FURTHER AMENDED STATUTES OF THE ORDER OF THE BRITISH EMPIRE.

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come.

Greeting !

Whereas by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Fourth day of June, 1917, in the Eighth year of Our Reign, We have thought fit and been pleased to institute, erect, constitute, and create an Order of Knighthood, to be called and known for ever hereafter by the name, style, and designation of "The Most Excellent Order of the British Empire," whereof We, Our heirs and successors for ever shall be Sovereigns:

And whereas by Our aforesaid Letters Patent We did ordain that the said Order should be governed by Statutes and Ordinances and that the Statutes to be observed within the said Order should be established by Us and sealed by the Seal of the said Order which Statutes so given and in future to be given by Us, Our heirs and successors, to which the said Seal shall be affixed, should be of the same validity and taken and read as if the same and every Article of them had been verbatim recited in the said Letters Patent and passed under the Great Seal of Our said United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland:

And whereas in conformity with the said Letters Patent, We did on the fourth day of June, 1917, the twelfth day of April, 1918, and the twenty-eighth day of March, 1919, enact and issue certain Statutes and Ordinances to be observed within the said Order wherein a power was reserved to Us, Our heirs and successors of annulling, altering, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these Statutes and Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order:

And whereas it is expedient that certain alterations should be made in the existing Statutes of the said Order:

Now know ye that in pursuance and in exercise of the power vested in Us by the said Letters Patent We have abrogated and annulled and do hereby abrogate and repeal the said Statutes:

And further know all ye to whom these Presents shall come that in substitution thereof We have made, ordained and established, and by these Presents, sealed with the Seal of the said Order, do make, ordain and establish the following Statutes and Ordinances, namely:---

1. It is ordained and enjoined that this Order of Chivalry shall be styled and designated in all Δ cts, proceedings and pleadings The Most Excellent Order of the British Empire as in Our said Letters Patent is directed, and by no other designation.

2. It is ordained that the said Order shall consist of the Sovereign and a Grand Master and of five several classes:—I. "Knights Grand Cross " and "Dames Grand Cross." II. "Knights Commanders " and "Dames Commanders." III. "Commanders." IV. "Officers." V. "Members." And it is further ordained that each and every of these five Classes shall likewise contain two subdivisions whereof the first shall be styled "Military" and the second "Civil," each of which sub-divisions shall be composed partly of Ordinary and partly of Honorary Members, but that no person shall at the same time be included in both sub-divisions. 3. It is ordained that We, Our heirs and successors, Kings or Queens Regnant of Our said United Kingdom, are and for ever shall be Sovereigns of this Order, to whom doth and shall belong all power of annulling, interpreting, explaining, or augmenting these and every part of these Statutes.

4. We do hereby ordain, direct and appoint that a Prince of the Blood Royal, or such other exalted personage as We, Our heirs and successors shall hereafter appoint shall be Grand Master of the said Order, and shall in virtue thereof be the First or Principal Knight Grand Cross of the said Order, to whose custody shall be confided the Great Seal of the Order, which he shall affix to all Statutes, Ordinances, and Instruments according to the regulations touching the issue of every of the said Instruments; and it is further ordained that it shall be his special duty to enforce the due observance of the Statutes and Ordinances of this Order, and that he shall likewise direct the issue of all letters of Summons whenever the Sovereign shall be pleased to command an Investiture of the said Most Excellent Order.

5. It is ordained that all commissioned, and warrant and subordinate Officers subject to the Naval Discipline Act or employed under the Order of the Admiralty, and all commissioned and warrant Officers recommended by any Commander-in-Chief in the field or elsewhere, or employed under the War Office or Air Ministry, and all members of the Naval, Army and Air Force Nursing Services, or such officials of the Women's Auxiliary Services as are under contract with or employed by the Admiralty, War Office or Air Ministry, and all commissioned and warrant and subordinate Officers of the Naval, Military and Air Forces of India, Our Self-governing Dominions and Colonies, the States or Territories under Our protection, and Mandated Territories, including those serving under Administrative Headquarters, and members of the Nursing Services of such Forces or officials of the Women's Auxiliary Services of such Forces, shall be eligible for appointment to the Military Division of this Order.

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6. It is ordained that the persons to be admitted to the Civil Division of the said Order shall be such persons, male or female, as may have rendered or shall hereafter render important services to Our Empire.

