TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 9th March, 1923, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £40,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th March, 1923, to Saturday, the 17th March, 1923, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000, and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will, as indicated in the Notice of 6th October, 1922, rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st of April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th March, 1923, to Saturday, the 17th March, 1923, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th April, 1923, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

APPOINTMENT OF STANDING FOR HACKNEY CARRIAGES WITHIN THE METROPOLITAN POLICE DISTRICT, AND REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED.

By virtue of the Act 13 and 14 Victoria, Chapter 7, intituled "An Act for Consolidating the Office of the Registrar of Metropolitan Public Carriages with the Office of Commissioners of Police of the Metropolis, and making other Provisions in regard to the Consolidated Offices."

I, WILLIAM THOMAS FRANCIS HORWOOD, Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, do hereby appoint a Standing for ten Hackney Carriages at Grosvenor Road, S.W. 1, and do make the following Regulations with regard to the boundaries for the same, viz. :—

On south side of roadway, commencing at a point opposite the front door of No. 98, Grosvenor Road, extending westward, by enclosure, as far as necessary for ten carriages.

Front of vehicles towards the East.

Provided that no Hackney Carriage shall be suffered to stand across any street or thoroughfare, or opposite the end of any street or carriageway, or upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriageway.

LEEDS INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL FOR
BOYS, MOORTOWN, LEEDS.
New Certificate.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice, that the Managers of the Leeds Industrial School for Boys, Moortown, Leeds, having applied for the School to be certified as fit for the accommodation of one hundred and fifty boys, he has issued a new certificate under the Children Act, 1908, in respect of the School.

The Certificate, which bears date the 27th February, 1923, provides that the number of boys in the School at any one time, whether sent thereto in pursuance of the Children Act, 1908, or of any other Act, shall not exceed one hundred and fifty.

The Home Secretary gives notice that, in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women and young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Chocolate and Confectionery Departments at the works of Planters Products, Ltd., Delectaland, Watford, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable cloakroom and messroom accommodation, first aid requisites, and facilities for sitting shall be provided; that the Secretary of State may at any time require the occupier to make such special arrangements for the conveyance of workers living at a distance, or otherwise for the welfare of such workers as may be necessary to prevent hardship; and that arrangements shall be made for the effective and regular supervision of the workers by a responsible forewoman or welfare supervisor.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour, and which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts, and takes the place of all Notices other than the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (23).

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:

1. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates specified in Part I. of this Schedule and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 1st March, 1923.*
2. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-work Basis Time Rates specified in Part II of this Schedule, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 24th July, 1922.
3. The General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Section I of Part IV of this Schedule and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 10th October, 1921.
4. In all other cases as from 29th May, 1922.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in any case not later than 7th March, 1923.

- (c) MALE APPRENTICES whose indentures (a) were made prior to the 10th October, 1921, and (b) provide for the apprentice being supplied by the employer with board or with board and lodging.

SECTION II.—In cases where a worker is employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and efficiency of the class in question

- (a) Where a piece-work basis time-rate is effective, an amount not less than the piece-work basis time-rate appropriate to the class
- (b) Where no piece-work basis time-rate is effective, an amount not less than the general minimum time-rate appropriate to the class.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

MALE WORKERS OTHER THAN CERTAIN CLASSES OF APPRENTICES AND LEARNERS.

SECTION I.—(A) MALE WORKERS OF GRADE I are workers—

Who have completed five years' employment as an Apprentice and/or Learner and/or Improver and less than one year's subsequent employment in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade.

(B) MALE WORKERS OF GRADE II are workers—

Who have completed five years' employment as an Apprentice and/or Learner and/or Improver and not less than one and less than three years' subsequent employment in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade.

(C) MALE WORKERS OF GRADE III are workers—

Who have completed five years' employ-

ment as an Apprentice and/or Learner and/or Improver and not less than three years' subsequent employment in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of Section I of this Part of this Schedule:—

(1) The expressions "Apprentice" and "Learner" include all persons who have been employed as Apprentices and/or Learners in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, whether or not employed as Apprentices or Learners as defined by the Trade Board.

(2) In the case of Male Apprentices, Learners or Improvers who have served under a contract in writing entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade for a period exceeding five years but not exceeding seven years, the period specified in the contract shall be substituted for the period of five years' employment referred to in Section I of this Part.

