The following Addresses were presented to His Majesty, at Buckingham Palace, on Monday, the 5th instant:—

CONVOCAION OF CANTERBURY.

We, Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

The recurrent opportunity afforded to us by the presentation of an Address to Your Majesty at the opening of a new Convocation can never be a merely formal event. We are able thereby to remind ourselves and others of the share which the Christian Church claims in the common life of the nation, and of the witness which it desires to bear to the lofty spiritual standards by which all human actions ought to be governed.

Only eighteen months have elapsed since the last occasion when we approached Your Majesty, and the anxiety which Your Majesty expressed in the reply then given to our Address has not yet, we fear, been materially relieved. Your Majesty gave expression to the hope that, as the outcome of the deliberations then proceeding, the Irish people might

be united in making a new and happy era for their native land. The realisation of this hope yet tarries. We still have grave perplexities to face. Nor are our home problems Irish alone. While the revival of trade must needs, we are told, be slow, the shadow of unemployment is darkening thousands of English homes. We recognise too—and it is with profound sadness—that on the Continent of Europe and in the Near East there are vast areas wherein the nations are at variance, and there is even overt strife, but we recall with interest and with high hope Your Majesty's stimulating words that "It is with enduring patience and unabating faith that we must hold to our determination to create a happier earth." It lies outside our range or purview to intervene in controversies mainly financial, or, in the narrow sense, political. But the roots of the still-persisting strifes seem to lie deeper, and Christian men of every nation, as those to whom the Gospel of the Prince of Peace is committed, are bound to set themselves, if it may be, to prevent the growth or maintenance of the spirit of hatred and ill-will, the spirit of hard selfishness and pride, when these show themselves in the relation of nations to one another. We desire whole-heartedly to support the ideals of the League of Nations, and we pray that God may bless and strengthen its work for international co-operation and for

the progress among men of whatsoever things are pure and lovely and of good report. But we are persuaded that behind the League, and directing every such instrument of human well-being, must be the Spirit of Christ working in men's hearts, over-ruling their passions and prejudices, persuading and drawing them to peace.

We desire to find the Church of Christ speaking, if it may be, with one voice in different lands, to remind the nations of their brotherhood, and to bid them keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. But the bond of peace, if it is to be firm and beneficent, must mean more than the mere absence of open strife. It must rest and rely upon principles of righteousness and justice. Those principles we try to foster. For those gifts we pray.

And beyond all question it is the duty of the Christian Church to lift up its voice in urgent appeal for the relief of the hundreds of thousands of unhappy sufferers, especially in the Near East, who have been driven from their homes to find shelter where they can. Their needs—the needs chiefly of women, little children, and old men—are unspeakably great. Their cry is tragic: "Come over into Macedonia and help us." It is our duty, as Ministers of Christ, to call attention to these things.

But happily there are other matters before us at this time upon which we can look with gladness and hope. It is our privilege, as representatives of the National Church, to offer to Your Majesty our dutiful congratulations upon the happy birth of the first Grandson of Your Majesty and of Her Majesty the Queen, and to express at the same time the pleasure with which the whole Nation has learned of the approaching marriage of His Royal Highness the Duke of York. In connection with both of these auspicious events we earnestly pray that the Divine blessing may be vouchsafed to each and every member of Your Majesty's family and home.

In regard to the organic life of the Church of England, we are well assured that Your Majesty shares the satisfaction with which we record the success which has attended the deliberations of the National Church Assembly during the last year. No less than seven Measures passed by the Assembly during the early period of its life have already been accepted by Parliament, and have now received Your Majesty's assent. It is our confident hope that we may be able, in the near future, to submit for the like gracious assent further Measures now under careful discussion for promoting improvements in the system of the Patronage and Tenure of Benefices, the Care of Parsonage Houses, and the Union of small Parishes in our country districts. A weighty Commission on the Administration of the Property and Finance of the Church is now at work upon many pressing questions, and will, we hope, find itself able to recommend wise reforms. Many of these questions bear closely upon the poverty which is now oppressing many hundreds of parish clergy throughout England, and hampering their efforts for the common good. Relief is imperatively and even urgently required in that important matter. In other ways of yet higher importance the Convocation which we represent is earnestly seeking new methods of deepening and extending the ministry of the Church, both clerical and lay.

Meanwhile we are engaged to the utmost of our power in the endeavour to promote united efforts among the followers of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, to set forward more worthily, both at home and in the Mission Field, the purpose of His Gospel, and the up-building thereby of His Divine Society among men.