7. It is ordained that foreign persons upon whom We may think fit to confer the honour of being received into this Order shall be deemed to be, and described as, Honorary Knights Grand Cross or Honorary Dames Grand Cross, Honorary Knights Commanders or Honorary Dames Commanders, Honorary Commanders, Honorary Officers, and Honorary Members, according to the classes in the Order to which they belong, and it is further ordained that the name of every foreign person to be received into this Order shall be laid before Us, Our heirs and successors, by Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

8. It is ordained that the Military Division of the First Class or Knights and Dames Grand Cross shall not exceed ten, of which number two may be appointed on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty (not more than one to be so appointed in a period of two years), five on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War (not more than one to be so appointed in one year), one on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for

Air, and two on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies (not more than one to be so appointed in one year); but that any vacancy arising by the death of a Knight or Grand Dame Cross so nominated shall be filled only on the recommendation of the Department by which the deceased Knight or Dame Grand Cross was recommended.

9. It is ordained that the Civil Division of the First Class or Knights and Dames Grand Cross shall not exceed sixty, of which number thirty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with Our United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands (not more than four to be so appointed in one year), and thirty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with any other part or parts of Our Dominions, including India, or Countries under Our protection or Mandated Territories, or who have rendered services in relation to the Foreign Affairs of Our Empire (not more than four to be so appointed in one year, of which number one may be appointed on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, and one on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for India, and two on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies).

10. It is ordained that the Military Division of the Second Class or Knights and Dames Commanders shall not exceed thirty, of which number six may be appointed on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty (not more than one to be so appointed in one year), fifteen on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War (not more than two to be so appointed in one year), three on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Air (not more than one to be so appointed in a period of two years), and six on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies (not more than two to be appointed in one year); but that any vacancy arising by the death of a Knight or Dame Commander so nominated shall be filled only on the recommendation of the Department by which the deceased Knight or Dame Commander was recommended.

11. It is ordained that the Civil Division of the Second Class or Knights and Dames Commanders shall not exceed one hundred and eighty, of which number ninety shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with Our United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands (not more than twelve to be so appointed in one year), and ninety shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with any other part or parts of Our Dominions, in-cluding India, or Countries under Our protection or Mandated Territories, or who have rendered services in relation to the Foreign Affairs of Our Empire (not more than twelve to be so appointed in one year, of which number two may be appointed on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, two on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for India, and eight on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies).

12. It is ordained that the Military Division of the Third Class or Commanders shall not exceed one hundred and forty, of which number twenty-four may be appointed on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty (not more than three to be so ap-

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pointed in one year), eighty-four on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War (not more than ten to be so appointed in one year), ten on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Air (not more than one to be so appointed in one year), and twentytwo on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies (not more than three in one year to be so appointed); but that any vacancy arising by the death of a Commander so nominated shall be filled only on the recommendation of the Department by which the deceased Commander was recommended.

13. It is ordained that the Civil Division of the Third Class or Commanders shall not exceed seven hundred and twenty, of which number three hundred and sixty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with Our United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands (not more than thirty to be so appointed in one year), and three hundred and sixty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with any other part or parts of Our Dominions, including India, or Countries under Our protection or Mandated Territories, or who have rendered services in relation to the Foreign Affairs of Our Empire (not more than thirty to be so appointed in one year, of which number five may be appointed on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, five on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for India, and twenty on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies)

14. It is ordained that not more than fortynine appointments shall be made in any year to the Military Division of the Fourth Class or Officers, of which number six may be appointed on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty, thirty on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War, three on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Air, and ten on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies.

15. It is ordained that not more than one hundred and sixty appointments shall be made in any year to the Civil Division of the Fourth Class or Officers, of which number eighty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with Our United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands, and eighty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with any other part or parts of Our Dominions including India, or Countries under Our protection or Mandated Territories, or who have rendered services in relation to the Foreign Affairs of Our Empire, and that of the latter number eleven may be made on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, thirteen on the recommenda-tion of Our Secretary of State for India and fifty-six on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies.

16. It is ordained that not more than sixtyeight appointments shall be made in any year to the Military Division of the Fifth Class or Members, of which number six may be made on the recommendation of Our First Lord of the Admiralty, forty on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War, four on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Air, and eighteen on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies.

17. It is ordained that not more than two hundred and forty appointments shall be made in any one year to the Civil Division of the Fifth Class or Members, of which number one hundred and twenty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with Our United Kingdom, the Isle of Man or the Channel Islands, and one hundred and twenty shall be persons who have rendered meritorious service within or connected with any other part or parts of Our Dominions including India, or Countries under Our protection or Mandated Territories, or who have rendered services in relation to the Foreign Affairs of Our Empire, and that of the latter number fifteen may be made on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, nineteen on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for India, and eightysix on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies.

18. It is ordained that if the appointments authorised to be made annually in the first three classes as aforesaid be not made in any one year, then the vacancies so arising may be filled in subsequent years, but that vacancies so arising in the fourth and fifth classes may not be so filled up.