SECTION III.—For the purpose of determining the length of any employment specified in Section I of this Part:—

(i) The instruction specified in Section III (c) of Part III and Section II of Part IV shall be counted in the manner provided therein.

(ii) Any previous experience as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring shall be reckoned as equivalent to one-and-a-half times the period served under such scheme.

PART II.
FEMALE WORKERS OTHER THAN CERTAIN CLASSES OF APPRENTICES AND LEARNERS.

SECTION I.—FEMALE WORKERS of GRADE I are workers—

Who have completed not less than five years' total employment, including not less than three years as an Apprentice and/or Learner on operations in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade as set out in Section III of Part VI of this Schedule, other than operations specified in paragraph (4) thereof.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of Section I of this Part the expressions "Apprentice" and "Learner" include all persons who have been employed as Apprentices and/or Learners in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, whether or not employed as Apprentices or Learners, as defined by the Trade Board.

SECTION III.—In determining the length of a Female Worker's employment, including length of employment as an Apprentice or Learner, previous experience on *actual sewing and/or machining operations in the making up of garments* coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) and/or the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain) may be counted.

PART III.

MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice, and subject to the provisions of Section III of this Part of this Schedule:—

A MALE or FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:—

(A) Is not an Apprentice as defined in Part IV of this Schedule;

(B)—(i) In the case of a MALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FIVE YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, and has not served as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-Service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(ii) In the case of a FEMALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FOUR YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade;

AND

(C) In the case of both a MALE and FEMALE LEARNER:—

(i) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(ii) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided also that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment in

any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade without a certificate or registration for a probationary period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of the employment as a Learner being continued, the probation period shall be included in the period of Learnership.

SECTION II.—Notwithstanding anything herein contained, a worker shall not be deemed to be a Learner if he or she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—For the purpose of determining the completion of the period of learnership specified in this Part and/or for the purpose of determining the rate applicable to a Learner:—

(a) All employment of the Learner prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(b) Any Male or Female Learner who has been previously employed in (i) any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, (ii) any branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), or (iii) any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade coming within the scope of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), shall be entitled, subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, to count the whole period of such previous employment.

(c) A Male Learner who prior to being registered as a Learner under the provisions of this Schedule has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any Institution or School in any Technical Class approved by the Trade Board may count half the period of such instruction received after the age of 14.

PART IV.

MALE AND FEMALE APPRENTICES.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates of Wages effective for Male and Female Apprentices—

A Male or Female Apprentice is a worker who

(i)—(a) Is employed during the whole of his or her time under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the form set out in Section III of this Part of this Schedule, or in a form which is in general conformity therewith, which provides for the Apprentice being taught to make throughout the following garment or garments for the appropriate period specified below:—

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified for Apprentices without registration for a probationary period not exceeding three months, but in the event of the employment as an Apprentice being continued, the probationary period shall be included in the period of apprenticeship.

WITNESSETH as follows that is to say:—

1. The Apprentice of his/her own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself/herself to serve the Employers as their Apprentice in their trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring for the term of _____ years from the

2. In consideration of the covenants entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice the Employers hereby covenant with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That they will keep the Apprentice as their Apprentice during the said term and to the best of their power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him/her to be instructed by a fully-qualified tailor or tailoress in the making throughout of the following garment/garments, namely, _____ and in everything relative to the work of

making and completing the said garment/garments.

(b) That they will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages at not less than the appropriate Minimum Rates of Wages fixed or as varied from time to time by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) for Male/Female Apprentices and made effective.

(c) That during the first three years of apprenticeship they will not require the Apprentice to work in excess of the number of hours declared by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

(d) That during the said term of apprenticeship they will not put the Apprentice on piecework.

(e) That if the Employers [or the survivor of them shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury to be certified by a duly qualified medical practitioner or] shall cease to carry on the said trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship the Employers [or the survivors of them or their/his Executors or Administrators as the case may be] shall if requested so to do by the Guardian and the Apprentice find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

Provided that in the case of the retirement or death of a partner in a firm the surviving partner or partners shall be deemed to be the employer or employers of the Apprentice for the purpose of this Indenture.

(f) That they will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which the Apprentice may spoil, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(g) That they will afford facilities for the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such Technical Classes as may be agreed by the parties hereto for the instruction of the Apprentice in the art craft or trade of Retail Bespoke Tailoring and that if such classes occur during the ordinary working hours the hours so spent shall be reckoned as hours of employment under this Indenture.

