d. per hour.

(b) Homeworkers, 8d. per hour.

In the case of all female workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of the class in question of ordinary skill and experience.

SECTION II.—MALE WORKERS (Except workers employed as Dyers in the Feather Trade)—

All Male Workers, 1s. 3½d. per hour.

In the case of all male workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 3½d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of the class in question of ordinary skill and experience.

# PART III.

# OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the Normal Number of Hours of Work in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day (other than Saturday), 9. On Saturday, 5.

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be 5, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be 9.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

# (A) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:

- 1. For the first two hours of overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-anda-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- 2. For overtime after the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime rate shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- 3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, DOUBLE-TIME.
- 4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section. The Overtime Rate shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or, in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

# (B) FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:

Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime

worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, a sum equivalent to one-quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time Rate, one-half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

- (a) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.
- (b) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall only be payable after 50 hours have been worked.
- (c) That where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

#### PART IV.

For the purpose of this Notice
SECTION I.—A FEMALE LEARNER is a
worker who—

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V of this Schedule by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facili-

tiees for such learning; and

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—A "HOMEWORKER" is a worker who works in her own home or any

other place not under the control or management of the employer.

# PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Workers (except Male Workers employed as Dyers in the Feather Trade), in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

1. The preparation throughout of ostrich or fancy feathers from the natural condition to the finished feather product.

2. The making of artificial flowers, fruit, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods from paper, wax, textile materials, porcelain, glass, plaster, metal composition, rubber, leather, raffia, celiphane and similar materials.

3. The preservation of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses. ferns. seeds or pods.

4. The making of hats of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.

5. The making of feather garments (including neckwear and muffs), feather trimmings for dresses, feather fans or feather mountings of any description, when made in or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of ostrich or fancy feathers.

6. The cleaning, dyeing or renovating of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1. 2 and 3 above, when carried on as a main business or in association with or in conjunction with any business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in those paragraphs.

# Including: -

- 7. (a) Any of the following and similar operations or processes known in the trade as:—
  - (i) The sorting, stringing, washing, bleaching, dyeing, beating, scraping, laying up, sewing, curling, finishing, sticking, twisting, mounting of ostrich or fancy feathers.

(ii) Pattern-making, dyeing, stiffening, waterproofing, waxing, cutting, stamping, shading, veining, goffing, mould making, mounting, in connection with the manufacture of artificial flowers, fruits, foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods.

foliage, grasses, mosses, seeds or pods.

(iii) The dyeing, preserving, painting, varnishing, or decorating of natural flowers, foliage, grasses, mosses, ferns, seeds or pods.

(b) The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above by needlework processes, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in

any of the operations specified in that paragraph.

- (c) The making or mounting of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for cakes or cracker ornaments, except when made or mounted in, or in association with, or in conjunction with, an establishment or business or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the making of crackers.
- (d) The mounting (whether singly or in festoons or garlands) or assembling of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above for the purpose of decoration when mounted or assembled in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in these operations.
- (e) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations, in regard to any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1 to 5 above, when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in any of the operations specified in paragraphs 1 to 6 above.

# But excluding:

- 8. (a) The making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom which is mainly engaged in the manufacture of the materials specified in that paragraph, and not of the articles therein specified. ...
- (b) The preparation, making, or preservation of any of the articles specified in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 above, when carried out in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of stationers' sundries.
- (c) The stiffening or preparation of textile materials for the making of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above, when carried on in a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the preparation of textile materials for other purposes.
- (d) The making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2 above wholly from metal, or the mounting thereof when so made, or the making or mounting of plaster flowers, fruits, or foliage, except when made or mounted:—

- (i) For funeral tokens, wreaths, or crosses.
- (ii) In association with, or in conjunction with the making of any of the articles specified in paragraph 2, from any of the materials specified therein.
- (iii) For cake or cracker ornaments as specifically mentioned in the operations and processes included in the trade.
- (e) The making from rubber of any of the articles mentioned in paragraph 2 above or the mounting thereof when so made, where carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with a business or establishment or branch or department or workroom mainly engaged in the manufacture of other rubber articles.
- (f) All operations covered by the following orders:—
  - (i) The Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order, 1913.
  - (ii) The Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919.
  - (iii) The Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919.
  - (iv) The Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920.

#### PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

# PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated the 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates for Male Workers, set out in the Schedule to their Notice O.F. (4) dated 15th December, 1922, and effective under an Order of the Minister

of Labour, dated 28th June, 1921, so that in lieu of such Minimum Rates of Wages the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate and Overtime Rates for Male Workers shall be as shown in the Schedule set out below.

Workers commencing employment in the Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower Trade for the first time at and over the age of 19 may serve a period of 6 months at 6d. per hour, and thereafter a period of six months at 7d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's service in the trade, these workers shall receive such rates as

their age may entitle them to under the foregoing provisions.

# PART II. PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE.

In the case of all male workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 1½d. per hour to an ORDINARY WORKER, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

# PART III. OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Notice O.F. (4) issued by the Trade Board, dated 15th December, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above-mentioned Notice O.F. (4) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

### PART IV.

# APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers (excepting Workers employed as Dyers in the Feather Trade) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Ostrich and Fancy Feather and Artificial Flower) Order, 1920, as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Notice O.F. (4) issued by the Trade Board and dated 15th December, 1922.