19. It is ordained that those persons whom We have thought fit to admit into this Most Excellent Order prior to the date of these Our Statutes shall not now or hereafter be included within the number allotted to each class of the Order by the foregoing Statutes.

20. It is ordained that in each Class of the Military Division the persons who may be appointed on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War may include members of Our Indian Army, and that the persons who may be appointed on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for the Colonies shall be members of Our Dominion and other Oversea Defence Forces; but that in the Fourth and Fifth Classes of the Military Division in any year in which Our Secretary of State for the Colonies does not desire to recommend for appointment members of such Defence Forces to the full number permitted, an addition may be made to the number of appointments which may be made on the recommendation of Our Secretary of State for War (but so that the number of appointments made in that year by Our Secretary of State for War and Our Secretary of State for the Colonies together do not exceed the provision authorised)

21. It is ordained that the name of every person, other than foreign person, to be appointed to be a Member of any one of the Classes of the Civil Division of this Our said Order shall be laid before Us, Our heirs and successors, by Our Prime Minister, and that the name of every person, other than foreign person, to be appointed to be a Member of any Class of the Military Division shall be laid before Us, Our heirs and successors by Our First Lord of the Admiralty, Our Secretary of State for War, or Our Secretary of State for Air as may be appropriate.

22. It is ordained that when We, Our heirs or successors shall be pleased to nominate and appoint any person to this Order such appointment shall be made by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual sealed with the Seal of this Order and countersigned by the Grand Master of the said Order.

23. It is ordained that this Order shall rank next to and immediately after our Royal Victorian Order, that in all solemn Ceremonies, places and assemblies the Knights Grand Cross of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately after the Knights Grand Cross of the Royal Victorian Order, that the Dames Grand Cross of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately before the wives of Knights Grand Cross of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and may on all occasions have, use and enjoy the appellation and style of Dame before their Christian or first names, that the Knights Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately after the Knights Commanders of the Royal Victorian Order, that the Dames Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately before the wives of Knights Commanders of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, and may on all occasions have, use and enjoy the appellation and style of Dame before their Christian or first names, that the men who are Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately after the Members of the Third Class of the Royal Victorian Order and the women who are Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately before the wives of Companions of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, that the men who are Officers of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately after the Members of the Fourth Class of the Royal Victorian Order, and the women who are Officers of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately before the wives of Members of the Fourth Class of the Royal Victorian Order, that the men who are Members of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately after the Members of the Fifth Class of the Royal Victorian Order, and that the women who are Members of this Order shall have place and precedency next to and immediately before the wives of Members of the Fifth Class of the Royal Victorian Order.

24. It is ordained that the Insignia of the Sovereign of this Order shall be of the same material and fashion as are hereinafter appointed for the Knights Grand Cross, save only with those alterations which distinguish Our Royal Dignity.

25. It is ordained that the Grand Master shall wear the Insignia of a Knight Grand Cross, the badge of which for the Grand Master shall be augmented in accordance with the commands of the Sovereign.

26. It is ordained that the Military and Civil Knights and Dames Grand Cross of this Most Excellent Order shall upon all great and solemn occasions wear the badge of the Order, which shall consist of a cross patonce, enamelled pearl, fimbriated or surmounted by gold medallion with a representation of Britannia seated within a circle gules inscribed with the motto, "For God and the Empire," in letters of gold ensigned with the Imperial Crown or, the whole suspended from a purple riband which in the case of Knights Grand Cross shall be of the breadth of three inches and three-quarters with, for Military Knights Grand Cross the addition of a vertical red stripe in the centre of the ribbon of the width of about five-sixteenths of an inch and in the case of Dames Grand Cross shall be of the breadth of two inches and one-quarter with. for Military Dames Grand Cross, a vertical red stripe in the centre of the ribbon of the width of about one-quarter of an inch, passing from the right shoulder to the left side, and they shall wear on the left side of their coats or outer garments an oval Star composed of eight points and charged with a medallion as above.

27. It is ordained that the Military and Civil Knights Commanders shall wear around their necks a riband of the same colour and pattern as that of the Military and Civil Knights Grand Cross of the breadth of one inch and three-quarters, but, in the case of Military Knights Commanders the vertical red stripe is to be of the width of about threesixteenths of an inch, and pendant therefrom the Badge of the Knights Commanders of the Order, which shall be of similar form and pattern to that appointed for the Knights Grand Cross, but of smaller size, and also that they shall wear on the left side of their coats or outer garments a silver star composed of four equal points and four lesser, charged with a medallion as before, and it is ordained that the Military and Civil Dames Commanders shall wear a badge of similar form and pattern as that appointed for Knights Commanders attached to a riband also similar to that worn by Military and Civil Knights Commanders but tied in a bow and worn on left shoulder, and that they shall wear a like star.

