WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, the Treaties of Peace (Austria and Bulgaria) Act, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Act, 1921, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, and various Orders amending the aforesaid Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Orders as amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect subject to the amendments specified in Part I, Part II, Part III

and Part IV of the First Schedule to this Order.

2. The provisions of the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as amended, mentioned in the first column of Part I, Part II, Part III and Part IV of the Second Schedule to this Order, shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of the several Parts of that Schedule.

3. Where by this Order or by any other Order in Council, whether made before or after this Order, any words are directed to be added to or omitted from the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, or to be substituted for any words in any of those Orders, then copies of those Orders printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after such direction takes effect may be printed with such additions, omissions or substitutions as the direction requires, and with the articles, paragraphs and sub-paragraphs of the Orders numbered in accordance with the direction.

4. This Order may be cited as the Treaties of Peace Orders (Amendment) Order, 1923, and the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1922

and this Order, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1922 and this Order, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1922 and this Order, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1922 and this Order may respectively be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1923, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Orders, 1920 to 1923, the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Orders, 1920 to 1923, and the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Orders, 1921 to 1923.

SCHEDULE I.

PART I.

Treaty of Peace Order as Amended.

In sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph (xvi) of Article 1, after the words "in respect of the claims of British nationals" there shall be inserted the words "other than British nationals ordinarily resident in the self-governing Dominions and Egypt."

The following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (xvii) of Article 1:—

" xvii (A) The Controller shall apply the sums received by him in satisfaction of the claims, debts and compensation mentioned in paragraph (xvi) of this Article:

" Provided that where any person entitled to such claim, debt or compensation is under liability to make any payment to the Custodian or to the Clearing Office established under this Order or under the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, or to the Administrator appointed under either of the two last mentioned Orders or the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, the Controller may to the extent of such liability as aforesaid retain any sums due to that person or make payment thereof to such Custodian, Clearing Office or Administrator."

PART II.

Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order as Amended.

The following proviso shall be added at the end of paragraph (xiii) of Article 1:—

" Provided that where any person entitled to such claim, debt or compensation is under a liability to make any payments to the Custodian of Enemy Property appointed under the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Act, 1914, or to the Clearing Office established under this Order or under the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, or

to the Controller or Administrator appointed under either of the two last mentioned Orders or the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, the Administrator may to the extent of such liability as aforesaid retain any sums due to that person or make payment thereof to such Custodian, Clearing Offices, Controller or Administrator."

PART III.

The following proviso shall be added at the end of paragraph (vi) of Article 1:—

" Provided that where any person entitled to such claim, debt or compensation is under a liability to make any payments to the Custodian of Enemy Property appointed under the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Act, 1914, or to the Clearing Office established under the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, or the Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, or to the Controller or Administrator appointed under any of those Orders or this Order, the Administrator may to the extent of such liability as aforesaid retain any sums due to that person or make payment thereof to such Custodian, Clearing Offices, Controller or Administrator."

PART IV.

Treaty of Peace (Hungary) Order, 1921, as Amended.

In paragraph (xi) of Article 1, for the words "Austrian Empire" there shall be substituted the words "Kingdom of Hungary."

The following proviso shall be added at the end of paragraph (xiii) of Article 1:—

" Provided that where any person entitled to such claim, debt or compensation is under a liability to make any payments to the Custodian of Enemy Property appointed under the Trading with the Enemy (Amendment) Act, 1914, or to the Clearing Office established under this Order or the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919, or the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, or to the Controller or Administrator appointed under either of the two last mentioned Orders or the Treaty of Peace (Bulgaria) Order, 1920, the Administrator may to the extent of such liability as aforesaid retain any sums due to that person or make payment thereof to such Custodian, Clearing Offices, Controller or Administrator."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 2nd day of February, 1923 (G.H.), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such officers, clerks, and servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such officers and clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the

provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. Edward Smith and Mr. E. T. Parkinson, former Assistant Masters in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on account of age on the 30th September, 1921, and the 31st May, 1922, respectively:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. Smith of a pension at the rate of Thirty-two pounds thirteen shillings and eleven pence (£32 13s. 11d.) a year, as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of Ninety-six pounds seventeen shillings and four pence (£96 17s. 4d.); and to Mr. Parkinson of a pension at the rate of Forty pounds and ten

shillings (£40 10s.) a year, as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of One hundred and eighteen pounds and sixteen shillings (£118 16s.)”:

