"4. Chief Enginemen and Enginemen enrolled in the Royal Naval Reserve before the 1st April, 1921, to continue to be paid, when undergoing training or called up for actual service during the period of their current enrolment, at the rates of 9s. 5d. and 8s. 5d. per diem respectively."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

In sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (xvii) of Article 1 of the principal Order, after the words "and shall" there shall be inserted the words "whether any particulars have already been furnished or not," after the words "such particulars" there shall be inserted the words "or further particulars," for the word "thereto" there shall be substituted the words "to any property right or interest subject to the charge of which the Custodian has notice, whether in accordance with this paragraph, the Trading with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to

1918, or otherwise," and after the words "Custodian may" there shall be inserted the words "from time to time."

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (cccc) of paragraph (xvii) of Article 1 of the principal Order:—

"(cccc). The provisions of sub-sections (3) and (4) of section four and of section eight of the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Act, 1916, shall apply to the transfer by the Custodian of shares, stock or other securities of which he is the registered proprietor in pursuance of paragraph (c), as if such shares, stock or securities were securities belonging to an enemy or enemy subject in respect of which a vesting Order under the Trading with the Enemy Acts, 1914 to 1918, had been made."

3. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace Order (Amendment) Order, 1922, and shall be included amongst the Orders which may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1922.

Provided nevertheless that such last-mentioned Schedule shall continue in full force and effect with regard to any British Protectorate included therein but not included in the second Schedule to this Order.

And whereas by the said section it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty in Council may revoke any such Order when it appears that the law of the British possession has been so altered that it would not authorize the making of an Order under that section:

And whereas on the 31st day of May, 1910, the Union of South Africa was established under the provisions of an Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of His late Majesty's reign shortly entitled "The South Africa Act, 1909," and the Colony of Natal is now a Province forming part of the Union established as aforesaid:

And whereas by an Act passed by the Parliament of the Union of South Africa and entitled the Death Duties Act, 1922, which came into operation on the 1st day of July, 1922, the law of Natal has been so altered as aforesaid, and it is expedient to revoke the said Order in Council so far as concerns its application to Natal:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the power by the Finance Act, 1894, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Order of the 16th day of July, 1895, which apply the twentieth section of the Finance Act, 1894, to the Colony of Natal are hereby revoked.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have commenced and come into operation with regard to the estates of all persons dying on or after the 1st day of July, 1922.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union

of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Christ Church, Bradford, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Thomas, Bradford, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Christ Church, Bradford, and Saint Thomas, Bradford, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bradford, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bradford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Christ Church, Bradford, and Saint Thomas, Bradford, is now full, the Reverend Reginald Guy Frushard Waddington being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, and the Reverend Cornelius Briggs being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, now belongs to the Vicar for the time being of the Vicarage of the Parish of Bradford, and the Venerable William Stanton Jones is now the Vicar of the said Vicarage of the Parish of Bradford:

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, now belongs to the said Arthur, Bishop of Bradford, and his successors Bishops of Bradford:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur, Bishop of Bradford, and of the said William Stanton Jones (in testimony whereof they have hereunto set their hands), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, and the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Christ Church with Saint Thomas, Bradford' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Christ Church, Bradford, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other

of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, and the then Incumbent of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, shall have been instituted to Christ Church, Bradford, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice: but if he shall have been instituted to Christ Church, Bradford, before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Christ Church, Bradford, following such avoidance of the Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, and the then Incumbent of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present and nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised jointly by the Patrons of the said two Benefices.

" 7. That upon the said union taking effect a portion amounting to £140 per annum of the yearly sum or stipend of £250 per annum at present payable by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, shall be excepted out of the said union and shall be transferred and annexed to the Benefices and in the shares hereinafter mentioned as additions to the endowments thereof all of which Benefices are situate in the said Diocese of Bradford, namely a yearly sum or stipend of £40 to the Benefice of Saint Mary Magdalene, Manningham, a yearly sum or stipend of £40 to the Benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, a yearly sum or stipend of £30 to the Benefice of Saint Luke, Bradford, and a yearly sum or stipend of £30 to the Benefice of Saint Bartholomew, Bowling.