28. It is ordained that the Military and Civil Commanders shall in the same manner wear the like riband and badge as that appointed for the Military and Civil Knights and Dames Commanders respectively, but that they shall not be entitled to wear the Star.

29. It is ordained that the Military and Civil Officers shall wear a badge of similar form and pattern as that appointed for the Military and Civil Commanders of the Order, but of a smaller size and silver gilt, attached to a riband of the same colour and pattern of the breadth of one inch and a half, but in the case of Military Officers the vertical red stripe is to be of the width of an eighth of an inch, attached to the left breast of their coats or outer garments by men, and tied in a bow on the left shoulder by women.

30. It is ordained that the Military and Civil Members shall wear in like manner the same ribands and badge as that appointed to the Military and Civil Officers of the Order except that the badge shall be in silver.

31. It is ordained that upon the nomination of any person to be a Knight Grand Cross, Dame Grand Cross, Knight Commander, or Dame Commander of this Order, he or she shall be invested with the Insignia of his or her dignity in the Order by Us, Our heirs and successors if he or she be resident at the time in this country, but if he or she be in India by Our Viceroy of India in Our name and on Our behalf, and if he or she be in Canada, Australia, New Zealand, or South Africa by Our Governors General of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, or South Africa respectively, and if in Ireland, or elsewhere, by such person as We may be pleased to appoint specially for the purpose, in Our name and on Our behalf; and that on the day of the Investiture the person to be invested shall be introduced into the presence of the Sovereign, the Viceroy of India, or the Governor General of Canada, Australia, New Zealand, or South Africa, or of the person specially appointed by Us as aforesaid, as the case may be, by the Officer of the Order or other Officer deputed to be in attendance bearing the proper Insignia of the

Order, when the Sovereign, Viceroy, or Governor General, or the person specially appointed as aforesaid, having in the case of Knights Grand Cross and Knights Commanders conferred the Honour of Knighthood upon the person so nominated if he have not previously received the said Honour, will then proceed to invest him or her with the Ensigns of the said Order in the following manner: — The Sovereign, Viceroy or Governor General, or person specially appointed as aforesaid, will invest the new Knight Grand Cross, Dame Grand Cross, Knight Commander or Dame Commander with the riband and badge and will deliver or place on his or her left side the star of the said Order appertaining to his or her dignity.

32. It is further ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors by a Warrant or Warrants under Our Sign Manual countersigned by the Grand Master and sealed with the Seal of this Order to authorize some distinguished person in Our Service or other person to perform in Our name and on Our behalf the Ceremony of investing Knights Grand Cross, Dames Grand Cross, Knights Commanders, or Dames Commanders with the Insignia of their respective dignities or to permit the Ceremony of Investiture to be dispensed with. And We reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, by Our or their Warrant or Warrants as aforesaid, full power and authority to permit and authorize the person or persons not invested by Us to wear the Insignia and enjoy the privileges appertaining to their respective dignities in as full and ample a manner as if they had been invested by Us, Our heirs and successors.

33. It is ordained that on the promotion of a person from a lower to a higher Class in the same Division of this Order the Insignia of such lower class theretofore worn by him or her shall be returned to the Registrar of the Order for the service of the Order. It is further ordained that on the promotion of a person from a lower class in one Division to a higher class in the other Division of this Order, the Insignia of the class theretofore worn by him or her, unless awarded for Military Service in the Great War, 1914-1918, shall be returned to the Registrar of the Order for the Service of the Order, and that on the resignation or decease of an Official of the Order his Badge of Office shall be restored for the service of the Order.

34. It is ordained that for the greater honour and dignity of the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order it shall and may be lawful for them upon all occasions to bear Supporters to their Arms; and We do by these Presents direct and command Our Garter Principal King of Arms for the time being to grant Supporters to such Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order as shall not otherwise be entitled thereto and it shall also be lawful for Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order to surround their Armorial Bearings with the circle and motto of the Order and to suspend therefrom a representation of their riband and badge and for Knights Commanders, Dames Commanders and Commanders of this Order to surround their Armorial Bearings with the circle and motto of the Order and to suspend therefrom a representation of their riband and badge and for the Officers and Members of the Order to suspend a representation of their riband and respective badges from the bottom of the escocheon containing their Armorial Bearings.

35. It is ordained that the Seal of the Order shall have engraved thereon as follows (that is to say) a representation of Britannia surrounded by a circle containing the motto of the Order "For God and the Empire," and that the Statutes of the Order shall be sealed by and with the same.

