IT having been represented to His Majesty in Council by the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in a Memorial sealed with the seal of the said Governor and Company, and dated the 21st day of December, 1922:—

(1) That between the 9th June, 1903, the date of the preparation of the last Memorial to His Majesty in Council, upon which His Majesty's Order in Council of the 10th day of August, 1903, was made, and the presentation of the new Memorial of the 21st day of December, 1922, certain Bankers in the latter Memorial named, who, on the 6th day of May, 1844, were issuing their own Bank Notes to the extent of sums amounting in the aggregate to the sum of £1,923,155, have ceased to issue their own Bank Notes:

(2) That the total of the authorized issues of Bankers who, subsequently to the said 6th day of May, 1844, have ceased to issue their own Bank Notes, including the above sum of £1,923,155, amounts to £8,631,647, whereof the proportionate part of two-thirds amounts to £5,754,431:

(3) That the aggregate increase of issues by the Bank of England of their own Bank

Notes authorized by Orders of Her late Majesty in Council, under the provisions of the hereinafter mentioned Act, during the same period, have amounted only to £4,450,000: and

(4) That the difference between such aggregate increase of issues by the Bank of England and the proportionate part of two-thirds of the aforesaid lapsed issues by other Banks is £1,304,431.

And the said Governor and Company having thereupon humbly made application to be authorised under the provisions of the Act passed in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 32, intituled, "An Act to regulate the issue of Banks' Notes, and for giving to the Governor and Company of the Bank of England certain privileges for a limited period," to increase the amount of securities in the Issue Department of the Bank of England, and to extend the issues of their own Bank Notes to an amount not exceeding the above mentioned difference between the increase of issues by the Bank of England that has been already authorized and two-thirds of the aggregate issues by the Banks that have lapsed subsequently to the 6th day of May, 1844:

Now, therefore, it is this day ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Governor and Company shall be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to increase the amount of securities in the Issue Department of the Bank of England to the extent of £1,300,000 beyond the total sum or value of £14,000,000 in the said Act mentioned, and of the further sums of £475,000, £175,000, £350,000, £750,000, £450,000, £250,000, £350,000, £975,000, £400,000, and £275,000, authorized by the Orders in Council dated the 7th day of December, 1855, the 26th day of June, 1861, the 3rd day of February, 1866, the 1st day of April, 1881, the 15th day of September, 1887, the 8th day of February, 1890, the 29th day of January, 1894, the 3rd day of March, 1900, the 11th day of August, 1902, and the 10th day of August, 1903, and thereupon to issue additional Bank of England Notes from the said Issue Department, in manner in the said Act mentioned, to the amount of £1,300,000.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend a Levée should make a written application, *as detailed below*.

2. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants of Counties, Deputy Lieutenants of Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than those mentioned hereafter, should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace. No applications can be received from gentlemen in the foregoing categories wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Army, except Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards, and those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Secretary, War Office.

Officers of the Household Cavalry and the Brigade of Guards will communicate, through their Regimental Headquarters, with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace, to obtain their cards for attendance or presentation.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or presentation, through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, for attendance or for presentation, from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards, whether for attendance or presentation, from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Secretary, War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their application in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lord Mayors and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications, whether for attendance or for presentation, through the Private Secre-

tary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those already mentioned, will similarly make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. All gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will adopt the same procedure, and will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various Offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of each Levée.

HAT, CAP AND MILLINERY TRADE
BOARD (SCOTLAND).OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR
MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN
THE WHOLESALE CLOTH HAT AND
CAP MAKING BRANCH OF THE
TRADE.

Effective as from 12th February, 1923.

NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by any employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 18th February, 1923.

The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Workers in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the Trade are set out as follows:—

(i) For Male Workers in Part III and in Section II of Part IV of the Notice H.M.S. (6).

(ii) For Female Workers in Part II of the Notice H.M.S. (9).

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR
MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS IN
THE WHOLESALE CLOTH HAT AND
CAP MAKING BRANCH OF THE
TRADE (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE AS FOLLOWS:—

In any week	46
On any day (other than Saturday) ...	8½
On Saturday	5

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be five, and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be 8½.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours by a worker in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the trade, WHETHER THE WORKER IS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK OR ON PIECE-WORK, are as follows:—

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime subsequent to the first half-hour of Overtime, i.e., for the first two hours in excess of 9 hours, on any day except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statu-

tory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime after the first two-and-a-half hours of Overtime, i.e., all hours in excess of 11 hours, on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in excess of two hours of Overtime in any week, i.e., all hours in excess of 48 hours, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Section.

