

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF  
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 20TH DECEMBER 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

*Extension of Period Prescribed as Double  
Dipping Period.*

The dates between which all sheep in the Double Dipping Area, described in the Schedule hereto, are to be dipped twice within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II. of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1920, are hereby fixed to be the fourteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and the eleventh day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, instead of the fourteenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, and the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, as prescribed by Article 3 of the Order of the Minister (No. 1200) dated the tenth day of November, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.