36. It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and sealed with the Seal of the Order to cancel and annul the appointment of any person to this Order, and thereupon his or her name in the Register shall be erased. But that it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when circumstances render it just and expedient so to do.

37. It is ordained that a Military and Civil Medal of this Order shall be awarded to persons who perform acts of gallantry warranting such mark of Our Royal appreciation.

mark of Our Royal appreciation. 38. It is further ordained that a Military and Civil Medal of this Order shall be awarded to persons who render meritorious service warranting such mark of Our Royal appreciation and that such Civil Medal for meritorious service shall not be awarded to Members of or persons eligible for appointment to any of the five classes of Our said Order, and such Military Medal shall only be awarded to persons subordinate to those who are eligible for the Military Division of the various classes of this Order.

39. It is ordained that the medal of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire for men and for women shall consist of a circular medal in silver, having on the obverse a representation of Britannia within the circle and motto of the Order with, upon the exergue, the words "For Gallantry" or "For Meritorious Service," and on the reverse Our Royal and Imperial Cypher, and shall be worn on the left side suspended from a clasp to a purple riband of one inch and one-sixteenth of an inch in width, with the addition in the case of recipients of the Military Medal of the Order of a vertical red stripe in the centre of the riband of about one-tenth of an inch, and that the clasp shall be ornamented with laurel leaves for gallantry, or with oak leaves for meritorious service, as the case may be.

40. It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors by a Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual to cancel and annul the award of any Medal of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and that thereupon the name of the recipient in the Register shall be erased, but it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore the medal to any person whose name may have been so erased when circumstances render it just and expedient so to do.

41. It is ordained that the twenty-fourth day of May every year shall henceforth be taken and deemed to be the anniversary of the institution of this Order.

42. It is ordained that the following officials shall be appointed to this Order, that is to say, a

Prelate, King of Arms, Registrar, Secretary, Gentleman Usher of the Purple Rod. 43. It is ordained that the Prelate of this Order shall wear around his neck pendent to a riband similar to that which is assigned to the Knights Commanders an escocheon of gold enamelled on a field purpure the badge within the circle and motto of the Order, the whole surmounted by an Imperial Crown. Moreover, it shall be lawful for the Prelate to surround his Armorial Bearings with the circle and motto of this Order.

44. It is ordained that the King of Arms of this Order shall be nominated by Us, Our heirs and successors, and that he shall sedulously attend the Service of the Order. And further it is ordained that he shall wear around his neck pendent to a purple riband an escocheon of gold enamelled on a field purpure a repre-sentation of Britannia impaling the Arms of the Sovereign surrounded with the circle and motto of the Order and surmounted by an Imperial Crown, that he shall carry the Rod of this Order, which shall have on the two greater squares the Arms of the Order impaled with those of the Sovereign, and on the lesser squares the Arms of the Order, the whole surmounted by an Imperial Crown, and that at all Coronations he shall precede the Knights Grand Cross and shall carry and wear a Crown as Our other Kings of Arms are accustomed to do, which badge, rod and crown shall all be of the same materials with those used and borne by Our Garter Principal King of Arms.

45. It is ordained that the Registrar of this Order shall be the person for the time being holding the Office of Registrar and Secretary of the Central Chancery of the Orders of Knighthood, that he shall record all proceedings connected with this Most Excellent Order in a register to be appropriated for that purpose and shall, under the directions of the Grand Master, prepare all Warrants and other Instruments to be passed under the Seal of the Order and engross the same, that he shall summon the Knights Grand Cross to attend the Sovereign at all investitures of this Order, that he shall wear around his neck pendent to a purple riband an escocheon of gold enamelled on a field purpure the cross of the Order surmounted by a representation of a closed book Gules, clasps Or, within the circle and motto of the Order, the whole surmounted by an Imperial Crown.

46. It is ordained that the Secretary of this Order shall be the person holding for the time being the office of Permanent Secretary to the Treasury or such other member of the staff of the Treasury as may be nominated by Us, that he shall collect and tabulate the names of those persons who are to be submitted to Us for admission to this Order or to be awarded the Medal of this Order, that he shall wear around his neck pendent to a purple riband an escocheon of gold enamelled on a field purpure the badge of the Order with two pens saltirewise between the angles in pearl enamel within the circle and motto of the Order, the whole surmounted by an Imperial Crown.

47. It is ordained that the Gentleman Usher of the Purple Rod of this Most Excellent Order shall be appointed by Us, Our heirs and successors, shall wear around his neck pendent to a purple riband an escocheon of gold enamelled on a field purpure a representation of Britannia surrounded by the circle and motto of the Order and surmounted by an Imperial Crown, and that he shall carry the Purple Rod of the Order, having at the top an escrol thereon the motto of the Order surmounted by a representation of Britannia.