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section six of the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council make such provision with respect to the management of the National Debt and Government Securities and Annuities (including India Stock) as may be necessary to enable the business of the Bank of Ireland in relation thereto to be partly transacted at an office of the Bank in Northern Ireland, and to apply in respect of any securities or annuities inscribed or registered in the books and registers kept at such office the provisions applicable in respect of securities and annuities inscribed or registered in the books and registers kept at the Bank of England or the Bank of Ireland; and that any such Order may contain such supplemental, consequential, and incidental provisions as may appear necessary or proper for the purposes of the Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) The Bank of Ireland shall keep at their principal office in Belfast as well as in the office of their accountant-general at Dublin books in which may be entered the proprietors of stock, bonds and annuities (hereinafter referred to as Government stock) transferable in the books of the Bank of Ireland under the National Debt Act, 1870, as amended by any subsequent enactment, the Government Annuities Acts, 1829 to 1888, or the India Stock Transfer Act, 1862, or transferable by deed under section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1911, or section six of the Government of India (Amendment) Act, 1916; and the business of the Bank of Ireland in connection with the management of Government stock inscribed or registered in the books at their office in Belfast, including the payment of coupons, shall be transacted at that office, and anything which under the Acts regulating such management is required to be done to or by any particular officer of the Bank may in relation to such stock be done to or by such officers of the Bank at their office at Belfast as the Bank may appoint for the purpose.

(2) The provisions relating to transfers between the Bank of England and the Bank of Ireland contained in Part VI of the National Debt Act, 1870, and the regulations made under section thirty-seven of the Finance Act, 1917, and in the India Stock Transfer

Act, 1862, shall apply as respects stock inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland at their office at Belfast in like manner as it applies in respect of stock inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank at Dublin.

2.—(1) Where the registered residence of a stockholder of Government stock inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland, or, if there is more than one such stockholder, the registered residence of the principal stockholder, is at the commencement of this Order an address in Northern Ireland, the stock shall at the expiration of one month from the commencement of this Order be transferred in the manner provided by regulations under this Order from the books of the Bank of Ireland kept at the office of their accountant-general in Dublin to the books kept at their office in Belfast, unless—

(a) the stockholder or as the case may be the principal stockholder has in the meantime by reason of transfer or otherwise become a person not having a registered residence in Northern Ireland; or

(b) the stockholder, or, if there is more than one stockholder, a majority of the stockholders, before the expiration of that month make an application in the prescribed manner that the stock may not be so transferred; or

(c) the stock has been transferred in the meantime to the books kept at the Bank of England:

Provided that where any stock has been so transferred it shall be re-transferred in accordance with such regulations to the books of the Bank at Dublin if the stockholder, or, if there is more than one stockholder, the majority of the stockholders make an application for the purpose within four months from the date of the commencement of this Order.

(2) If before the expiration of the said month the stockholder, or, if there is more than one stockholder, the majority of the stockholders of any Government stock which at the commencement of this Order is inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland, make an application for the purpose in the prescribed form and in the prescribed manner, the stock shall be transferred in accordance with regulations made under this section from the books of the Bank of Ireland kept at the office of their accountant-general in Dublin to the books kept at their principal office in Belfast.

(3) It shall not be obligatory on the Bank of Ireland to effect such a transfer or re-transfer if the stock is for the time being restrained by distringas or other legal process.

3. The Treasury, or, as respects India Stock, the Secretary of State in Council of India, in conjunction with the Bank of England and the Bank of Ireland, may make regulations for the purpose of carrying this Order into effect, and such regulations shall provide for giving by advertisement or otherwise to the persons who at the commencement of this Order are inscribed or registered in the books of the Bank of Ireland as holders of Government stock notice of the effect of this Order and of their rights thereunder, and may contain such other consequential, incidental and supplemental provisions (including provisions as to stockholders under legal disability) as may appear necessary or appropriate for giving effect to this Order.

4. So much of the Act passed by the Parliament of Ireland in the thirty-ninth year of the Reign of King George III, entitled "An Act for the better regulation of stockbrokers," as imposes restrictions on the selling or buying of Government stock or Government securities on commission shall cease to have effect in Northern Ireland.

5.—(1) For the purpose of this Order—

The expression "stockholders" means the persons entered in the books of the Bank as proprietors of any Government stock, and includes persons who prove that they are entitled to be so entered, and the legal representatives of a sole or last surviving stockholder.

The expression "principal stockholder" means the stockholder to whom dividends on stock are paid, or if on directions from the stockholders dividends are paid to a person not being one of the stockholders, then the stockholder to whom the dividends would have been paid had no such directions been given.

The expression "books" includes registers.

The expression "prescribed" means prescribed by regulations under this Order.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the nineteenth day of February, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

7. This Order may be cited as the Bank of Ireland (Belfast Register) Order, 1923.

WHEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that whenever it appears to His Majesty the King in Council that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by any foreign country and are in force there, His Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being re-measured in His Majesty's Dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers, in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that the tonnage regulations of the said Act have been adopted by the Government of His Imperial Majesty the Emperor of Japan and are in force in the Japanese Dominions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Japanese Tonnage Order, 1923.