We would conclude, as always, with the humble prayer that the blessing of Almighty God our Heavenly Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, may rest upon Your Majesty and upon every member of the Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious answer:—

It gives me sincere pleasure to receive this loyal and dutiful Address from Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of Canterbury in Convocation assembled.

I share your anxiety at the difficulties and distresses that still remain both on the Continent of Europe and in Ireland, and I am specially grieved to observe the suffering of those of my people who are without employment. I join with you in your prayers to Almighty God for His blessing on all works that make for peace.

You have said truly that it is the duty of the Church to draw attention to the terrible sufferings and urgent needs of the refugees in the Near East, and I trust that Christian men will generously respond to your appeal on their behalf.

I note with satisfaction the evidence of the activities of the National Church Assembly, and am gratified to learn that further measures affecting the organic life of the Church of England are receiving your careful consideration. The work performed by the Parish Clergy, so important for the moral and spiritual well-being of the Nation, is at present hampered by the material difficulties under which so many of them labour, and I trust that the investigations of the Commission, referred to in your Address, may lead to the wisest and most efficient use of the resources of the Church for the improvement of the conditions of these devoted men.

The Queen joins with me in thanking you heartily for your congratulations on the birth of a son to our dear daughter and on the forthcoming marriage of our beloved second son. We are grateful for your prayers on behalf of Myself and My House.

I earnestly pray that the blessing of Almighty God may rest on you in all your labours and deliberations.

CONVOCAION OF YORK.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.
THE HUMBLE ADDRESS OF THE CONVOCAION OF
THE PROVINCE OF YORK.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY.

We Your Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Archbishop, Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled, approach Your Majesty with the dutiful assurance of our devotion to Your Majesty's Throne and Person.

We desire in the first place to express to Your Majesty the pleasure with which we in common with all Your Majesty's loyal subjects have learned the approaching Marriage of His Royal Highness the Duke of York, and

to offer to Your Majesty our respectful congratulations upon the happy birth of the first Grandson of Your Majesty and Her Majesty the Queen. While referring to matters so directly concerned with Your Majesty's family and home, we take leave to assure Your Majesty of our deep sense of the value of the Public Service rendered by His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales in his prolonged visit to the more distant parts of the Empire, and to express the great satisfaction with which we hailed his safe return to this country.

Living and working as we do in the populous industrial districts of Northern England, we must needs perceive and appreciate with special knowledge the grave and far-reaching evils of the prolonged economic disturbance caused by the Great War, and continued by the unhappy discords which still distract great populations in Europe and Asia. Unemployment and the shortage of habitable houses are lowering the character, wasting the capacity, and darkening the lives of many thousands of Your Majesty's subjects. We are well assured that Your Majesty shares to the full the deep anxiety with which we regard these disquieting features of our social life.

We regret that the persistent efforts of Your Majesty's Government have hitherto failed to establish the peace of Europe on a firm foundation of equity and good will. We have followed with anxious interest the course of events in the Near East, where ancient Christian Churches have been subjected to the most barbarous persecution, and numerous Christian populations destroyed by massacre and privation.

Amid so many discouraging elements in the political and economic situation we have observed with hope and thankfulness the patience and dignity with which our own people have faced and endured their trials, and we cannot but believe that by the blessing of Almighty God the vigilance of Your Majesty's Government and the public spirit of all classes will be rewarded by the restoration of prosperity.

We also recognise an element of soundness and promise in the League of Nations. We believe that it embodies the only right principle of international relations, and enshrines the only reasonable hope of lasting international peace. We observe with deep satisfaction that Your Majesty's Government continues to give the League of Nations a loyal and steady support.

We thank Your Majesty for many proofs of sympathy with our difficulties, and for much encouragement in our efforts. We assure Your Majesty that we shall exert ourselves in humble dependence on Almighty God to serve the Nation faithfully in those supreme concerns of Faith and Righteousness, which are not only the true foundations of national well-being, but also the governing interests of the Christian Church.

We pray always that the blessing of Almighty God may rest abundantly upon Your Majesty's Person, Home and Realm.

I am grateful for the loyal and dutiful Address from Your Grace and the Bishops and Clergy of the Province of York in Convocation assembled. I thank you for your prayers that the Divine blessing may be

bestowed on myself, my Family and my Realm.

The Queen and I have received with sincere pleasure your congratulations on the birth of our grandson and on the betrothal of our dear son, the Duke of York. We appreciate deeply your sympathetic reference to the visits which our beloved eldest son has paid to many parts of the Empire and your testimony to the value of the public services thereby rendered.