48. It is ordained that all and every of the officials of this Order shall over and above the duties more specially imposed by the foregoing Statutes execute diligently whatever the Sovereign or Grand Master may be pleased to command touching the interests of the said Order, and that the said Offices of Prelate, King of Arms, Registrar, Secretary, and Gentleman Usher shall be holden during good behaviour.

49. We do hereby command and enjoin that these Statutes shall be of such and that same force, virtue and effect in every respect as if they had been duly made and the said acts, deeds, matters and things had been duly done on the fourth day of June, 1917. Lastly.—We reserve to Ourself, Our heirs

and successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these Statutes and Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order.

(5) dated 28th July, 1922, the variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime rates, calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule in the manner specified in Section II. of Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice S.B. (5), dated 28th July, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Section I. of Part III. of the said Notice S.B. (5) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

(5) dated 28th July, 1922.

NOTE.—The employment of young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 29th December, 1922. Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 16 years or over, whose employment is not of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature, and who cannot be suitably employed on piece-work, shall, until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable under this Section according to his or her age.

SECTION II.—The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule for Workers under 21 years of age shall be payable subject to the proviso that such workers are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 1s. 0¹/₂d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 6³/₂d. per hour in the case of Female Workers. Otherwise the General dinimum Time-Rate payable to workers under 21 years of age shall be 1s. 0¹/₂d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 6³/₂d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, irrespective of age.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, this provision shall not operate in the case of workers whose employment is of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

SECTION I.-In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows :-

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on Time-Work in any branch of the Trade specified in Part III of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows :--

FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK :-

- (1) For the FIRST TWO HOURS' OVERTIME on any day except Saturday, Sunday or Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (2) For OVERTIME AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for ALL OVERTIME ON SATURDAY, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times
- (3) For all time worked ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise appl cable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME
 (4) For ALL HOURS WORKED IN ANY WEEK IN EXCESS OF 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME
- applicable except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that -

- (a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days
- after 9½ hours have been worked.
 (b) Where a Worker (e.g., a Worker of the Jewish Religion) is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such Worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Part of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF RATES.

The above Minimum Rates apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (including Homeworkers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920; that is to say, the manufacture of articles intended for the amusement of children, including dolls, metal, wooden or other hard toys, soft toys, books made from textile materials, requisites for table games, bricks, blocks, puzzles, balls, Christmas crackers, Easter eggs, masks or drums,

INCLUDING ALSO-

- (a) The assembling of parts of any of the above-mentioned articles.
- (b) The operations of storing, boxing, packeting, labelling, or despatching, and all other warehousing or packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the abovementioned articles.

BUT EXCLUDING,-

- (a) The manufacture of toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other articles, so as to form a common or interchingeable form of employment for the workers.
- The manufacture of sports requisites
- (c) The manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheelbarrows, toy scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses, or other similar toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.
- (d) The manufacture from ceramic materials of dolls or dolls' parts, dolls' china, marbles or similar a ticles when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery.
- (e) The making of articles from sugar confectionery.
- (f) The making of hollow-ware, including boxes and canisters, from sheet iron, sheet steel or tinplate, or any operations incidental thereto.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

- (a) A Female Learner is a worker under 18 years of age, or a worker who being of 18 years of age or over has had less than 12 months' experience in the trade, who (in both cases) is engaged in learning under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for female workers other than learners.
- (b) A Male Learner is any male person under 21 years of age who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for male workers other than learners.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE FOR FEMALE WORKERS OF 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OVER.

The Piece-Work Basis Time Rate for all Female Workers of 18 years of

age or over is ۰... 74d. per hour. ••• •••,

In the case of Female Workers of 18 years of age or over employed on Piece Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than $7\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour

to an ordinary worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class in question. In the case of Female Workers under 18 years of age and in the case of all Male Workers each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918. the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows :---

In any week ... 47

On Saturday ... 4]

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime.

- SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether engaged on time work or on piece work, in excess of the normal number of hours are as follows :-
 - (a) In respect of all hours worked in excess of $4\frac{1}{2}$ on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
 - (b) In respect of all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE TIME.
 - (c) In respect of all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be one and a quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (a) and (b) of this section.

SECTION III.-The Overtime Rates are not applicable to mate workers employed solely as Firemen or Stokers.

PART IV.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in those branches of the hollow-ware trade which are engaged in the making of hollow-ware from sheet iron or sheet steel, including the processes of galvanising, tinning, enamelling, painting, japanning, lacquering and varnishing

Provided that the Minimum Rates are not applicable to workers while employed as Watchmen.

PART V.