2. Ships which have their ports of registry either in the territories of Japan or in other localities under the control of Japan and which

are equipped with certificates of registry or other national papers duly issued by the competent Japanese authorities on or after the 1st October, 1914, or which, not having been re-measured in accordance with the Regulations of 1914, are equipped with certificates of registry or other national papers duly issued by the competent Japanese authorities in accordance with the Regulations of 1884, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

3. The Order of Her Majesty in Council dated the 27th day of January, 1885, made under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Amendment) Act, 1862, with regard to the tonnage of ships of Japan, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of January, 1923, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth, partly out of the Parish of Chester le Street, partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Peter, Sacriston, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth, the said Parish of Chester le Street, the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sacriston, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth, of the said Parish of Chester le Street, of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sacriston, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the original limits of the said parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth have become vested in us under the provisions and for the purposes of the herein mentioned Acts or of some or one of them and we have in respect of such hereditaments and premises agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth, of the said Parish of Chester le Street, of the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sacriston, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Kimblesworth.'

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Kimblesworth comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Witton Gilbert with Kimblesworth, the Parish of Chester le Street, the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Cuthbert, Durham, and the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Peter, Sacriston, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chester le Street from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Sacriston, at the point at the eastern end of the bridge which carries Waldrige Lane across the stream known as South Burn where the said boundary turns eastward along the middle of Waldrige

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Mr. Charles Chapman, of Huarau, New Zealand, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life.

In the early hours of March 27th, 1920, great destruction was caused by a severe flood which swept through the Paparoa Valley. An immense volume of water descended from the upper valley, where for miles the course of the torrent was marked by land slides. Houses

and huts were washed away and, unhappily, some of the occupants lost their lives.

Chapman, on receiving news of the disaster, put on a bathing costume and at once set out for the Paparoa Township, to find that the River which runs through the Township had become a raging torrent, the water reaching almost to the top rail of the bridge spanning the river. Two men (one of whom could not swim) were clinging to timber in the middle of the river, while a crowd of terror-stricken people looked on helplessly from the bank.

His first act was to rescue these men. This he did—twice swimming out to them—but only after very strenuous efforts. He then heard that a woman and her child were in danger higher up the river, and went to their assistance. He found the woman clinging to a tree and swam out to her; but to effect a rescue he had to return for a plank. A wooden form was available, and this he endeavoured to tow out to the woman and child. The rope broke, but his second effort, when a length of fencing wire had been procured, was successful, and he brought first the child then the mother to the bank.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF MALE TELEGRAPHIST IN LONDON IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 15 and 17. Candidates must be within the prescribed limits of age on the day of the Examination.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

(a) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

(b) That they are natural-born British subjects and the sons of fathers also natural-born British subjects.

3. At each examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.

5. The Examination is open only to candidates actually resident in the London district; and no candidate will be eligible for appointment unless he can satisfy the Postmaster-General that he possesses the required local residential qualification. It will be within the authority of the Postmaster-General to decline to employ a candidate successful in the Examination if he is not satisfied on enquiry that the candidate complies with this requirement.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height, and no officer will be retained in the Service who does not attain the height of 5 feet 4 inches before completing his nineteenth year.

7.—(i) Persons actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force are ineligible to compete. (ii) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service, Probationary Engineer Cadets in the Navy, and Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 10s. will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

(a) that the same shall be retained on the premises where it is at the time of service of the notice; or, if such owner or person so desires, on other suitable premises approved by the Inspector for the purpose; and

(b) that anything the subject of the retention notice shall be kept separate from animals, and as far as practicable from any feeding stuff for animals, or other material which may come in contact with animals;

(iii) by notice served on the owner or person in charge of any feeding stuff or thing with which anything landed from the said vessel has come in contact, require that the same shall be retained and kept separate in the like manner;

(iv) by notice served on the owner or person in charge of any railway truck or vehicle or vessel or lighter, into which anything landed from the s.s. "Hartington" has been loaded, require the disinfection and cleansing of the railway truck, vehicle, vessel or lighter, or any part thereof, specified in the notice in such manner as the Inspector may direct before any further goods are placed therein;

(v) by notice served on the occupier of any premises on which there is or has been anything landed from the s.s. "Hartington," or any feeding stuff or thing with which anything so landed has come in contact, require him to disinfect and cleanse the premises or any part thereof specified in the notice, in such manner as the Inspector may direct.

2. A notice served under this Order shall remain in force until the notice has been withdrawn by a further notice signed by an Inspector of the Ministry.

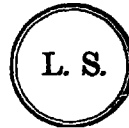
