The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of January, 1923 (C.W.15193/22), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas owing to the fact that all Divisional Chief Officers and Chief Officers of Your Majesty's Coast Guard Service, Old Force, other than Divisional Chief Officers W/T and Chief Officers W/T have become surplus to requirements, we consider it desirable that special provision should be made for placing these Officers on the Retired List:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Regulations set forth in the attached Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“ SCHEDULE.

“ 1. The Regulations in this Schedule to apply to all Divisional Chief Officers and Chief Officers of the Coast Guard, Old Force, other than Divisional Chief Officers Wireless Telegraphy, and Chief Officers Wireless Telegraphy, who were on the Active List on the 20th October, 1922, and to have effect from the 20th October, 1922.

“ 2. Such Officers to be placed on the Retired List on the 20th January, 1923, or allowed to retire voluntarily before that date, irrespective of their eligibility to retire voluntarily under ordinary Regulations, with retired pay and gratuity on retirement calculated in each case according to the following Regulations.

“ 3. An Officer of the age of 50 or above on the 20th January, 1923, to receive the rate of retired pay which he would have received had he continued to serve until he attained the age of 55 in the rank held on the 20th October,

1922, calculated on the scale provided in Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-section XI, as amended by Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920, and to be granted in addition a gratuity on retirement of £37 10s. for each complete period of 3 months intervening between the day preceding the commencement of retired pay and the day on which the age of 55 is attained, subject to a maximum gratuity of £500 in each case.

" 4. An Officer who will not have reached the age of 50 on the 20th January, 1923, to receive the rate of retired pay which he would have received had he continued to serve until the 20th January, 1925, in the rank held on the 20th October, 1922, calculated on the scale provided in Order in Council of the 22nd January, 1920, Schedule V, Section IX, Sub-section XI, as amended by Order in Council of the 9th November, 1920, and to be granted in addition a gratuity on retirement of £500.

" 5. The retired pay of a Chief Officer who was in charge of a Wireless Telegraph or War Signal Station on the 20th October, 1922, to be assessed as if he had continued in charge of such station until the 20th January, 1923, inclusive, irrespective of whether he elects to retire before the 20th January, 1923, but any further period of such an Officer's prospective service subsequent to the 20th January, 1923, reckoning for retired pay under Regulations 3 and 4 of this Schedule to be reckoned as ordinary service in the rank of Chief Officer.

" 6. The rate of retired pay granted to an Officer under these Regulations in no circumstances to exceed the maximum laid down in the above mentioned Orders in Council for the rank in which he was serving on the 20th October, 1922.

" 7. All rates of retired pay granted under these Regulations to be subject to review on the 1st July, 1924, and subsequently.

" 8. Nothing in these Regulations shall preclude the Admiralty from retiring any Officer during the currency of the scheme under any other Regulations which may be applicable to his case."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of January, 1923 (C.W./N.P.1. 3290/22), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having

been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920 (Schedule V, Section VI), to approve, *inter alia*, of the payment to Captains appointed as Chief of the Staff or Flag Captain of Command Money at the rate of 7s. a day and Entertaining Allowance at the rate of 5s. a day :

"And whereas under the conditions at present prevailing it is frequently necessary for the Commander-in-Chief, H.M. Ships and Vessels, China Station, to be absent from his Flagship on duty for varying periods, and we are of opinion that during such absences if in excess of 9 days the allowances referred to may be inadequate to compensate the Officer holding the combined appointment of Chief of the Staff and Flag Captain to the Commander-in-Chief, China Station, for the increased responsibility and expenses for messing and entertaining to which he becomes liable :

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve, with effect as from 1st April, 1920, the payment of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance to the Officer appointed as Chief of the Staff and Flag Captain to the Commander-in-Chief, China, at the rates of 10s. and 8s. a day respectively for the whole of every period during which the Commander-in-Chief has been or may be absent on duty from the Flag Ship for more than 9 days, provided that the ship commanded by the Flag Captain is one which apart from her employment as Flag Ship would carry these rates when in full commission, this arrangement to be subject to the continuance of the special conditions as aforesaid.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 30 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted that the Admiralty with the approval of Your Majesty in Council may, from time to time, make free grants of land, part of the lands vested in them by virtue of this Act, for the erection of buildings and providing conveniences for places of worship, residence of ministers, education of

children or other public purposes (so that any such grant of land does not include any right to the minerals under the land granted, or comprise more than two acres in any one parish):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the free grant to the Urban District Council of Newburn in the County of Northumberland of a piece of land measuring 74 square yards, at present vested in the Admiralty by virtue of the aforesaid Act, for the purpose of improving the junction of the Ponteland Road with the Newcastle and Hexham Road near Throckley Church."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

