Provided that all Male Workers of the classes specified in this section entering the trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years may be employed for a period not exceeding two months at a General Minimum Time-Rate which is less by ½d. per hour than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under the provisions of this section.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime rates, calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule in the manner specified in Section II. of Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice S.B. (5), dated 28th July, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed minimum rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Section I. of Part III. of the said Notice S.B. (5) to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acis, to all Male Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order, 1920, and as set out in Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice S.B. (5) dated 28th July, 1922.

Note.—The employment of young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSAL TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 29th December, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (*ddi g his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of The Sack and Bag Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
