

Roborough Down to the road junction about 400 yards south-west of Buckland Monachorum Church.

Rural District of Totnes—

1. Road from the cross roads at Ashprington Cross via Coombepark Farm to the boundary of the Totnes Borough near Bowden House.

2. Road from the Harbertonford-Austin's Close road near the Chapel via Painsford and Bow to the road junction south of the School at Ashprington

3. Road from the Paignton-Brixham main road at Churston Ferrers railway bridge via Galmpton to Greenway Ferry on the River Dart.

4. Road from the Totnes-Berry Pomeroy main road about 150 yards north-west of the Church at Berry Pomeroy via the Church and Berry Barton Farm to the cross roads about 100 yards south-west of the School at Berry Pomeroy.

Road from the cross roads about 100 yards south-west of the School at Berry Pomeroy via Glazegate Cross to the boundary of the Paignton Urban District near Barton Pines.

4A. Road from the cross roads at Glazegate Cross via the road junction west of Tenner's Bottom and Berry Castle Lodge to

its junction with the Berry Pomeroy-Glazegate Cross road, including the branch road running from Berry Castle Lodge for about 200 yards in a northerly direction.

5. Road from the Totnes-Newton Abbot main road at Shadrack Cross via Shadrack to its junction with the Lillisford-Afton road north-west of Afton.

6. Road from the Aish-Waddeton road at Pords Bridge via Stoke Gabriel, Rydon and Four Cross Lanes to the boundary of the Paignton Urban District near Whitehill Cottages, including the loop road via the school at Stoke Gabriel.

7. Road from the Stoke Gabriel-Collaton St. Mary road at Four Cross Lanes via Pords Bridge and passing west of Waddeton to the boundary of the Paignton Urban District south of Waddeton Post, including the loop road through Waddeton.

10. Road from Holne Village to the road junction at Play Cross about 300 yards south of the village. Road from the road junction at Play Cross via Holne Moor to the boundary of the Tavistock Rural District at Saddle Bridge.

11. Road from the Totnes-Tigley-South Brent main road at Venton Cross to its junction with the Totnes-Ugborough main road at Fork Cross.

The Order described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby revoked on the eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-three, and all licences authorising the move-

ment of animals in relation to any area to which the Glamorgan and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922, the Glamorgan and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1923 and 1923 (Nos. 2 and 3), and the Order hereby revoked applied shall cease to operate as from that date.