I recognise with sorrow that whereas in the War many of my People endured severe hardships, they still suffer from the consequences of great industrial depression. I admire the patience displayed by them to-day as greatly as their courage during those years of supreme trial and self-sacrifice. The relief of the unemployed is engaging the unremitting attention of my Government, whose efforts I earnestly trust may lead to the establishment of more satisfactory conditions.

I need hardly assure you that those darker aspects of the international situation, referred to in your Address, are seriously occupying the attention of my Ministers, and I pray that God will assist their deliberations and grant to the peoples of the world the inspiration of brotherhood and good will. I am confident that the League of Nations is performing valuable service in fostering this spirit.

I have been grieved to observe the privations endured by the Christian Communities in the Near East, and I hope the Church may be able in some measure to alleviate their sufferings.

I pray that the blessing of God may rest on you and guide you always.

IMPERIAL SERVICE MEDAL.

The notice regarding James Ainsworth, Walter Robert Crawley, Arthur Harrison, John Nash, William Strachan and Edwin Bird Tippetts in Gazette No. 32790 of the 26th January, 1923, is hereby cancelled, it having been subsequently ascertained that these persons died before the date of the awards therein notified.

The Home Secretary gives notice that, in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the employment on two day-shifts of women and young persons of 16 years of age and over in brick-making at the Carfin Brickwork of the County Council of Lanark (District of the Middle Ward), subject to compliance with the Welfare Order dated 9th October, 1917 (Supply of Drinking Water), and to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable protective clothing and cloakroom and messroom accommodation shall be provided, and that a woman or young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to such woman or young person.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH MARCH 1923.)

DERBYSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Area Affected.

1.—(1) This Order applies to the Area described in the Schedule hereto. In this Order the Area is referred to as the Prohibited Area.

(2) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Prohibited Area.

Prohibition of Movement of Animals into, out of or within Prohibited Area.

2. (a) The movement of cattle, sheep, goats or swine into or out of the Prohibited Area is prohibited, except as provided in the next following Article; provided that this Order shall not prevent the movement of animals through such Area direct by railway without avoidable delay if the animals are not untrucked within such Area.

(b) The movement of any such animal along

or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Area is prohibited.

(c) No such animals shall be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a road or other highway within the Prohibited Area.

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Area for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Area to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in that Area, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement.

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Prohibited Area, and be moved by railway without being untrucked within the Prohibited Area until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

(iii) On completion of the movement the licence shall be delivered up to the nearest police station without delay by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

4.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Area by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of any cattle, sheep, goats or swine in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority.

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

5.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Area on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises.

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

6. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

7. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder is an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the DERBYSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923.

**GLOUCESTER AND DISTRICT (FOOT-
AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF
1923 (No. 5).**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue of and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Meaning of Terms.

1. In this Order—

“The Prohibited Areas” means the Areas in which the movement of animals is hereby prohibited;

“The Controlled Area” means the Area in which the movement of animals is hereby controlled;

The Prohibited Areas and the Controlled Area are described in the Schedule hereto. If any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside a Prohibited Area the whole shall be deemed to be within that Area. Subject to this provision, if any farm (excluding any detached part) is partly within and partly outside the Controlled Area the whole shall be deemed to be within the Controlled Area;

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and pigs;

“Slaughterhouse” means premises used habitually and solely for the purpose of slaughtering animals, but does not include a slaughterhouse which forms part of a farm.

Restrictions in Force in the Prohibited Areas.

2.—(a) No animals shall be moved into or out of the Prohibited Areas, except as provided in the next following Article;

(b) No animals shall be moved along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Prohibited Areas, or be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any such road or highway;

(c) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Prohibited Areas;

(d) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Prohibited Areas or be brought into contact with animals in the Prohibited Areas.

Provision for Movement of Animals into Prohibited Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Animals may be moved from premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to which this Order applies to a slaughterhouse in any borough or urban district in the Prohibited Areas, subject to the following conditions:—

(i) A licence authorising the movement must be obtained from the Local Authority of the destination before the movement commences. This licence must accompany the animals throughout the whole movement;

(ii) The animals must be put on rail at a station outside the Controlled Area, and be moved by railway, without being untrucked

within the Prohibited Areas until arrival at the railway station nearest to the place of destination.

Restrictions in Force in the Controlled Area.

