The following six Statutes, made by the Governing Body of King's College, Cambridge, on the 28th day of November, 1922, and sealed on the 29th day of December, 1922, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE to alter a Statute made by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the 28th day of November, 1922, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute E, Chapter I, made by the Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge it is enacted as follows:

CHAPTER I.

Number of Fellowships.

1. There shall be forty-six Fellowships in the College, inclusive of four Professorial Fellowships, but exclusive of Honorary, Additional, and Supernumerary Fellowships.

2. The following chapters of this Statute shall not, except in cases where it is expressly so provided, apply to Professorial Fellowships

or the holders thereof.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute E, Chapter I, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapter I of the said Statute E hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

CHAPTER I.

Number of Fellowships.

1. There shall be forty-six Fellowships in the College, inclusive of Pensioner Fellowships and four Professorial Fellowships, but exclusive of Honorary, Additional, and Supernumerary Fellowships.

2. The following chapters of this Statute shall not, except in cases where it is expressly

so provided, apply to Professorial Fellowships or the holders thereof.

A STATUTE to alter a Statute made by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the 28th day November, 1922, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute E, Chapter III, made by the Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge as amended by Statute dated the 14th day of September, 1914, and approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the 29th day of April, 1915, it is enacted as follows:

CHAPTER III. Election of Fellows.

1. An annual election of Fellows shall take place at such time as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time appoint. At this election all vacancies in the Fellowships shall be filled up, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The Annual Congregation may, so often as they think fit, order that if at the annual election of Fellows then next ensuing the number of vacant Fellowships shall exceed two, one of such Fellowships shall be suspended for a definite period not exceeding six years, and the Dividend of such suspended Fellowship shall be applied, during its suspension, to the payment of Lecturers or to other educational purposes.

3. At any election a Fellowship, which is not actually vacant, but which, so far as can be then foreseen, will be vacated on or before the first day of the Michaelmas Term then next following, may be treated as a vacant Fellow-

ship.

4. The intellectual qualifications of the candidates and their proficiency in any branch or branches of the University studies shall be ascertained in such manner as the Governing The electors shall Body shall determine. choose in each case that candidate (being otherwise duly qualified) whom they shall think most fit to be a Fellow of the College as a place of education, religion, learning, and research, but they shall not be bound to elect any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election.

5. The electors to Fellowships shall be the Provost, the Vice-Provost, and at least seven other Fellows, to be annually appointed by the

Governing Body.

6. No person shall vote at any election of Fellows who has not taken part in ascertaining the qualifications and proficiency of the candidates.

7. Before proceeding to make their election,

the electors shall severally make the following

'I do solemnly declare that I will vote for those candidates who are [that candidate who is in my judgment the most fit to be Fellows [a Fellow] of the College, as a place of educa-

tion, religion, learning, and research."
8. No candidate shall be elected a Fellow without the concurrence of at least one half of the electors present at the election; the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the Senior Fellow present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes. If for the want of such concurrence a Fellowship shall remain vacant, the Dividend thereof shall be applied to the purposes mentioned in the second section of this chapter.

9. Within fifteen days after the election, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and at least four of the Fellows, shall meet in the College Chapel and shall call upon the several Fellows elect to make the following

declaration:—
"I, M. N., elected a Fellow of this College, do solemnly declare that I will observe all the Statutes of the College, and will endeavour to the utmost of my power to promote the interests of the College, as a place of education, religion, learning, and research."

10. After this declaration the Fellow elect shall be admitted to the Fellowship by the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and shall enter upon the emoluments of the same as from the day of his election, provided that any person elected to a Fellowship under the third section of this chapter shall not be entitled to any emolument thereof until the same has become actually vacant.

11. If any person elected a Fellow shall be prevented by illness or other grave cause from being admitted within the fifteen days aforesaid, it shall be lawful to admit him at some later time, on his making the declaration here-

inbefore provided.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute E, Chapter III, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapter III of the said Statute E hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

CHAPTER III.

Election of Fellows.

1. An annual election of Fellows shall take place at such time as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time appoint. At this election all vacancies in the Fellowships shall be filled up, except as hereinafter provided.

