TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the

Bank of England, on Friday, the 12th January, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th January, 1923, to Saturday, the 20th January, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

4½ PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS, 1932.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 6th October, 1922, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st of April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 15th January, 1923, to Saturday, the 20th January, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 2nd January, 1923, he made an Order under Section 8 (6) of the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, amending paragraph 2 of the Order dated 26th February, 1918, to read as follows:—

(2) A person suffering from any of the diseases described in the Schedule as dermatitis produced by dust or liquids, ulceration of the skin produced by dust or liquids, and ulceration of the mucous membrane of the nose or mouth produced by dust, shall not be entitled to compensation under the provisions of the said section on account of the said disease if he is disabled only for employment in the particular process in which the disease has been contracted or other processes involving risk of the said disease, unless the judge, committee or arbitrator is satisfied that the disease has been contracted through long continued exposure to dust or liquids in the industry in which he was engaged at the time of his disablement.

The Order, which may be cited as the Workmen's Compensation (Dermatitis) Order, 1923, comes into force on 22nd January, 1923.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

SHIRTMAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Shirmaking Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 26th December, 1913, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirmaking) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers, at present effective and set out in

the Trade Board's Notice S. (7) dated 1st July, 1922, the proposed Variations being as shown in the Schedule below.

For the purpose of determining the rate applicable, all employment prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

PART I—continued.

- (i) The advances to be given to Learners commencing at under 21 years of age shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance on the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.
- (ii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner, and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to her under Section I of this Part of this Schedule, upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Age of entering upon employment.	Conditions.
Under 15 years of age	The completion of not less than three years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years
15 and under 16 years of age	The completion of not less than two years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years
16 and under 21 years of age	The completion of two years' employment
21 years of age and over	The completion of one year's employment

- (iii) No Female Learner shall be held to be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Section I of this part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had.
- (iv) In determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.
- (v) For the purpose of reckoning the General Minimum Time-Rate to which a learner is entitled and of determining the date on which she ceases to be entitled to be employed as a learner, a learner shall be entitled to include all previous employment (a) in any branch of the Shirtmaking Trade as referred to in Part V of this Schedule, and (b) in the making wherever carried on of overalls for male and female persons.
- (vi) If the conditions specified in Section I of Part IV are not complied with the rate applicable is that set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule.

NOTE.—The conditions at present attached by the Trade Board to the minimum rates of wages for female learners are set out in Section II of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice S. (7) dated 1st July, 1922.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

Proposed Variation.

- (a) Workers other than Homeworkers as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule ... from 8½d. per hour to 7½d. per hour.
- (b) Homeworkers (as so defined) „ 8½d. „ 7½d. „

NOTE.—In the case of workers employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any piece rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, i.e., workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, e.g., learners and infirm workers.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY DAY OTHER THAN SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS	9

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The Proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(A)—FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:—

- (1) ON ANY DAY OTHER THAN SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS, AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

- (a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (b) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

- (c) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds $9\frac{1}{2}$, $11\frac{1}{2}$ and $13\frac{1}{2}$ respectively.

- (2) ON SATURDAY in respect of :

- (a) That class of worker who customarily attends on SIX DAYS a week :—

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours of work :—

- (i) For the first four hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

- (ii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rate applicable to the class of workers specified in this sub paragraph is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule.)

- (b) That class of worker who customarily attends on FIVE DAYS a week :—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday), One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

- (ii) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

- (iii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.* DOUBLE TIME.

- (3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS :—

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

NOTE.—The proposed Overtime Rates set out in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Sub-Section shall be payable as provided above in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

- (4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b) and (c), (2) (a) and (b) (ii) and (iii), and (3) of this Sub-Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

- (5) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

(B).—FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE WORK :—

- (1) ALL FEMALE WORKERS, other than learners, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each Hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

- (2) ALL FEMALE LEARNERS, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

PART IV.

SECTION I.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply : A Female Learner is a Worker who :—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning ; and
- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certificate or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner, on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade as referred to in Part V of this Schedule, without a certificate or

registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.

A Homeworker is a Worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all FEMALE WORKERS in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Notice S. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 1st July, 1922.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 5th day of January, 1923. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Shirtmaking Trade Board (Great Britain), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE LOOM TENTERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WITH A RECOGNISED FULL CHARGE.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 8TH JANUARY, 1923.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 14th January, 1923.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE LOOM TENTERS OF 21 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER WITH A RECOGNISED FULL CHARGE.