4.—(a) No animal shall be moved out of the Controlled Area;

(b) No animals shall be moved without a licence under Articles 3 or 5 of this Order:—

(i) into the Controlled Area; or

(ii) along or across any road or other highway or by water within the Controlled Area;

(c) No animal shall be permitted by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon any road or other highway in the Controlled Area;

(d) No market, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Controlled Area except a market or sale for fat animals intended for immediate slaughter. A licence must be obtained from the Local Authority to hold any such market or sale, and a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority shall attend and examine the animals exposed thereat;

(e) No slaughterhouse manure or refuse shall be moved out of the Controlled Area or be brought into contact with animals in such Area.

Movement of Animals by Licence Into or Within the Controlled Area.

5. Licences may be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the following movements of animals only:—

(a) From premises outside the Prohibited Areas and Controlled Area to a slaughterhouse in the Controlled Area;

(b) From a farm in the Controlled Area to a licensed fat stock market or sale in such Area;

(c) From a licensed fat stock market or sale in the Controlled Area, or from a farm or other premises in the Controlled Area, to a slaughterhouse in such Area;

(d) From one farm to another in the Controlled Area, or between different parts of the same farm in such Area, if the Inspector considers the movement to be necessary or expedient. (These licences may be made available for movement as often as required if the Inspector endorses the licence “Occupation Licence.”)

Conditions of Licences.

6.—(a) Licences may be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority in whose District the movement commences, except in the case of movement from premises outside the Prohibited and Controlled Areas to a slaughterhouse, in which case the licence shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate;

(b) Licences shall not permit movement on any road in the Prohibited Areas, or movement out of the Controlled Area, in order to reach a destination in the latter Area;

(c) Occupation Licences may be withdrawn at any time by a notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority on the person to whom such licence was granted;

(d) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, must be delivered up at or sent by post to the nearest Police Station; or to an

officer of the Local Authority, immediately after completion of the movement;

(e) Licences, other than Occupation Licences, shall only be available for four days, including the day of issue, and shall accompany the animals throughout the movement;

(f) Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall be moved as far as practicable by the nearest available route and without avoidable delay to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be kept separate as far as practicable from all other animals;

(g) Copies of licences authorising movement into the District of another Local Authority shall be sent by the Inspector issuing such licences to such other Local Authority;

(h) Licences shall be produced by the person in charge of the animals moved therewith on demand to an Inspector or to a Constable, and such person shall, if required by such officer, give his name and address.

Movement through Prohibited Areas or Controlled Area by Railway Permitted.

7. This Order shall not prevent the movement of animals direct by railway through the Prohibited Areas, or through the Controlled Area, or both, if the animals are not untrucked within such Areas.

Animals for Slaughter to be Marked.

8.—(a) Animals moved to a slaughterhouse in accordance with a licence under this Order shall be detained at such slaughterhouse until they are slaughtered;

(b) Before movement commences all such animals shall be marked as follows:—

Cattle.—A broad arrow six inches long clipped on the left hindquarter and the hair clipped off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—A broad arrow clipped on the forehead and a letter M six inches long painted or stamped with red or blue adhesive composition on both sides of each sheep.

Pigs.—Letter M painted or stamped on both sides of the pig with red or blue adhesive composition.

Closing of Footpaths and Premises.

9.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may (notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way) prohibit the entry of any person into any field, shed or other place in the Prohibited Areas by giving notice in writing to that effect to the occupier. In such cases the owner of the animals in such places, or his agents or servants, may enter for the sole purpose of feeding or tending the animals, but no other person shall enter any such place until such notice has been withdrawn by a further notice from an Inspector, unless he has obtained a licence to do so from an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority;

(2) Copies of such notices shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he may think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed;

(3) Copies of such notices, when served, shall be sent to the Ministry.

Control of Dogs and Poultry.

10.—(1) An Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority may, by a written notice served upon the occupier of any premises in the Prohibited Areas on which dogs or poultry are kept, require such occupier to keep such dogs or poultry under such control

as may be prescribed in the notice, or to confine them to any specified part of the premises;

(2) Copies of such notices, when served, are to be sent to the Ministry.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

11. This Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

12. Any contravention of this Order or of any notice served thereunder shall be deemed to be an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, and renders the offender liable to prosecution.

Revocation of Previous Order.

13. The Gloucester and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1923 (No. 4) is hereby revoked, but any notice served under that Order shall continue in force unless and until such notice has been withdrawn.

Commencement.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-three.

Short Title.

15. This Order may be cited as the GLOUCESTER AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1923 (No. 5).

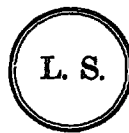