2. The Annual Congregation may, so often as they think fit, order that if at the annual election of Fellows then next ensuing the number of vacant Fellowships shall exceed two, one of such Fellowships shall be suspended for a definite period not exceeding six years, and the Dividend of such suspended Fellowship shall be applied, during its suspension, to the payment of Lecturers or to other educational

The Annual Congregation may also suspend any vacant Fellowship for a stated period not exceeding six years, appropriating the Dividend of such Fellowship during that period to a fund, to be called the Pension Fund, applicable to the payment of the Pensions of Fellows and the special emoluments of Pensioner Fellows under the eleventh chapter of this Statute; provided that the total number of Fellowships so suspended, together with the number of Fellowships held under the Founder's Statutes and the Statutes of 1861, shall not at any time exceed six.

4. At any election a Fellowship, which is not actually vacant, but which, so far as can be then foreseen, will be vacated on or before the first day of the Michaelmas Term then next following, may be treated as a vacant Fellow-

ship.

5. The intellectual qualifications of the candidates and their proficiency in any branch or branches of the University studies shall be ascertained in such manner as the Governing Body shall determine. The electors shall choose in each case that candidate (being otherwise duly qualified) whom they shall think most fit to be a Fellow of the College as a place of education, religion, learning, and research, but they shall not be bound to elect any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election.

- 11. After this declaration the Fellow elect shall be admitted to the Fellowship by the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and shall enter upon the emoluments of the same as from the day of his election, provided that any person elected to a Fellowship under the fourth section of this chapter shall not be

entitled to any emolument thereof until the same has become actually vacant.

12. If any person elected a Fellow shall be prevented by illness or other grave cause from being admitted within the fifteen days aforesaid, it shall be lawful to admit him at some later time, on his making the declaration hereinbefore provided.

A STATUTE to alter a Statute made by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the .28th day of November, 1922, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute E, Chapter V, made by the Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), in relation to the King's College of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge as amended by Statute dated the 30th day of November, 1894, and approved by Her late Majesty the Queen in Council on the 29th day of June, 1895, it is enacted as follows:-

CHAPTER V.

Vacation of Fellowships.

1. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, every Fellow shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of a fixed term of six years, to be reckoned from the day of his election, except in the case of a Fellow elected under the second section of the third chapter of this Statute, in whose case the term of years shall be reckoned from the time of his entering upon the emoluments of his Fellowship; but there shall not be reckoned as part of such term of years any time during which a Fellow has held any one or more of the College and University Offices hereinafter mentioned.

2. Any Fellow who shall have held one or more of the said offices for not less than twenty-five years altogether, shall be excepted from the operation of the last preceding

section.

3. The College offices referred to in the two sections last preceding shall be such annual and educational offices as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine; and the University offices referred to in the same sections shall be the offices of Public Orator, Registrary, and Librarian, together with such other offices as a Congregation shall, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, from time to time determine.

4. A Congregation may, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, allow any Fellow eminent for learning or science, or whose studies are likely to be of material service in the promotion of any art or science, and whose Fellowship would but for such vote expire within the then ensuing year, to retain his Fellowship for a further period of five years, and if they shall have exercised this power four times in the case of any Fellow, they may, by a like vote, finally except such Fellow from the operation of the first section of this chapter.

- 5. A Fellow accepting a pension assigned to him under the provisions of Statute C. III. 6. shall thereby vacate his Fellowship, unless the Congregation at the time of assigning the pension shall, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, otherwise determine.
- 6. Any Fellow who shall come into any ecclesiastical preferment on the presentation of the College of the clear annual value of four hundred pounds (after deducting rates, taxes, and other legal charges, but not the pension, if any, paid to a former incumbent), shall thereby vacate his Fellowship; provided that any Fellow coming into any such ecclesiastical preferment may retain his Fellowship, if not otherwise sooner terminable, for one year after the avoidance of such preferment by the previous holder.
- 7. No Fellowship shall be tenable with any office or emolument on the foundation of any other College in the University, or of any College in the University of Oxford, or of Trinity College, Dublin.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute E, Chapter V, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapter V of the said Statute E hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

CHAPTER V.

Vacation of Fellowships.

- 1. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter mentioned, every Fellow shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of a fixed term of six years, to be reckoned from the day of his election, except in the case of a Fellow elected under the fourth section of the third chapter of this Statute, in whose case the term of years shall be reckoned from the time of his entering upon the emoluments of his Fellowship; but there shall not be reckoned as part of such term of years any time during which a Fellow has held any one or more of the College and University Offices hereinafter mentioned.
- 2. Any Fellow who shall have held one or more of the said offices for not less than twentyfive years altogether, shall be excepted from the operation of the last preceding section.
- 3. The College offices referred to in the two sections last preceding shall be such annual and educational offices as the Annual Congregation shall from time to time determine; and the University offices referred to in the same sections shall be the offices of Public Orator, Registrary, and Librarian, together with such other offices as a Congregation shall, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, from time to time determine.
- 4. A Congregation may, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, allow any Fellow eminent for learning or science, or whose studies are likely to be of material service in the promotion of any art

or science, and whose Fellowship would but for such vote expire within the then ensuing year, to retain his Fellowship for a further period of five years, and if they shall have exercised this power four times in the case of any Fellow, they may, by a like vote, finally except such Fellow from the operation of the first section of this chapter.

