GLAMORGAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1923 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Glamorgan and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 2) shall be read and have effect as if the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area described in the Schedule hereto were substituted respectively for the Prohibited Area and Controlled Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the GLAMORGAN AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Area.

An Area in the administrative county of Glamorgan, comprising such portions of the parishes of Aberdare, Rhondda, Mountain Ash and Llanwonno as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the School in North Road, Ferndale, and proceeding in a generally north-westerly direction along North Road, The Parade, Ffalldau Terrace, Richards Street, Maerdy Road, Oeriddwen Street to Maerdy Police Station, thence along the Maerdy-Aberdare Road in a generally northerly direction via the Railway Station and Bedd-Eiddil to the point where the road crosses the Nant Aman Fach, thence in a generally easterly direction along the Nant Aman Fach to its junction with the Ffyrnant at Cwmaman, thence proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the Ffyrnant to the point where it crosses the foot-path near Caer Coed Cue Plantation, thence in a southerly direction along that foot-path passing the southern end of that

plantation and continuing in a southerly direction to Llanwonno, thence in a south-westerly direction along the foot-path from Llanwonno, via Pen-yr-heol, Old Quarry to the Bridgend Hotel, Pontygwaith, thence proceeding through Tylorstown, by East Road, Oakland Terrace, Dyferyn Street and High Street, Ferndale, to the point of commencement.

Controlled Area.

An Area in the administrative county of Glamorgan, comprising the petty sessional division of Miskin Higher and the parish of Rhondda (except such portions of that petty sessional division and parish as are comprised within the Prohibited Area described above).

CESHIRE (HUNTINGTON DISTRICT)
(FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE)
ORDER OF 1923 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The Cheshire (Huntington District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 shall apply only to the Prohibited Areas described in the Schedule hereto.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the CESHIRE (HUNTINGTON DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Order referred to in Article 1.