- SECTION I.-. The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.
- SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made for the payment of wages in excess of the minimum rates.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH DECEMBER 1922.)

CHESHIRE (HUNTINGTON DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power en-abling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:---

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order-

"The Prohibited Areas" means the Areas in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

"The Controlled Area" means the Area in

which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

"Animals " means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

pigs; '' Slaughterhouse '' means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Areas.

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Areas, except as provided in the next following Article;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway, or by water, within the Prohibited Areas, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Areas;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Areas or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Areas.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to which this Order applies to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Areas, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Areas until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area. 4.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;

(b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order :---

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat; (c) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence Into or Within the Controlled Area.

5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:---

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence "Occupation Licence.")

Conditions of Licences.

6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Areas to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Areas, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a Notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station, or to an officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;

practicable from all other animals; (g) Copies of Licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such Officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the

Prohibited Areas, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

8.-(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows :-

Cattle.---A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

-(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Areas by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

10.--(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Areas on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to

any specified part of the premises; (2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

13. The Cheshire (Huntington District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 (No. 3) is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (HUNTINGTON DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

(a) The words and expressions used in the following by-laws shall respectively have and include the several meanings assigned to them or defined in "The Explosives Act, 1875," and in the Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 5th day of August, 1875, made in pursuance of Section 106 of the said Act, unless the subject or context otherwise requires.

(b) The term "explosive" means and shall include and apply to every article and substance mentioned as or defined to be an explosive in and by the 3rd Section of the said Act, or the said Order in Council, or any Order in Council which may hereafter be made in pursuance of the said Act.

(c) Where by any of these by-laws any time is prescribed or allowed for giving any notice to the Company, or for the doing of any act by the Company, such time shall be computed exclusively of Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and any statutory Bank Holiday.

1. No carriage containing any explosive which the Company shall, by any notice or regulation for the time being in force, notify that they will not receive, forward, or carry, shall be delivered to the Company for conveyance, or be brought, sent, or forwarded to or upon any railway of the Company.

2. No person shall send to the Company any consignment of explosive, unless he has given to the Company forty-eight hours' previous notice in writing of his intention to send such consignment, and stating the true name, description, and quantity of the explosive proposed to be conveyed, and his own name and address, and also the name and address of the proposed consignee, and has had an intimation in writing from the Company that they are prepared to receive such consignment.

3. Consignments of explosive shall be sent to the Company's forwarding station, and shall be received by their servants, only at such times during the hours of daylight, that is to say, between sunrise and sunset, as the Company may appoint; and every consignment and package containing any explosive proposed to be conveyed on any railway of the Company shall immediately on the arrival thereof at the Company's station, wharf or railway, be delivered to and be received by the Company's servants authorised to receive dangerous goods, and by no other person whatsoever.

4. No explosive shall be loaded or unloaded on the Company's premises by the consignor or consignee thereof or their servants except between sunrise and sunset.

5. Safety cartridges and percussion caps and safety-fuse (for blasting) may be conveyed by passenger train, provided all due precautions be taken by the sender for the prevention of accident by fire or explosion; also railway fog signals for the Company's own use; but, except as aforesaid, no explosive whatever shall be conveyed by passenger train.

6. Gunpowder and any explosive authorised by the Secretary of State to be packed in metallic cases or cylinders as outer packages, if packed in metallic cases or cylinders which fulfil all the requirements of the Explosives Act, 1875, and are of a pattern approved by the Company, may be conveyed along with ordinary goods traffic in a carriage not containing any article or substance liable to cause or communicate fire or explosion.

7. No explosive of the 5th (fulminate) class, nor any explosive of the 6th (ammunition) class containing its own means of ignition, nor any explosive of the 7th (firework) class shall be conveyed in the same carriage with any explosive not of the class and division to which it belongs.

8. There shall not be conveyed in the same carriage with any explosive anything of the nature of lucifer or other matches, acids or other chemicals, petroleum or other inflammable liquid, calcium carbide, oily goods, charcoal, lamp black, or any other article or substance of an inflammable nature or liable to spontaneous ignition or to cause or communicate fire or explosion.

9. On each side of every carriage containing any explosive there shall be affixed in conspicuous characters, by means of a securely attached label or otherwise, the word "explosive," or the name of the explosive with the word "explosive," except when containing explosive packed in metallic cases or cylinders, as provided for in the 6th of these by-laws; and every carriage containing explosive shall be placed as far as practicable from the engine attached to the train.

10. Not more than five carriages containing explosive shall be loaded or unloaded at or on any railway station or wharf of the Company, or be attached to or conveyed by any one train at any one time; and the quantity of explosive to be contained or loaded in any one such carriage at any one time shall not exceed 10,000 lb. in weight, provided always that the quantity of explosive to be contained or loaded in any one such carriage shall not exceed one ton in weight unless the carriage shall be a covered van.