- 5. A Fellow accepting a pension assigned to him under the provisions of Statute C. III. 6. shall thereby vacate his Fellowship, unless the Congregation at the time of assigning the pension shall, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, otherwise determine.
- 6. Any Fellow who shall come into any ecclesiastical preferment on the presentation of the College of the clear annual value of four hundred pounds (after deducting rates, taxes, and other legal charges, but not the pension, if any, paid to a former incumbent), shall thereby vacate his Fellowship; provided that any Fellow coming into any such ecclesiastical preferment may retain his Fellowship, if not otherwise sconer terminable, for one year after the avoidance of such preferment by the previous holder.
- 7. No Fellowship shall be tenable with any office or emolument on the foundation of any other College in the University, or of any College in the University of Oxford, or of Trinity College, Dublin.

CHAPTER VI.

Professorial Fellowships.

- 1. There shall be in the College four Professorial Fellowships, which shall be established and held according to the terms and conditions prescribed by the Statutes of the University for Professorial Fellowships made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.
- 2. The holders of Professorial Fellowships shall have the same privileges and emoluments as the other Fellows of the College.
- 3. The electors mentioned in the third chapter of this Statute shall be the electors to Professorial Fellowships.

- 4. Upon the vacation of a Professorial Fellowship the electors may forthwith elect any qualified person thereto, or may permit such Fellowship to remain vacant until the electors for the time being think fit to fill up the same.
- 5. The manner of electing to Professorial Fellowships, and all proceedings relating to the election, shall be in the discretion of the electors, provided that the actual election shall be made at a meeting of the electors, and that no election shall be made without the concurrence of at least one half of the electors present at the election, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior Fellow present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes.

· 6. The ninth, tenth, and eleventh sections of the third chapter of this Statute shall apply to persons elected to Professorial Fellowships:

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute E, Chapter VI, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapter VI of the said Statute E hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

CHAPTER VI.

Professorial Fellowships.

- 1. There shall be in the College four Professorial Fellowships, which shall be established and held according to the terms and conditions prescribed by the Statutes of the University for Professorial Fellowships made under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.
- 2. The holders of Professorial Fellowships shall have the same privileges and emoluments as the other Fellows of the College.
- 3. The electors mentioned in the third chapter of this Statute shall be the electors to Professorial Fellowships.
- 4. Upon the vacation of a Professorial Fellowship the electors may forthwith elect any qualified person thereto, or may permit such Fellowship to remain vacant until the electors for the time being think fit to fill up the same.
- 5. The manner of electing to Professorial Fellowships, and all proceedings relating to the election, shall be in the discretion of the electors, provided that the actual election shall be made at a meeting of the electors, and that no election shall be made without the concurrence of at least one half of the electors present at the election, the Provest, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior Fellow present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes.
- 6. The tenth, eleventh and twelfth sections of the third chapter of this Statute shall apply to persons elected to Professorial Fellowships.

Whereas it appeared to us The Provost and Scholars of Our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the 28th day of November, 1922, expedient to add in manner hereinafter appearing an additional chapter to Statute E and the same was passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting. Now therefore we The Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), submit such addition to the said Statute E for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council (that is to say):

CHAPTER XI.

Pensioner Fellows.

- 1. Any Fellow, other than a Professorial or Honorary or Additional or Supernumerary Fellow, who shall have reached fifty-five years of age, and shall have been excepted from the operation of Statute E. V. 1, or shall have reached sixty years of age and have held a Fellowship for twenty years or more, shall be qualified for election by a Congregation to a Pensioner Fellowship, provided that he does not hold a pension from the College, or emoluments of an annual value exceeding four hundred pounds in the aggregate derived from any of the following sources, namely: (i) tenure of an office or offices in the College, or (ii) a pension from any other authority than the College, or (iii) a regular appointment or appointments from the University or other authority, or (iv) ecclesiastical preferment. And a Congregation shall have power to decide any question as to the validity of such qualification, and the date from which the emoluments of a Pensioner Fellow shall accrue.
- 2. A Fellow so qualified shall be entitled to claim election to a Pensioner Fellowship.
- 3. A Congregation may, by the vote of an actual majority of the whole Governing Body, elect to a Pensioner Fellowship a Fellow who is not qualified for election under the first section of this chapter, if he has held a Fellowship, which may be a Professorial Fellowship, for twenty years or more; provided that any pension which he may be receiving from the College shall thereupon lapse.