(h) That they will not cause the Apprentice to suffer any loss of wages by reason of his/her attendance at any Technical Classes as aforesaid.

(j) That they will provide the Apprentice with good and sufficient full board and lodging.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such Technical Classes as may be agreed as provided in paragraph 2 (g) of these presents provided that he/she suffers no loss of wages by so doing.

(e) That save as otherwise provided in this Indenture, if the Apprentice shall at any time be absent from his/her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers, the Apprentice shall not be deemed to be employed during the period of such absence and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period.

(f) That the Guardian will during the term of apprenticeship provide the Apprentice with suitable clothes and all other necessaries (except board and lodging).

(g) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders or commands of the Employers, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself/herself towards the Employers or their other employees then it shall be lawful for the Employers on notice in writing addressed to the Guardian of their intention so to do to discharge the Apprentice from their service.

4. Notwithstanding any provisions hereinbefore contained the Employers shall not be bound to employ or instruct the Apprentice and the Apprentice on his part shall not be bound to serve the Employers upon such days as the Employers are unable to provide the Apprentice with work owing to causes beyond their control:

Provided that:—

(a) Upon such days the Apprentice shall be deemed not to be employed under this Indenture or within the meaning of the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, or any statutory modification or amendment thereof.

(b) In the event, however, of the Employers failing to provide the Apprentice with work for a continuous period of six weeks from any cause, whether beyond the control of the Employers or not, the Guardian and the Apprentice shall have the option by seven days' notice in writing to the Employers to determine this Indenture.

5. In the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability on the part of the Apprentice or of failure on the part of the Employers to instruct the Apprentice as provided for in this Indenture which cannot be settled between the parties hereto, the Employers, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively hereby severally and mutually covenant that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), and any recommendations made by the Trade Board shall be considered by the parties hereto with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

PART V.
PROVISIONS AS TO OVERTIME RATES.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY WEEKDAY (other than Saturday)	9
ON SATURDAY	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male or Female Worker, in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be calculated as follows:—

(A) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

(1) For the FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Sub-Section.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to

require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate specified in paragraph (4) shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

(5) The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(B) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

(a) All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-work in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed and made effective, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

(b) All Male and Female Workers (other than Male and Female Indentured Apprentices as defined in Section I (I) of Part IV of this Schedule) in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has not been fixed, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

SECTION III.—In the application of the Overtime Rates set out in this Part of this Schedule the following provisions apply:—

(a) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions the word "Sunday" were substituted for "Saturday" and the word "Saturday" for "Sunday."

(b) Any other day (subject to the proviso specified in this Sub-section) may, notwithstanding anything contained in this Sche-

dule, be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in any case in which such substitution is made, the provisions of this Part of this Schedule shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions such short day were substituted for "Saturday" and "Saturday" for such short day.

Provided that the short day substituted for Saturday shall not be a Sunday, except in the case of workers coming within Sub-section (a) of this Section.

PART VI.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages effective in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain of the CLASSES SPECIFIED IN THIS NOTICE (other than those specified in Section II of this Part) in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out below.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages effective shall *not apply* to:—

(1) PACKERS, where employed on Packing operations which are NOT performed in a workroom.

(2) FEMALE APPRENTICES who have entered the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade under 21 years of age, and who are employed under a contract in writing, entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction for a period of not less than three years by a fully qualified tailor or tailoress in making a bespoke garment throughout.

(3) MALE APPRENTICES whose indentures (a) were made prior to the 10th October, 1921, and (b) provide for the Apprentice being supplied by the employer with board or with board and lodging.

SECTION III.—The "Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade" wherever mentioned in this Notice means the Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations, that is to say:—

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached.

Including:—

(1)—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a

tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunction with, the repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

But excluding:—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments.

(2) The making of headgear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, and the Education Act, 1921.

GLOUCESTER AND DISTRICT (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1923 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Prohibited Area.

2.—(a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(b) The movement of any such animal along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

(c) No such animal shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in that Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding

the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further Notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such Notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such Notices when served shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the Notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such Notices when served are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any Notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation of Previous Orders.

8. The Gloucester and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1923 (Nos. 2 and 3) are hereby revoked, but any notice served under those Orders shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.