11. Explosive contained in metallic cases or cylinders, if conveyed in open trucks, shall be sheeted so as to effectually protect it against communication of fire. 12. Explosive, unless contained in metallic cases or cylinders, shall be conveyed only in a Gunpowder van.

13. When the stowing of explosive in any carriage or the loading or unloading of any explosive is undertaken by any person other than the Company, all due precautions shall be taken by such person by careful stowing and loading and unloading and otherwise to, prevent and secure such explosive from being brought into contact with or endangered by any other article or substance liable to cause fire or explosion.

14. In loading or unloading any explosive the packages containing the same shall, as far as practicable, be passed from hand to hand and not be rolled upon the ground, and in no case shall any such packages be rolled unless clean hides, cloths or sheets have been previously laid down on the platform or ground over which the same are to be rolled. Packages containing explosive shall not be thrown or dropped down, but shall be carefully deposited and stowed in such manner as to prevent any displacement of the packages during transit.

15. No person while employed in loading, stowing in any carriage, or unloading any explosive, shall wear boots or shoes with steel or iron nails, steel or iron heels, or metal tips of any kind, or have about his person any lucifer match, explosive, or means of striking a light; and all persons employed in the loading, stowing, or unloading of any explosive shall while such loading, stowing or unloading are going on abstain from smoking. This by-law shall not apply to the loading or unloading of explosive of the 1st Division of the 6th (Ammunition) class as classified by the said Order in Council, dated August 5th, 1875.

16. While the loading, unloading, or conveyance of explosive is going on, all persons engaged in such loading, unloading, or convey-ance shall observe all due precautions for the prevention of accidents by fire or explosion, and for preventing unauthorised persons having access to the explosive so being loaded, unloaded, or conveyed, and shall abstain from any act whatever which tends to cause fire or explosion and is not reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading, unloading, or conveyance of such explosive, or of any other article carried therewith, and for preventing any other person from committing any such, act; and such other person who, after being warned, commits any such act shall be deemed to commit a breach of these by-laws.

17. The loading or unloading of explosive into or out of any carriage, when once begun, shall be proceeded with with all due diligence until the same is completed.

18. Packages containing any explosive must be removed by the consignee from the station, wharf, or depot of the Company to which they have been conveyed, as soon as practicable and with all due diligence after arrival; and if not removed within twelve hours after arrival the packages and contents may be forthwith sold by the Company, or otherwise disposed of as they think fit; and such packages shall in the meantime, and until such removal, sale or disposal, be completely covered over with painted cloth, tarpaulin, or other suitable material.

19. The Company may refuse to receive, forward, carry or allow to be brought or carried upon their railway any carriage or

package which they suspect to be packed or sent or to contain any article or thing packed or sent in contravention of the said Act or of any of these by-laws, or not in accordance therewith, and in case any carriage or package which the Company suspect to be so packed or sent, or to contain any such article or thing as aforesaid, shall be upon any railway of the Company, the Company may open, or require such carriage or package to be opened to ascertain the fact.

20. These by-laws are supplemental to the Explosives Act, 1875; and in the event of any breach (by any act or default) of any of them, or any attempt to commit such breach, the following penalties and consequences will be incurred and ensue, that is to say: —

(1) The explosive, in respect of which, or being in the carriage or train of carriages in respect of which, the offence is committed may, unless the offence be committed by the Company, be forfeited to the Company.

(2) The person committing the offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence, and to a further penalty of £10 for each day during which the offence continues, and the owner of the carriage or train of carriages in respect of which, or containing the explosive in respect of which, the offence is committed, the person in charge of such carriage, and the owner of such explosive, shall each be liable to a similar penalty, if he was a party or contributed to such offence, or neglected to supply the proper means, or to issue proper orders for the observance, or has not used due diligence to enforce the observance, of these by-laws.

21. Copies of these by-laws shall be exhibited in a conspicuous place at the stations on the Company's railways, and may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Company.

22. The above by-laws (with the exception of By-law No. 5) do not apply to small packages of percussion caps, safety cartridges, or gunpowder, carried by passengers for privateuse and not for sale, not exceeding in the whole for one passenger at any one time 5,000percussion caps, and 1,000 safety cartridges, in number, and 3 lb. in weight of gunpowder, provided such gunpowder is contained in a substantial case, bag, canister, or other receptacle, made and closed so as to prevent the gunpowder from escaping.

23. The by-laws made by the Company under the Explosives Act, 1875, on the 9th day of July, 1903, are hereby rescinded.