" Provided always that in the event of the said Benefice of Saint Thomas, Bradford, being avoided by the present Vicar or Incumbent thereof by retirement under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts

and a pension under those Acts being awarded to him the said transfer shall take effect upon the cessation of such pension.

" Provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bradford, has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme are both situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

fices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ingoldmells, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Addlethorpe, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln, and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ingoldmells, and Addlethorpe, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ingoldmells and Addlethorpe are now full, the Reverend Thomas Towers being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Thomas Towers has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ingoldmells and the said Benefice of Addlethorpe shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ingoldmells with Addlethorpe' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Thomas Towers if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefices of Ingoldmells and Addlethorpe shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ingoldmells shall become and be the House of Residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Ingoldmells having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Addlethorpe having the right of presentation upon the second presentation

to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Lincoln has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme has proceeded with an appeal to His Majesty in Council against the Scheme or any part thereof within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920 to 1922.

DECISIONS OF THE HIGH COURT ON REFERENCES MADE UNDER SECTION 10 (1) OF THE 1920 ACT.

CONTRIBUTIONS NOT PAYABLE.

On the 15th November, 1922, judgment was given in the High Court on the question whether a person employed as:—

Pea picker and sorter in the seed warehouse of a firm of nurserymen and seed growers and merchants

was or was not an employed person within the meaning of the Act of 1920. This question was referred to the High Court by the Minister on the 7th July, 1922.

The Judge held that the employment of the person in question involved horticultural skill; that the work was part of the harvesting and not of the marketing of the seed, and was employment in horticulture within the meaning of paragraph (a) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act. The person in question was therefore not required to be insured.

CONTRIBUTIONS PAYABLE.

On the same day judgment was given in the High Court on the question whether persons employed as:—

(a) Golf caddie at a members' golf club, the charges per round being fixed by the club,

(b) Chauffeur to a practising physician, driving exclusively for professional purposes,

(c) Maid in a nursing home of which a doctor is the proprietor,

were or were not employed persons within the meaning of the Act of 1920. This question was referred to the High Court by the Minister on 7th July, 1922.

The Judge held that

(a) The employment of the golf caddie is not employment in domestic service within the meaning of paragraph (b) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920. The golf caddie in question is *insurable*, being engaged and paid through the club, and his employment is therefore excluded from the exception laid down in paragraph (i) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act. This judgment is of strictly limited application and covers only such caddies as are engaged or paid through a golf club.

(b) The chauffeur is *insurable*, being employed in domestic service in a business carried on for the purposes of gain within the meaning of paragraph (b) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920.

(c) The maid attached to the nursing home is *insurable*, being employed in domestic service in a business carried on for the purposes of gain within the meaning of paragraph (b) of Part II. of the First Schedule to the Act of 1920.

Contributions are therefore payable in respect of persons employed in occupations similar to those described in (a), (b) and (c) above.

THE COLORADO BEETLE ORDER OF
1922.

(DATED 15TH DECEMBER 1922.)

(D.I.P. 534)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

Commencement.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Restriction on Importation of Vegetables and Plants from France.

2.—(1) For the prevention of the introduction of the Colorado Beetle the landing in England or Wales of any living plants or vegetables shipped from any port in European France is hereby prohibited unless the landing thereof is authorised by a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry or the plants or vegetables are accompanied by a declaration purporting to be made by the grower or exporter thereof in the form prescribed in the Schedule to this Order. Such declaration shall be delivered to an officer of Customs at the same time and together with the entry relating to the consignment.

(2) Living plants or vegetables shipped from any port in European France and landed in England or Wales without such a licence or declaration as is prescribed in this Order shall be forthwith destroyed by and at the expense of the importer unless the plants or vegetables are authorised to be disposed of otherwise by a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry, and any person failing to comply with the provisions of this Article as to destruction or with the conditions (if any) imposed by such licence shall on summary conviction be liable to a penalty of ten pounds.

(3) In this Article the expression "living plants or vegetables" means trees and shrubs, tubers, bulbs and flower roots, raw vegetables including potatoes, potato haulms and leaves, and tomatoes, and the expression "Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(4) The restrictions hereby imposed shall not affect the requirements of the Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1922.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the COLORADO BEETLE ORDER OF 1922.