**W**HEREAS by Section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is, amongst other things, enacted that if by any law or ordinance made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, direct that such law or ordinance or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the said Act:

And whereas by an Ordinance enacted by

the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, the short title of which is the Extradition Ordinance, 1922, provision has been made that all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by the Governor under the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1906, in relation to the surrender of a fugitive criminal may within the Colony be exercised and done by any Deputy of the Governor thereto authorized:

And whereas it is provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on the day on which the Governor makes known by Proclamation published in the Gazette that His Majesty has by Order in Council directed that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Straits Settlements as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, direct that the Straits Settlements Extradition Ordinance, 1922, shall have effect in the Straits Settlements without modification or alteration as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by Section 32 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, it is, amongst other things, enacted that if the Legislature of a British Possession pass any Act or Ordinance for determining the Court, Judge, Magistrate, Officer or person by whom and the manner in which any jurisdiction or power under the said Act is to be exercised, or in any manner for the carrying of the said Act or any part thereof into effect in that Possession, it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to direct, if it seems to His Majesty in Council necessary or proper for carrying into effect the objects of the said Act, that such Act or Ordinance as aforesaid or any part thereof shall with or without modification or alteration be recognised and given effect to throughout His Majesty's Dominions and on the High Seas as if it were part of the said Act:

And whereas by an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of the Straits Settlements with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, the short title of which is the Fugitive Offenders Ordinance, 1922, provision has been made that all powers vested in and acts authorized or required to be done by the Governor under the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915, in relation to the return of a fugitive may within the Colony be exercised and done by any Deputy of the Governor thereto authorized:

And whereas it is provided by the said Ordinance that the said Ordinance shall come

into operation on the day on which the Governor makes known by Proclamation published in the Gazette that His Majesty has by Order in Council directed that the said Ordinance shall have effect in the Straits Settlements as if it were part of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, and in exercise of the power in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, direct that the Straits Settlements Fugitive Offenders Ordinance, 1922, shall without modification or alteration be recognised and given effect to throughout His Majesty's Dominions and on the High Seas as if it were part of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Devonshire, K.G., G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Section 444 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that where the Legislature of any British Possession by any enactment provides for the fixing, marking, and certifying of load-lines on ships registered in that Possession, and it appears to His Majesty the King that that enactment is based on the same principles as the provisions of the said Act relating to load-lines, and is equally effective for ascertaining and determining the maximum load-lines to which those ships can be safely loaded in salt water, and for giving notice of the load-line to persons interested, His Majesty in Council may declare that any load-line fixed and marked, and any certificate given in pursuance of that enactment shall, with respect to ships so registered, have the same effect as if it had been fixed, marked, or given in pursuance of the said Act:

And whereas the Legislature of the British Possession of Hong Kong by certain provisions of the Merchant Shipping Ordinances, 1899 to 1917, have provided for the fixing, marking, and certifying of load-lines on ships registered in that Possession:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty the King that such provisions of the said enactments are based on the same principles as the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and are equally effective for ascertaining and determining the maximum load-lines to which ships registered in that Possession can be safely loaded in salt water, and for giving notice of the load-line to the persons interested:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and doth hereby declare, that any load-line fixed and marked, and any certificate given in pursuance of the said Ordinances shall, with

respect to ships registered in Hong Kong, have the same effect as if it had been fixed, marked, or given in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 23rd day of November, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1921, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Barnoldswick and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bracewell, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Bradford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur, Bishop of Bradford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Barnoldswick and Bracewell duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bradford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bradford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas each of the said Benefices of Barnoldswick and Bracewell is now full, the Reverend Canon Frederick William Patten being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Barnoldswick, and the Reverend Herbert West being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bracewell:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur, Bishop of Bradford (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Barnoldswick and the said Benefice of Bracewell shall be permanently united together, and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'the United Benefice of Barnoldswick with Bracewell' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said