SECTION I.—(a) General Minimum Time-rate, 56s. 8d. per week of 48 hours.

(b) The General Minimum Time-Rate set out in (a) above, is a weekly rate based on a week of 48 hours and is subject to a proportionate adjustment according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—Overtime Rates calculated on the general minimum time-rate set out in Section I. in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J (18) dated 7th February, 1922, apply in substitution for the general minimum time-rate set out in Section I. in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice J (18) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART II.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers of the class specified in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J (18) dated 7th February, 1922.

PART III.

The above minimum rates of wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 1 of the year 1923.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 1 of 1922; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, a sharp lookout should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.

(2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three *red* vertical lights by night, or three *red* vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.

(3) At some ports or localities at home or abroad, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

PART II.

EXAMINATION SERVICE.

(4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter ports or localities at home or abroad.

(5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the port and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.

(6) As the institution of the Examination Service will probably be unknown to vessels desiring to enter the port, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In approaching by night any British port in the United Kingdom or abroad, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lanterns, two *red* and two *white*, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flag of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border).

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.

Usually the Examination Steamers will fly the blue ensign, but in certain circumstances they may fly the white ensign.

By night the steamer will carry:—

(a) Three *red* vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three *white* vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

(8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the signal letters of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal: "What ship is that?"

(9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any port when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that it is forbidden, except for the purpose of avoiding accident, to do any of the following things, without permission from the Examining Officer:—

To lower any boat.

To communicate with the shore or with other ships.

To move the ship.

To work cables.

To allow any person or thing to leave the ship.

(10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the port should be approached with caution.

(11) When the Examination Service is in force merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.

(12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

PART III.

MINE SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

H.M. Vessels engaged in mine-sweeping operations or exercises are hampered to a considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which they are engaged, these vessels will show the signals hereinafter mentioned. For the public safety all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, should endeavour to keep out of the way of vessels flying these signals and not approach them inside the distances mentioned herein, specially remembering that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair or group sweeping together.

1. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY DAY.

(a) By vessels working singly:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yardarm or where it can best be seen on that side on which it is dangerous to pass. (If a ball is shown at each yardarm it is dangerous to pass either side.)

Vessels showing this signal should not be approached nearer than 900 yards (822^m9).

(b) By vessels working in pairs or groups:

A black ball at the foremast head, and a similar ball at the yardarm or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous to pass.

Vessels should not pass within a distance of 400 yards (365^m8) astern of a pair or group of sweepers, or when more than one pair or group are working in company within a distance of 400 yards (365^m8) astern of the rear pair or group. They should on no account attempt to pass between pairs or groups working in company.

2. SIGNALS THAT WILL BE SHOWN BY NIGHT.

As for day, except that all round green lights will be used in a similar manner to and in place of the black balls.

CAUTION WITH REGARD TO SINGLE SHIPS APPROACHING SQUADRONS.

Former Notice.—No. 4 of 1922.

The attention of shipowners and masters is called to the danger to all concerned which is caused by single vessels approaching a squadron of Warships so closely as to involve risk of collision, or attempting to pass ahead of, or through, or to break the line of such squadron. It is necessary to warn mariners that on such occasions it would be in the interests of safety for single vessels to adopt timely measures to keep out of the way of and avoid passing through a squadron. In circumstances where a single vessel has been unable to take timely measures to keep out of the way of a squadron, the "Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea" must be the guide.

The foregoing caution has been rendered necessary owing to danger of sunken mines on the bottom. Attention is drawn to the cautionary note on the charts on this subject.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION REGARDING MINES.

1. Mariners are warned that a certain number of mines have sunk without exploding. It is possible that some of these mines lying on the bottom may still be dangerous. Surface vessels navigating these areas should therefore, whenever possible, have a clear depth of at least six feet (1^m8) between their keels and the bottom when in the vicinity of shoal water or in the approaches to ports and harbours which were subjected to mining operations during the war.

2. In removing prohibition upon vessels trawling, it is pointed out that a risk, although of a diminishing character, still exists.

The attention of all vessels trawling is drawn to the immunity which may be secured by the use of a suitable protective device to prevent mines entering the trawl.

As can be readily understood, it is not possible to predict for how long a period sunken unexploded mines remain dangerous, and consequently no unnecessary risk should be taken.

