PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction within the dominions of His Majesty the Shah of Persia:

And whereas the exercise of such jurisdiction is at present regulated by "The Persia Order in Council, 1889," and "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907 " (S.R. & O., 1907, No. 382), as amended by "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1912 " (S.R. & O., 1912, No. 535), and "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922" (S.R. & O., 1922, No. 766):

And whereas it is desirable further to define the limits within which "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907," applies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf, by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890 " (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:-

1. The third paragraph of Article 1 of "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1912," is hereby repealed, and the following paragraph is substituted

"The term 'the maritime provinces of Persia' means the provinces of Khuzistan, Fars, Laristan, Kerman, Persian Baluchistan, and those districts by custom and for the time being included under the authority of the Persian Governor of the Gulf ports.

2. This Order may be cited as "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment No. 2) Order in Council, 1922," and shall be read as one with "The Persian Coast and Islands Order in Council, 1907," "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1912," and "The Persian Coast and Islands (Amendment) Order in Council, 1922."

And the Most Honourable the Marquess Curzon of Kedleston, K.G., and the Right Honourable the Viscount Peel, G.B.E., two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to

them may respectively appertain.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

Regulations for the appointment by Competitive Selection of Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors under the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries for work in connection with Agricultural and Horticultural Education and Research.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by

the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt

of applications.

2. A candidate for the post of Assistant Inspector must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 32 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications; provided that in reckoning age for this purpose a candidate who served in the Army, Navy or Air Force between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918, may deduct from his actual age any period of service between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st December, 1919. For the post of Inspector the limits of age are 25 and 40.

3. A candidate must be a natural-born British subject and the child of a father also a natural-born British subject: provided that exception may be made in the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and provided that exception may be made as regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the war.

4. Until further notice preference will be given to candidates who served in His

Majesty's Forces during the war.

No person will be eligible who obtained from any tribunal established under the Military Service Acts, 1916 to 1918, exemption from service in His Majesty's Forces under those Acts on the ground of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of military service, or, although not so exempted, declined to comply with obligations imposed upon him by those Acts.

5. A candidate must satisfy the Ministry as to his academic and practical training in Agriculture or Horticulture. Preference will be given to candidates who have taken a course in Science, or Agriculture, or Horticulture, at a University, or at an Agricultural College. Where special qualifications are required particulars will be given in the advertisement.

6. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Ministry, and selected candidates will be interviewed by a Board consisting of representatives of the Ministry and of the Civil Service Commissioners, who will recommend those candidates whom they consider most suitable for appointment by the Ministry.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed on probation subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that

they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, health and character, and to the payment

of a fee of £4.

8. Service as Inspector or Assistant Inspector will be probationary for a period of two years, and the retention of the officer beyond that period will be conditional on the Ministry being satisfied that he has a good working knowledge of such of the subjects named in Appendix I as are required for his duties.

9. An Inspector or Assistant Inspector will then be eligible for consideration for appoint

ment to the established staff if and when a vacancy occurs thereon. Appointment to the established staff is conditional on the issue by the Civil Service Commissioners of a certificate of qualification; a fee of £4, being the balance of the prescribed fee of £8, is payable before the certificate of qualification can be issued.