Benefice of Bracewell only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Barnoldswick and the then Incumbent of Bracewell shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if the said Benefice of Barnoldswick only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Bracewell: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Bracewell if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Barnoldswick shall have been instituted to Barnoldswick subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice: but if he shall have been instituted to Barnoldswick before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Barnoldswick following such avoidance of the Benefice of Bracewell, and the then Incumbent of Bracewell shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That a curate be appointed to assist in performing the duties of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Barnoldswick shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, (a) that if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme both of the said Benefices of Barnoldswick and Bracewell shall be vacant then in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to the United Benefice for ever thereafter the Patron of the said Benefice of Barnoldswick shall have the first and third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Bracewell shall have the second turn but otherwise (b) that in each series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination for ever thereafter, the Patron of the said Benefice of Bracewell shall have the first turn, and the Patron of the said Benefice of Barnoldswick shall have the second and third turns.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected, together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical

Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bradford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bradford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 1st day of June, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Luke, Norland and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union

of the said two Benefices of Saint Luke, Norland, and Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Wakefield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Wakefield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Wakefield embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Saint Luke, Norland, and Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, are now full, the Reverend William Christopher Bell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Norland, and the Reverend Maurice Curteis Elphinstone being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge:

"And whereas the Vicar for the time being of the Vicarage of the Parish of Halifax in the said Diocese of Wakefield is the Patron of each of the said Benefices of Saint Luke, Norland, and Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said George Rodney, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Norland, and the said Benefice of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sowerby Bridge with Norland,' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Act provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and that (until a new Table of Fees for the United Parish be fixed by proper authority) the Marriage Fees for the said Parish of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, shall be the Marriage Fees for the United Parish, and Burial, Monumental and all other fees shall be the same as the present fees for the said Parish of Saint Luke, Norland.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Norland, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith, if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, and the then Incumbent of Saint Luke, Norland, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Christ Church, Sowerby Bridge, only shall be then vacant, the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Luke, Nor-

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

## (A) FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:—

## (1) ON ANY DAY OTHER THAN SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS, AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

- (a) For the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (b) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (c) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ,  $11\frac{1}{2}$  and  $13\frac{1}{2}$ , respectively.

## (2) ON SATURDAY in respect of:—

## (a) That class of worker who customarily attends on SIX DAYS a week:—

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours of work:—

- (i) For the first four hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday, the Minimum Rate applicable to the class of workers specified in this sub-paragraph is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule.

## (b) That class of worker who customarily attends on FIVE DAYS a week:—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday), One and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
- (ii) For the second two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (iii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

## (3) On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

NOTE.—The Overtime Rates set out in Paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Sub-section are payable as provided above, in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b) and (c), (2) (a) and (b) (ii) and (iii), and (3) of this Sub-section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

## (B) FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

- (i) MALE WORKERS OF 22 YEARS OF AGE AND OVER employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, or the appropriate Piece-work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

- (ii) MALE WORKERS UNDER 22 YEARS OF AGE employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

SECTION III.—In the application of the Overtime Rates set out in this Part of the Schedule the following provisions apply :—

- (a) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provision the word "Sunday" were substituted for "Saturday" and the word "Saturday" for "Sunday."
- (b) Any other day (subject to the proviso contained in this Sub-Section) may, notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in any case in which such substitution is made, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provision such short day were substituted for "Saturday," and "Saturday" substituted for such short day.

Provided that the short day substituted for Saturday shall not be a Sunday except in the case of workers coming within Sub-section (a) of this Section.

### PART III.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Schedule the following definitions shall apply :—

- (a) A MEASURE CUTTER is a person who is employed in any process of Measure Cutting, and is capable of taking a complete set of measures and of cutting any garment for a Male Person from model patterns, and has sufficient technical knowledge to draft men's trousers and alter the balance and distribution of widths, lengths, etc., for any garment for a Male Person (excluding alterations to stock patterns).
- (b) A CUTTER (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a person who is substantially employed in one or more of the following processes, that is to say :—
- (i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials ;
  - (ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials ;
  - (iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials ; and
  - (iv) Dividing ; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting, or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.
- (c) A KNIFE CUTTER or KNIFEMAN is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.
- (d) A FITTER UP is a person who is employed in Fitting-up ; that is a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.
- (e) A TAILOR is a person who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of garment.
- (f) A PRESSER is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.
- (g) A MACHINIST is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.
- (h) A PASSER is a person who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made-up or upon their completion.
- (i) An UNDER-PRESSER is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than Pressing-off.
- (j) A PLAIN MACHINIST is a person who is employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.
- (k) A WAREHOUSEMAN is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock.
- (l) A PACKER is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials.
- (m) A PORTER is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials.