3. Mariners are notified that a small percentage of drifting mines are known to exist in a waterlogged condition, a fraction of which may be dangerous. This type of mine is hard to see, and special precautions are therefore necessary to ensure that a good lookout is kept. The striking of low floating flotsam should be avoided.

4. A serious accident has occurred to a vessel at anchor from the explosion of a drifting mine

which came into contact with an obstruction on the hull.

When vessels have to anchor in areas where drifting mines may be found it is necessary that all obstructions should as far as possible be removed and gangways triced up before dark in order to minimise risk.

5. In regard to the great importance of the destruction of mines with a view to prevention of loss of life and shipping, attention of Masters is called to the necessity for strict compliance with the provisions of Chapter II., "Admiralty Instructions for British Merchant Ships," June, 1919, and especially Section xiii., which includes the following:—

"Whenever practicable, vessels should attempt to sink or destroy mines by gun or rifle fire, but no mine is to be sunk in any fairway where the depth of water at low water spring tides is less than 7 fathoms (12^m8), except when a mine is drifting towards a vessel at anchor, and no vessel is to approach within 200 yards (182^m9) of a mine whilst attempting to sink or destroy it.

"The attention of Masters is drawn to the great desirability of taking every opportunity of sinking drifting mines, as their co-operation will help to free the seas of them within a reasonable period."

Before hoisting the mine flag or reporting a mine which has been left afloat, every care should be taken to confirm that the object actually is a mine, in order to prevent unnecessary confusion; the mine flag is a square flag white over blue diagonal.

Note.—This Notice is a repetition of the former Notice quoted above.

SEVENOAKS GAS.

(SPECIAL ORDER.)

(Application for Special Order under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade forthwith by the Sevenoaks Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company"), whose address is 88, High Street, Sevenoaks, in the county of Kent, for a special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), under Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

To repeal, alter or amend Sections 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 of the Sevenoaks Gas Act, 1881, and to make new provisions as to the issue by sale by auction or tender of shares or stock hereafter issued under the powers of the said Act.

To relieve the Company from the obligation to hold more than one general meeting in the year; to authorise the directors of the Company to declare and pay interim or half-yearly divi-

dends without the sanction or direction of a general meeting; to make provisions as to the closing of the register of transfers; and to relieve the Company and the directors thereof from the obligation to make up half-yearly balance-sheets.

To authorise the Company to form out of revenue as part of their working expenses (a) a Special Purposes Fund to be applicable to meet expenses incurred by reason of accidents, strikes or circumstances which due care and management could not have prevented or in the replacement or removal of plant or works; and (b) a Renewal Fund to be applicable in or towards defraying the cost of maintenance and renewal of the gas works, mains, pipes, plant, machinery and apparatus of the Company or for such other purposes as may be defined in the Order.

To authorise the Company to vary the prices charged for gas according to the purposes for which it is supplied.

To authorise the Company to charge and recover a minimum annual sum in respect of a supply of gas laid on for stand-by purposes to premises having a separate supply of electricity or gas.

To repeal Section 41 of the Sevenoaks Gas Act, 1876, and to make new provisions as to the qualifications for election as a director of the Company; to define certain actions by directors which shall not be deemed to disqualify them from holding office; to require notice to be given of candidature for election as a director and of opposition to re-election of directors; to empower the directors of the Company to act notwithstanding vacancies in their number.

To empower the directors of the Company to appoint one or more of their number as a managing director or managing directors, and to make special provisions as to the remuneration, powers and tenure of office of persons so appointed.

To relieve the Company from the obligation to supply gas for all or any purposes from any main of which the capacity is insufficient, or so as to interfere with the sufficiency of the gas required for lighting or domestic purposes.

To enlarge the powers of the Company of cutting off supplies of gas in cases where they are authorised to discontinue a supply, and to enable the Company to disconnect service pipes at the meter, and to prohibit the reconnection of such service pipes without the consent of the Company, and to confer upon the Company for such purposes all necessary powers of entry on premises.

To empower the Company and their officers and servants, where any person entering into occupation of premises previously supplied with gas by the Company does not require to take a supply of gas from the Company, or to hire from the Company all or any of the pipes, meters, fittings or apparatus on such premises, to enter into such premises and remove such pipes, meters, fittings and apparatus.

