LEEDS CORPORATION LIGHT RAILWAYS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made by the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the city of Leeds (hereinafter called "the Corporation" and "the City" respectively) to the Minister of Transport in the month of December instant (the consent of the said Minister to such application being made having been given under Statutory Rules and Orders, 1914, No. 1380) for an Order under the Light Railways Acts, 1896 and 1912, and the Railways Act, 1921, authorising the Corporation to make, maintain, work and use the light railways hereinafter described in the city and in the rural district of Hunslet, in the West Riding of Yorkshire (that is to say):—

Railway (No. 1a), in the city and in the parish of Templenewsam, in the rural district of Hunslet, commencing in Selby-road by a junction with the existing tramway at a point 70 yards or thereabouts south-east of the centre of the North Eastern Railway bridge crossing Selby-road, and terminating in Selby-road at a point 470 yards or thereabouts south-east of the bridge over the Wyke Beck.

Railway (No. 1), in the said parish and rural district, commencing at the termination of railway (No. 1a), and terminating at the junction of the Sycamore-walk with the Elm-walk in Templenewsam Park.

Railway (No. 2), in the city, commencing in York-road at the termination of the existing tramway in that road opposite to the Seacroft Hospital, and terminating in Crossgates-lane near to its junction with Station-road and Austhorpe-road.

SHERBORNE ELECTRICITY.

(The Production and Supply of Electricity within the Urban District of Sherborne, in the County of Dorset; the Breaking-up and Interference with Streets and Roads; Incorporation of Acts; and other Provisions.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Electricity Commissioners by Crompton and Co., Limited, whose principal office is at Salisbury House, London Wall, in the city of London, for a Special Order, under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, for all or some of the following amongst other objects and purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the said Crompton and Co., Limited, or a company to be registered under the Companies Acts, 1908 to 1917 (each of whom is hereinafter referred to as "the Undertakers") to produce and supply electricity for public and private purposes within the urban district of Sherborne (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Undertakers to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity.

4. To authorise the Undertakers to break up the following roads which are not repairable by a local authority and railways, viz.:—

The bridges carrying roads over the London and South Western Railway.

The level crossing over the London and South Western Railway near to the gas works.

5. The name of the road or part of road in which it is proposed that electric lines shall be laid down within a period to be specified by the Order is as follows, namely:—

So much of South Street as lies between its junction with the Green and the level crossing over the London and South Western Railway near to the gas works.

6. To authorise the supply of electricity to railways and other statutory undertakings for use within and without the area of supply.

7. To make provision for the transfer of the rights, powers, authorities, obligations and liabilities under the Order to a Company to be registered as aforesaid.

8. To empower the Sherborne Urban District Council to acquire the undertaking at the expiration of the period and upon the terms specified in the Order.

9. To confer upon the Undertakers all or some of the powers of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1922, and to incorporate with the Order all or some of the provisions of the Electric Lighting (Clauses) Act, 1899, subject to such variations, extensions and exceptions as may be contained therein.