Provided—

(a) That where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) That where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate specified in paragraph (4) of this Section shall only be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required after 50 hours have been worked.

(c) That where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

NOTE.—During the first half-hour in excess of 8½ on any day except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and during the first two hours in excess of 46 hours in any week, the minimum rate applicable is the appropriate minimum rate as set out (for Male Workers) in Parts III and IV of the Trade Board's Notice H.M.S. (6), dated 28th October, 1921, or (for Female Workers) in Part II of the Trade Board's Notice H.M.S. (9), dated 12th May, 1922, except in so far as a higher rate may be payable under the provisions of paragraph (3) of this Section.

The hours which Female Workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART II.

APPLICABILITY OF OVERTIME
RATES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the Overtime Rates set out in

this Schedule apply to Male and Female Workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Cap Making Branch of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 31st March, 1920, and as set out in Part V of the Schedule to the Notice H.M.S. (9) issued by the Trade Board and dated 12th May, 1922.

The President of the Admiralty Transport Arbitration Board has authorised the issue of revised Rules to take the place of those contained in the Notification in the London Gazette dated 31st August, 1914, as set forth below:—

ADMIRALTY TRANSPORT ARBITRATION BOARD.

RULES.

1. Every claim whatsoever arising out of or in respect of the requisitioning of any ship or vessel under His Majesty's Proclamation of the 3rd day of August, 1914, or under Regulation 39 BBB (3) of the Regulations issued under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Act, 1914, or otherwise, which has not already been left with or sent to the Department of State concerned, shall be made out in full detail and left with, or sent to, the Secretary of the Board of Arbitration at Winchester House, 21, St. James's Square, London, S.W. 1, in quadruplicate, within one year from the termination of the War, or the date when the transaction giving rise to the claim took place, whichever may be later.

2. Every claim shall be accompanied by the necessary vouchers and supporting documents, and such explanatory statement as may be required to make clear the nature of the claim, and the grounds thereof.

3. The Secretary of the Board of Arbitration shall lay the claim before the President of the Board of Arbitration, who may direct the claim to be heard and disposed of by a Tribunal consisting of the President and the Vice-President or consisting of either the President or Vice-President and an Arbitrator or Arbitrators selected by the President from the Panel, and the Award of any two members of such Tribunal shall be final and conclusive, and shall not be subject to appeal or review, except upon any direction or determination of the Tribunal on any point of law submitted to it as provided in Section 2 (1) of the Indemnity Act, 1920.

4. The President may, from time to time, vary or supersede the existing Rules for regu-

lating the procedure of the Board to such extent as he may consider necessary or desirable, and may also make additional rules of procedure.

5. The President may, from time to time, authorise the members of the Panel as a body, or any of them, and whether with or without the inclusion of himself or of the Vice-President, to act as a Board for the consideration of questions of general applicability, such as the approximate monthly rate of hire for vessels of different classes and similar matters. Arbitrators nominated by the President in particular cases may have regard to, and consider, but shall not be bound by, the conclusions of any Board so constituted upon the questions submitted to such Board, and the fact that any Arbitrator appointed by the President in a particular case has been a member of any such Board, shall be no objection to his competency as an Arbitrator in such particular case.

The President may authorise any person or persons who, in his opinion, will efficiently and sufficiently represent the interests of parties concerned in any such question of general applicability submitted by any such Board to appear before the Board and represent such interests accordingly.

6. The Tribunal may make Interim Awards as regards any of the questions submitted to them.

7. It shall be competent for the Tribunal adjudicating upon any claim to receive as evidence any information, statements or testimony, which may appear to them likely to be of assistance, notwithstanding that the same may not be evidence according to law.

8. Any matter or question of procedure not disposed of by these rules or any question arising thereon shall be determined by the President of the Board of Arbitration as in his discretion he shall think fit to direct.

9. The Vice-President of the Board of Arbitration may by direction of the President act in any matter hereunder for the President, and he may also act as President should the President for any reason at any time be unable to act. Any direction or decision of the Vice-President when so acting for or as the President shall be as effectual as though made or given by the President.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested

in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.

2.—(a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

(c) No such animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in that Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further Notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such Notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such Notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the Notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any Notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the GLOUCESTER AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923.

(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the Notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any Notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Order.

8. The Cheshire (Huntington District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 5) is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

10. This Order may be cited as the CHESHIRE (HUNTINGTON DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 6).