To provide that any engines, stoves, ranges, pipes and other gas fittings let for hire by the Company shall not be subject to distress or liable to be taken in legal proceedings, and shall remain the property of and removable by the Company though fixed to the premises in which they are installed.

To authorise the Company and any local authority, company, body or person producing, selling or distributing gas to enter into

and carry into effect contracts for the supply by one party to the other of gas in bulk.

To make provision as to the period of notice to be given by consumers before leaving premises supplied with gas, or before discontinuing a supply of gas.

To empower the Company to refuse to supply gas to consumers in debt to them for gas charges or meter rents in respect of other premises supplied with gas.

To require the use, repair, &c., of anti-fluctuators where gas is used for working engines, and of valves for preventing the passage of air into gas pipes or mains where air at high pressure is used in connection with the consumption of gas.

To make provision as to determining the liability of consumers in cases where meters are found to register erroneously.

To authorise the Company to lay down pipes, &c., in streets not dedicated to public use, and to open and break up such streets for that purpose.

To empower the Company, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, with respect to the laying of pipes, to lay down pipes and works in any street, road or highway, and to use the same for any purposes ancillary to their undertaking.

To empower the Company upon the lands next hereinafter described to manufacture and store gas, and to work up and convert residual products, and to erect and maintain gas works and other works and buildings (that is to say):—

Lands in the parish and urban district of Sevenoaks, in the county of Kent, comprising an area of 1 acre 3 roods and 29.5 perches, or thereabouts, belonging to and in the occupation of the Company, and bounded on the north-east by the road known as Crampton's road, on the north-west by other lands belonging to and in the occupation of the Company, and described in the Schedule to the Sevenoaks Gas Act, 1881, on the south-west in part by the Dartford-road, in part by the rear of premises known as Woodbine Cottages, belonging or reputed to belong to Charles Pierce, and in part by the rear of premises known as Springfield Villas, belonging or reputed to belong to Thomas Gear, and on the south-east in part by part of the last-mentioned premises and in part by No. 1, Woodbine Cottages aforesaid.

To authorise the Company to acquire additional lands by agreement.

To require consumers to pay to the Company the expenses of reconnecting any supply of gas cut off in consequence of the default of the consumer.

To enable the Company to provide cottages and buildings for persons in their employ, and offices, showrooms and other buildings, and to erect, maintain and let any such buildings.

To empower the directors to fix or alter from time to time the remuneration of the secretary and of the auditors of the Company.

To authorise the directors of the Company to grant pensions, allowances or other payments to employees of the Company or the widows, families or dependents of such employees, and to subscribe or make donations to funds raised for national emergencies and to infirmaries, hospitals and other institutions,

or to the benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Company, and to apply the funds and revenues of the Company for any such purpose.

To authorise the making of schemes for enabling the employees of the Company to participate in profits, and to make provision with respect to the transfer or disposal of shares or stock of the Company held by such employees, and money left by them on deposit with the Company, and to make rules and regulations for those purposes.

To make provisions as to the form and mode of service of notices by the Company on consumers of gas, as to the mode of recovery of demands and penalties, and authorising the inclusion of more than one sum in any summons or warrant issued for the purposes of the Order.

The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes, and confer other rights and privileges.

To repeal, alter or amend all or any other provisions of the Acts hereinbefore referred to, or either of them, and all or any provisions of any other Act or any Order relating to the Company.

To incorporate with the Order, with or without modifications, or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Acts, 1845 to 1889, the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gas Works Clauses Act, 1871.

Printed copies of the draft Special Order, an Ordnance Map showing the situation of the proposed works and the boundaries of the area of supply and an Ordnance Map showing the lands to be used for gas works have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace and County Council for the county of Kent, at his office at Maidstone, and at the above-mentioned offices of the Company, and a copy of the draft Special Order has been deposited with the Clerk of the Sevenoaks Urban District Council, at his office at Council Chambers, Argyle-road, Sevenoaks; with the Clerk of the Sevenoaks Rural District Council, at his office at Bank Chambers, High-street, Sevenoaks; and with the Clerk of the Bromley Rural District Council, at his office at the Municipal Buildings, Bromley; and printed copies of the draft Order may be obtained at the offices of the Company, and of the under-mentioned Parliamentary Agents, at the price of one shilling for each copy.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George-street, London, S.W. 1, and despatched on or before the 5th day of February, 1923.

Any such objection must state

- (a) the specific grounds of objection, and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the Company or to the undersigned Parliamentary Agents.