SECTION II.—The expression "London District," means the Metropolitan and City of London Police Districts.

SECTION III.—The expression "Heavy Cotton Clothing," means articles of clothing for Male Persons made wholly or mainly of cords, moles or other fustians, jeans, drills or other similar cotton material, but excluding gabardine raincoats.

### PART IV.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all MALE WORKERS in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, and set out in Section II below.

PART IV—*continued.*

SECTION II.—The Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows :—

**MEN'S AND BOYS' Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring, and all Men's and Boys' Retail Bespoke Tailoring** carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of men's and boys' tailoring, which is not included within the scope of the Regulations, dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the constitution and proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring ;

*including—*

- (1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring ;
- (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating or re-making of the garments ;
- (2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments ;
- (3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.
- (4) All warehousing, packing and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question.

*But excluding—*

- (1) The making of headgear ;
- (2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments ;
- (3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

NOTE.—The employment of young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

## PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board and set out above and specifying the 1st day of February, 1923, as the date from which they shall become effective.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this paragraph shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½, 11½ and 13½ respectively.

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours of work:—

- (i) For the first four hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first four hours of Overtime, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(NOTE.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday the Minimum Rate applicable to the class of worker specified in this sub-paragraph is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule.)

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

NOTE.—The Overtime Rates set out in paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Sub-section are payable as provided above in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

PART III—*continued.*

- (4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, One-and-a Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b) and (c), (2) (a) and (b) (ii) and (iii) and (3) of this Sub-section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

**(B) FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK :—**

- (1) ALL FEMALE WORKERS (other than Learners) employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.
- (2) FEMALE LEARNERS, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable (or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been made effective not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable) an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

SECTION III —In the application of the Overtime Rates set out in this Part of this Schedule the following provisions apply :—

- (a) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions the word "Sunday" were substituted for "Saturday" and the word "Saturday" for "Sunday."
- (b) Any other day (subject to the proviso contained in this Sub-Section) may, notwithstanding anything contained in this Schedule, be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in any case in which such substitution is made, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions such short day were substituted for "Saturday" and "Saturday" for such short day.

Provided that the short day substituted for Saturday shall not be a Sunday except in the case of workers coming within Sub-section (a) of this Section.

## PART IV.

For the purpose of this Schedule the following definitions shall apply :—

SECTION I.—CUTTERS, TRIMMERS, and FITTERS-UP are workers who are substantially occupied in one or more of the following processes, that is to say :—

- (a) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings, or other materials.
- (b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.
- (c) Cutting cloth or linings, or other materials.
- (d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.
- (e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up.
- (f) Fitting up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn, or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

SECTION II —A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who :—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and
- (b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certificate or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in any branch or branches of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring, specified in Part V of this Schedule, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—A HOMEWORKER is a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

#### PART V.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all FEMALE WORKERS in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 15th January, 1920, and set out in Section II. below.

SECTION II.—The Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations is as follows :—

MEN'S AND BOYS' Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring; and all Men's and Boys' Retail Bespoke Tailoring carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments, and any other branch of Men's and Boys' Tailoring which is not included within the scope of the Regulations, dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Constitution and Proceedings of a Trade Board in Great Britain for Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

*Including :—*

- (1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of men's or boys' tailored garments, except where included within the scope of the above-mentioned Regulations with respect to Retail Bespoke Tailoring;
- (b) The cleaning of such garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments;
- (2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;
- (3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;
- (4) All warehousing, packing, and other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the branches of tailoring in question;

*But excluding :—*

- (1) The making of head-gear;
- (2) The making of rubberised or oilskin garments;
- (3) The making of boys' ready-made washing suits or sailor suits, where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of garments to be worn by women or girls, or by children without distinction of sex.

NOTE.—The employment of women, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

#### PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied and fixed by the Trade Board and set out above and specifying the 1st day of February, 1923, as the date from which they should become effective.

## SECTION II.
