TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

ROPE, TWINE AND NET TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

The Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain) have issued a Notice varying, by way of reduction, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for male and female workers, the General Minimum Piece-Rates for male hand hacklers, and the Overtime Rates for male and female workers based on such rates. In the case of the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, the reduction is one of 2d. per hour for male workers of 21 years of age and over, 1d. per hour for female workers of 18 years of age and over employed in the net section of the trade, and $\frac{3}{4}d$. per hour for other female workers of 18 years of age and over, and corresponding reductions are made in the case of younger workers.