4. A Pensioner Fellow shall be excepted from the operation of Statute E. V. 1.

- 5: The Dividend of Pensioner Fellows shall in each year be fixed at such a rate that the payments to them shall amount in the aggregate to twenty times the Dividend of an ordinary Fellow, less the total amount paid to Fellows under the Founder's Statutes and Fellows under the Statutes of 1861, subject to the condition that it shall not exceed twice the Dividend of an ordinary Fellow. In other respects a Pensioner Fellow shall be entitled to all the privileges and emoluments of a Fellow. He shall retain his seniority in the order of Fellows.
- 6. A Fellow who has been elected to a Pensioner Fellowship may resume his former status upon signifying in writing to the Provost his wish to do so, and obtaining the consent of the Governing Body.
- 7. The tenth chapter of this Statute shall apply to Pensioner Fellows.

CHAPTER I.

. : The Common Seal.

- 1. The Common Seal of the College shall be kept in some secure place, in a chest fastened with three different locks, the keys of which shall be severally kept by the Provost, the Vice-Provost, and the Senior Bursar residing in College; and when any one of them is absent from College he shall deposit his key with some Fellow as a deputy; provided that no person shall have two keys in his keeping at the same time.
- 2. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or instrument, except in the presence of the Provost, or, in his absence, the Vice-Provost, and four of the Fellows, and in pursuance of a resolution of the Governing Body.

And whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute M, Chapter I, in manner hereinafter appearing: Now therefore we the Provost and Scholars of the said College do hereby in exercise of the powers given us by the 54th section of the said Act alter and amend Chapter I of the said Statute M hereinbefore set out by substituting therefor the following (that is to say):

M.—MISCELLANEOUS.

CHAPTER I.

- 1. The Common Seal of the College shall be kept in some secure place in a chest fastened with two different locks, one of the keys of which shall be kept by the Provost or Vice-Provost, and the other by one of the Bursars; and when either holder of a key is absent from Cambridge he shall deposit his key with some Fellow as deputy; provided that no person shall have the two keys in his keeping at the same time.
- 2. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except in the presence of two persons, one of whom shall be either the Provost, or Vice-Provost or one of the Bursars, and the other of whom shall be one of the Fellows, and in pursuance of a resolution of the Governing Body. Such resolution, in lieu of referring to a specific deed or instrument, may in general terms authorize the sealing and delivery of any class of deed or instrument.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS IN THE WHOLESALE MANUFACTURING AND ALL OTHER BRANCHES OF THE TRADE EXCEPT THE RETAIL BRANCH.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated respectively 31st October, 1918, and 1st August, 1922, the Trade Board established in Scotland under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, for the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VALY the General Minimum Time Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Wholesale Manufacturing and all other Branches of the Trade except the Retail Branch, as at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice W.D.S. (9), the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule below.

(b) No Female Learner shall be entitled to the full General Minimum Time Rate applicable to workers other than Learners under Section I of this Part of this Schedule until she has attained the age of 18 years, notwithstanding any employment she may have had. Provided that, in determining the age of entry and the length of employment all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(c) A Learner's Certificate must be applied for to the Trade Board in respect of every Worker whom it is desired to employ at the special lower rates fixed for Learners. Unless a Learner's Certificate has been obtained, or application has been made to the Trade Board therefor, which has been acknowledged and is still under consideration, and unless the other conditions of Learnership laid down in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule are complied with, the minimum rate payable is that for Workers other than Learners.

skill and experience in the class of work in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice W.D.S. (9), dated 23rd June, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board, in the above-mentioned Part of the Notice W.D.S. (9), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

For the purpose of this Notice:-

Section I.—A Female Learner is a worker who:—

- (a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning one of the branches of trade as carried on by the employer or the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part V of this Schedule; and
- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II:

The expression "Homeworker" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION III:

The Retail Branch of the trade is that branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light-Clothing Trade in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the proposed minimum rates of wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all female workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch, other than the Retail Branch, of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), and as set out in Part V of the Trade Board's Notice W.D.S. (9).

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 19th day of January, 1923. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (Scotland), 1, Whitehall Gardens, London, S.W. 1.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.
